| MOHADM - General Humanitarian Situation Of Puntland | <p>The food security and Livelihood cluster meeting which was held the ministry of humanitarian affairs and disaster management MoHADM has opened and welcomed the participants mr. Abdiaziz Dirie and He said</p> <p>“According to the last jointly report from food security and Nutrition unit FSNAU/FOA, Government line ministries which was led by MoHADM and Humanitarian partners working in Puntland revealed The humanitarian situation in Puntland is remains precarious due to several factors such as below Deyr 2023 average in some parts of Northern inland pastoral (NIP) and Coastal deeh which creates the hunger scale which severely impacted the Communities and their livestock, poor production of livestock in milk and meat, poor livestock sales, poor pasture , high accumulated debtless due to abnormal migration to search pasture and</p> |

| | <p>water for previous Drought impact and shortages of water availability, in addition to Higher Inflation, high prices of staple foods and fuels on Russia and Ukraine war which creates crisis on global supply chain, and as well as the previous Covid-19 impact and Desert locust which was devastated range land and farmers. Therefore the Puntland community struggling for those impacts from above factors which affected to the vulnerable community, in this current crisis situation resulted many pastoral community lost for their livestock where they get food and income generation and they migrated to the main villages and towns to search for food, water, Health, Shelter and Other basic needs services and They are facing severe life conditions for reasons of Humanitarian limited interventions due to Donor fatigue and under fund”.</p> |
| WFP – 31 March 2024 | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • WFP Garowe AO processed payment list for 9425 HHs (56,550 people) under IK in March but the reality is that we dispatched food to only 884 HHs in Caluula (5304 individuals) due to pipeline break. • For the CBT our plan was 34101 HHs (204,606 individuals) including the additional 11,000 HHs of flood affected and IDPs in Galkacyo, and we have processed payment lists only for 29,928 HHs (88% of the plan). • WFP assisted 58 schools of 14,719 Pupils through School Meal program in Feb 2024 under CBT modality. |
| SABATWO – 31 March 2024 FSC Achievement | <p>SABATWO has done CBT transfer in March under Relief program through WFP, assisting 4800 HHs in March: 1250 HHs in Hudun District received 90 USD, while 3550 HHs in Buuhoodle received 70 USD.</p> |
| SRCS – 31 March 2024 FSC Achievement | <p>SRCS has provided two cash modalities conditional cash voucher and Unconditional in both Bari and Nugal Region the total are 1175HH</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 350 HH was cash for nutrition in Waciye and Rako villages; each HH will receive \$120 per month with 4-month instalments. • 350HH of multipurpose cash assistance provided in Qardho, number of installments, and transfer value are the same as above. • 475 HH of multipurpose cash assistance is provided in Sinijiif, Qarhis, and Hasbahalle under Garowe and Eyl Districts. Each HH will receive \$110 per month in four-month instalments. |
| IR –31 March 2024 FSC Achievements | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The second installment of unconditional cash transfer was successfully provided to 822 households in Burtinle. |

| | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Multi-purpose cash transfer was successfully provided to 700 HHs in Lascanod. • 3 greenhouses were installed in Ceelbuh village and one in Dhanaha under the Badhan district. • A mini tractor was provided to the farmers' cooperative in Gabigudud village (Iskushuban district). • Construction of a post-harvest storage facility was completed in Gabigudud. • 4 blast freezers, each with a capacity of 2 tons, were provided to fishery cooperatives in Gumbax, Xanda (Iskushuban district), and Ceeldhidir and Kulule (Bandarbayla). |
| CARE – 31 March 2024 FSC Achievements | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Emergency program of CARE International has conducted the mobilization orientation and registration of the third phase of SOMSHARP Modification two in the Puntland Region, targeting 8470HHs in 8 Districts as Jariban District (1210HHs, Galdogob District 1516HHs, North Galkacyo 1344HHs in Mudug Region, Lascaanood 1690HHs, Hudun 550HHs Taleex 460HHs in Sool Region, badhan 1400HHs and Lasqoray 300HHs in Sanaag Region for three months activities of Unconditional cash transfer. |
| NRC _ 31 March 2024 | With the support of the GFFO, NRC provided cash transfer to 1,595 HHs in Nugal, Sanaag, Sool and Mudug regions: Dangorayo 591 HHs, Eyl 234 , Bocame 200HHs, Baran 200 HHs, Lascaanood 200 HHs, Galdogob 170 HHs. |
| KDO March – 2024 FSC Achievements | With the support of WFP, KDO has provided an in-kind distribution to 2700HHs in the Nugal region: 600 HHs are in Dangoronyo District, and 2100 HHs are in Garowe District. |
| SCI _ 31 March 2024 | With the support of KFW, SCI has provided cash transfer to 14,151 HHs in Jariban District. Each HH received 40 USD. |
| WV_ 31 March 2024 | The Puntland Area Office of World Vision provided cash transfers to 100HHs in Godobjiraan and Eyl. Furthermore, 242HHs in Dangorayo also received cash transfers. The Project was funded by WFP. |
