



Call for Applications  
**Writing Workshop**  
**for South Sudanese Early Career Researchers**

in partnership with

The British Academy, The Institute of Peace, Development and Security (University of Juba) and The Firoz Lalji Centre for Africa (London School of Economics and Political Science).

Successful applicants will be invited to:

- attend a writing workshop in East Africa from the **10<sup>th</sup>- 22<sup>nd</sup> July 2018** (including travel);
- receive additional support to facilitate the submission of an article to an international, peer-reviewed journal by the end of November 2018.

Applicants must be South Sudanese and will usually have a PhD or equivalent research experience. Applicants should **not** have numerous, previous academic publications. Applicants must have original empirical research in the social sciences or humanities that they hope to write-up into an academic article of approximately 8,000 words to submit to an international, peer reviewed journal by the end of November 2018.

To apply, applicants should submit the following to both Dr. Leben Moro ([lebenmoro@hotmail.com](mailto:lebenmoro@hotmail.com)) and Dr. Naomi Pendle ([N.R.Pendle@lse.ac.uk](mailto:N.R.Pendle@lse.ac.uk)) by the **18<sup>th</sup> May 2018**:

- An abstract and detailed outline of their proposed article, including details of original research already conducted.
- Preferably a sample of previous writing. This could be a draft of the work that the researcher hopes to develop.
- A statement confirming that: i) they are South Sudanese; ii) their research complied with usual ethical standards; iii) their university or employer is committed to give them the necessary time for writing and workshop attendance.
- A short curriculum vitae.

Applicants will be selected based on their ability to benefit from support and submit an academic article to an international peer reviewed journal by the end of November 2018.

The writing workshop is funded with support from the British Academy.
