The first project funded by Food for Peace-FFP is an eight months project and is implemented in Konduga while the second is also eight months project implemented in MMC

**Issues/Challenges/Problems**

Key issues, challenges and problems encountered during the reporting period

Security is a constant issue especially along the Maiduguri-Konduga road, programme team travel along the road require constant analysis before travel. Also, due to recent events along the road time spent on the field has been reduced which sometimes might elongate time to complete activities.

## Plans and way forward

Planned activities and wayward for the next two weeks:

### **FFP CTP Project**

The FFP funded project is in Konduga LGA in Malari, Mairamri and Konduga Wards of Konduga LGA. Currently 27000 individuals/5330 households have been targeted and the first cash disbursement has started. In the next reporting period, first cash transfer cycle will be reported. Also market/price monitoring was conducted and it will also be reported also in the reporting.

### **LDS CTP Project**

The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (LDS) funded project is in MMC LGA in Bolori ward. The project is implemented in Bolori Kasuwa, Buzu Quarters and Shuwari 3. About 373 households will benefit from 3 months cash transfer and first cash transfer cycle will commence in a April 2017.
