### December 2023 CO1 - Food Assistance

In December 2023, food assistance was provided to 3,602,392 people, reaching 98% of FSLC target. Among the beneficiaries, 73% were provided with general food distribution including institutional feeding, while 11% received rapid response rations including bread, and 8% were provided with hot meals. Additionally, 8% of people received provision of market-based relief assistance. 66% of food assistance was allocated to non-IDPs, 33% to IDPs, and only 1% to returnees. The bulk of food assistance, totaling 79%, was allocated to six specific oblasts: Kharkivska, Donetsk, Khersonska, Zaporizka, Dnipropetrovska and Symyska.

32 reporting partners contributed to food assistance in December 2023, including WFP, GEM, WCK, SPIR, AOS, URCS, GCS, Posmishka, Caritas UA, PHK, LH, CSPESUA, BCUA, HADC, PIN SK, SV, R2P, HIA, CFDE, ASB, Poruch, ERC, Blahorob, NW, GoodWill, CORE, 100% Life, FFKR, BIY, LHI, ForestCom, TBPUA.

The Food Security and Livelihoods Cluster (FSLC) was established in December 2014 and is led by the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) and the World Food Programme (WFP). The FSLC coordinates the food security and livelihoods response for more than 500 partners since Russia's full-scale invasion on 24 February 2022.

**Response Under HRP 2023** More than 10 million people received food assistance in 2022. Humanitarian needs in areas where ongoing hostilities continue to escalate are increasing. Food insecurity is driven by the war, loss of livelihood opportunities, poverty levels, lack of access to food, and displacement. The number of people in need of food assistance is defined as those who are severely and moderately food insecure.
