 Areas that are presently in Phase 3 especially in Borno state are as a result of the efforts of the Humanitarian community, otherwise the whole state would probably have deteriorated to Phase 4 due to the inablity of farmers to carry out farming activities, which is the livelihood of over 60% of the population. At least 20% of the population of an LGA must be in a particular phase (counting from the right that is Phase 5 downwards) before that LGA can be fixed in that Phase. There are no LGAs in Phase 5, but about 44,000 individuals spread across Borno, Adamawa and Yobe states are in this Phase There is a need for partners to increase their targeting of beneficiaries in LGAs that have been projected to deteriorate during the Lean season especially LGAs in Phase 3 and Phase 4 in Borno state, the hub of the
