Aim: to look at the latest food assistance (FA) overview, note partners' needs and suggestions. Moreover, to present draft recommendation for emergency support through general in-kind distribution and discuss sectorial deduplication of the food assistance.

Latest FA Overview: according to the preliminary data, in December, 26 Cluster's partners have supported over 2.1 million people with the food assistance. Distribution was focused across east (Kharkivska, Donetska, Zaporizka, Khersonska, and Dnipropetrovska) and south (Khersonska) of the country. Over 1.7 million people received food assistance through General Food Distribution (GFD) boxes, 384,764 rapid response ration, and 418,319 hot meals.

In the comprehensive review of food assistance activities throughout 2023, a noteworthy fact was made: not a single month witnessed an overreach of the established target of 3.7 million. This indicates that the provisioning of food assistance consistently remained within the targeted limits, reflecting effective planning and execution.

Recommendation for emergency support through general in-kind distribution.

FSLC has distributed its draft document outlining recommendations for emergency support through general in-kind distribution to our partners. This comprehensive document encompasses various crucial topics, including needs assessment, targeting approaches, sub-modality selection, planning figures by energy, monitoring and evaluation methodologies, cross-cutting issues, and exit strategy considerations.



FSLC encourages our partners to provide their valuable inputs and share their experiences to enhance and strengthen the document.

Sectorial deduplication of the food assistance

FSLC put forth a recommendation to set a minimum standard of 1,250 kilocalories (equivalent to 60% of the daily per capita energy requirement of 2,100 kcal) for the General Food Distribution (GFD) basket, specifically focusing on the upcoming food assistance deduplication. Present partners found this proposal to be logical, and no immediate objections were raised during the discussion.
