Borno:

- ❖ 3,782 beneficiaries received food, soap and kitchen sets through e-vouchers
- ❖ US\$44,511.14 was injected into the local economy
- ❖ 3,344 children in Muna Dalti and Simari
- ❖ There were 7 SAMs and 20 MAMs reported within this period in Simari only
- ❖ Follow-Ups of these SAM and MAM cases are still-on going
- ❖ A total of 3,344 caretakers received hygiene and IYCF key messages
- ❖ Completed registration of 3,500 households in Benisheik
- ❖ Continue registration of beneficiaries in Muna and Simari
- ❖ Carried a needs assessment in Damasak
- ❖ Shared registration data with IMC
- ❖ 4000 beneficiaries registered for Feed the future
- ❖ Recruited 40 Field Agents

Adamawa

- ❖ Trained 6 Health Workers on IYCF
- ❖ Recruited 20 Field Agents
- ❖ 4000 beneficiaries registered for Feed the Future
