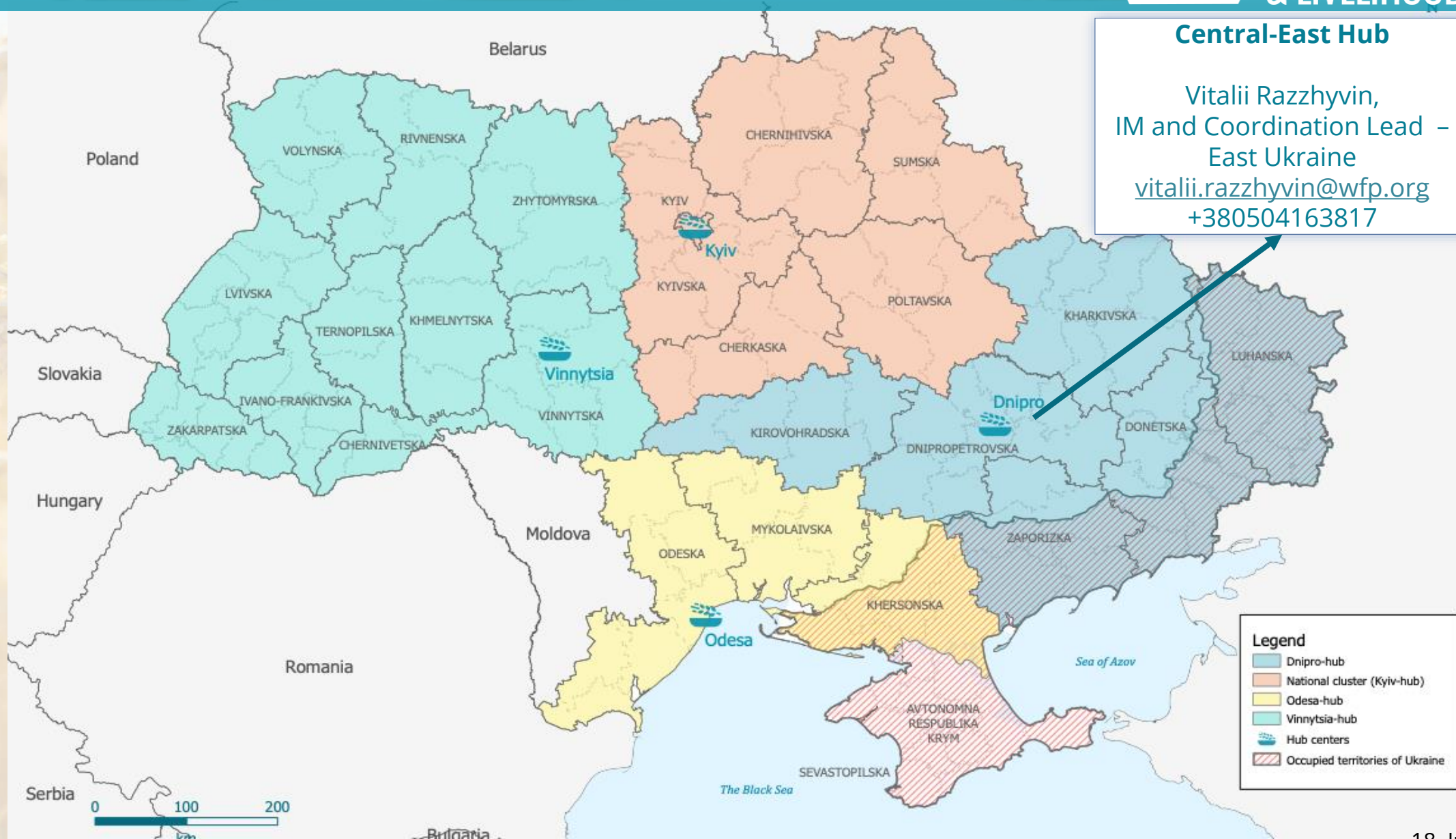

May 2023 CO1 - Food Assistance

In May 2023, the Food Security and Livelihoods Cluster (FSLC) partners organization reached a total of 2,527,295 people which is 69% out of the 3,668,237 people targeted in the 2023 Humanitarian Response Plan (HRP). The need for food assistance continues to decrease among the affected population. In May, it decreased by 7% compared to April. 88% of all food assistance was provided in Kharkivska, Donetsk, Khersonska, Zaporizka, Mykolaivska, Dnipropetrovska oblasts. From those who received food assistance in May: 65% received general food distributions (dry rations containing 2,100 kcal per person per day); 30% received rapid response rations; 3% received hot meals; and 2% received market-based relief food vouchers. 29 reporting partners contributed to the response objective: WFP, SPIR, GEM, U-Saved, AOS, CaritasUA, AAH, URCS, PHK, WVI, LH, ERC, GCS, ACTED, PIN SK, PIN, NRC, SI, BiY, NICCO, HIA, NW, WHH, R2P, Poruch, IAC ISHR, ForestCom, FZ, and TBPUA.

The Food Security and Livelihoods Cluster (FSLC) was established in December 2014 and is led by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) and the World Food Programme (WFP). The FSLC coordinates the food security and livelihoods response for more than 500 partners since Russia's full-scale invasion on 24 February 2022.

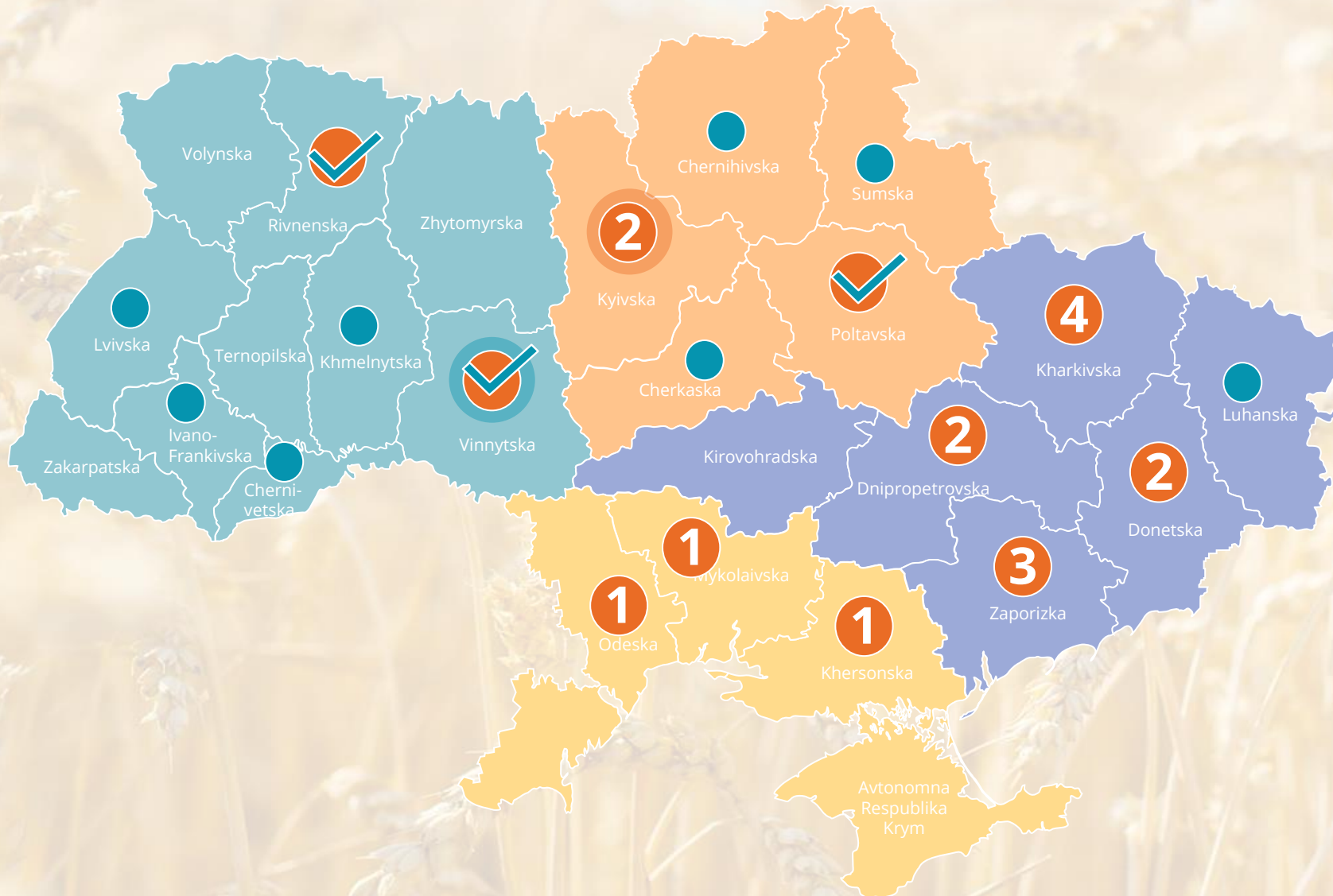
Response Under HRP 2023 More than 10 million people received food assistance in 2022. Humanitarian needs in areas where ongoing hostilities continue to escalate are increasing. Food insecurity is driven by the war, loss of livelihood opportunities, poverty levels, lack of access to food, and displacement. The number of people in need of food assistance is defined as those who are severely and moderately food insecure.

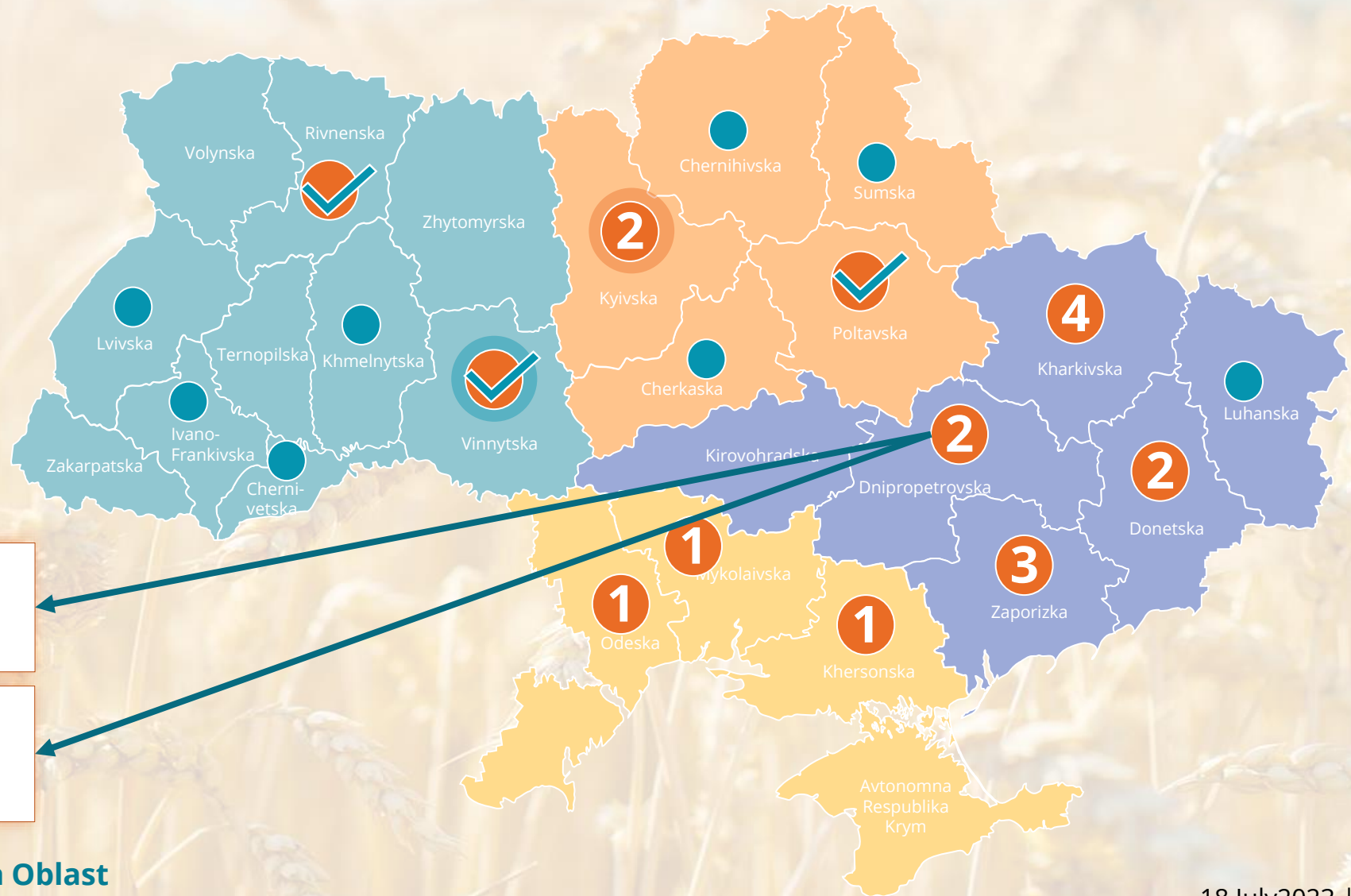
