
Borno, Adamawa and Yobe States Market Monitoring

October 2023 - Issue 77

Highlights

- Compared to the parallel market rate of ₩1008/\$1 for the previous month, the Naira depreciated by 16% on the parallel market to close at ₩1170/\$1 on the 31st of October. This brings the total year-on-year (October 2022 to October 2023) depreciation of the Naira to 46%.
- Between September and October, the value of **70% of the cost of Survival Minimum Expenditure Basket (SMEB)** for a family of five remained stable at 1% from 41,187 naira to 41,468 naira in Maiduguri and Jere in Borno State. The October value of 70% of the cost of SMEB for a family of five in Damaturu represents an increase of 4% when compared to the previous month. Please refer to *Table 3* for the SMEB values in other LGAs of the BAY states.
- In October, petroleum pump prices were observed to still be on the rise across various outlets in the country. In comparison to the previous month, LGAs in Yobe State witnessed an increase in fuel prices as high as 28%. Fuel prices were highest in Fune LGA of Yobe State with an average of 1300 naira per litre, while the lowest price was observed in Bama LGA in Borno State with an average of 637 naira/litre in October. Trend in the Cost of 70% SMEB - MMC/Jere and Damaturu




Fig. 1 — Damaturu — Mmc&Jere

Monitoring the prices of food commodities, is essential to understand market functionalities, as well as inform cash based interventions by providing accurate local information on changes in prices. On this premise, WFP undertakes a bi-weekly monitoring of food commodities to gauge how vulnerable and market-dependent households are affected by food price changes and the resulting impact of such changes on the cost of the food basket.

WFP partners monitored a total of 34 markets across 24 LGAs in the October 2023 bulletin. Of these, 2 markets were in Adamawa, 19 markets in Borno (of which eight markets were in MMC and Jere) while the remaining 13 markets were in Yobe State.

Table 3 presents the SMEB values for various LGAs during the month of October 2023, revealing **Mobbar LGA with the highest SMEB value (₦66,250)**, followed closely by Dikwa (₦63,130) in Borno State, on the other hand Gwoza LGA in Borno State had the lowest SMEB value (₦37,821).

LGAs of Borno State monitored in October is seen to experience a decline in the cost of SMEB except for Mafa LGA with a month-on-month increase of 3 percent from ₩56,076 in September to ₩57,751 in October. The decrease in the cost of SMEB can be attributed to an increase in supplies of farm produce harvested during the last planting season.


Therefore, prices are generally expected to remain stable in most LGAs of Borno and Yobe States in the coming month.

Trends in the Cost of SMEB

- SMEB value for MMC/Jere increased slightly by one percent compared to the previous month, 21 percent when compared to three months ago, and 33 percent when compared to the same time last year.
- In Damaturu, SMEB value is seen to experience a 4 percent increase when compared to the previous month, 15 percent increase when compared to three months ago, and a 37 percent increase when compared to the same time last year.
- The steady increase in the cost of SMEB in Damaturu LGA affects households' access to food by sapping the purchasing power of households who spend a larger proportion of their disposable income and food assistance on meeting food needs.
- In MMC/Jere, fuel prices increased by 2.8 percent from an average price of ₩643 per litre in September to ₩661 per litre in October. Damaturu LGA observed an increase of 8 percent from an average price of ₩630 in September to ₩680 in October 2023.
- The average petroleum pump price is seen to be highest in Fune LGA in Yobe State with an average of ₦1,300 per litre. This is followed closely by Mobbar and Monguno LGAs in Borno State with a sharp increase of 14 percent from ₦1033 in September to ₦1,175 in October and 7 percent from ₦1,067 in September to ₦1,175 in October respectively.





- In MMC and Jere markets, a marginal increase of 7 percent is seen in the price of maize despite the stability seen in the prices of other key staples when compared to the previous month.
- In comparison to three months ago, the prices of key staples observed substantial increase **as high as 30 percent** in MMC and Jere markets. This is expected to accentuate food insecurity among the most vulnerable market dependent households.
- Despite the reduction seen in the price in the price of red beans and groundnuts on a year
 -on-year basis in MMC and Jere markets, it is important to note that the price of local rice,
 maize, and imported rice experienced a substantial increase as high as 26 percent.
- Damaturu market is seen to experience an increase as high as 47 percent in the prices of key staple food prices when compared to the previous month despite the reduction seen in the price of maize and groundnut.
- When compared to same time three months ago, key staples in Damaturu are seen to experience a substantial increase **as high as 78 percent.** However, a decrease is observed in the prices of local rice and groundnuts when compared to same time the previous year.
