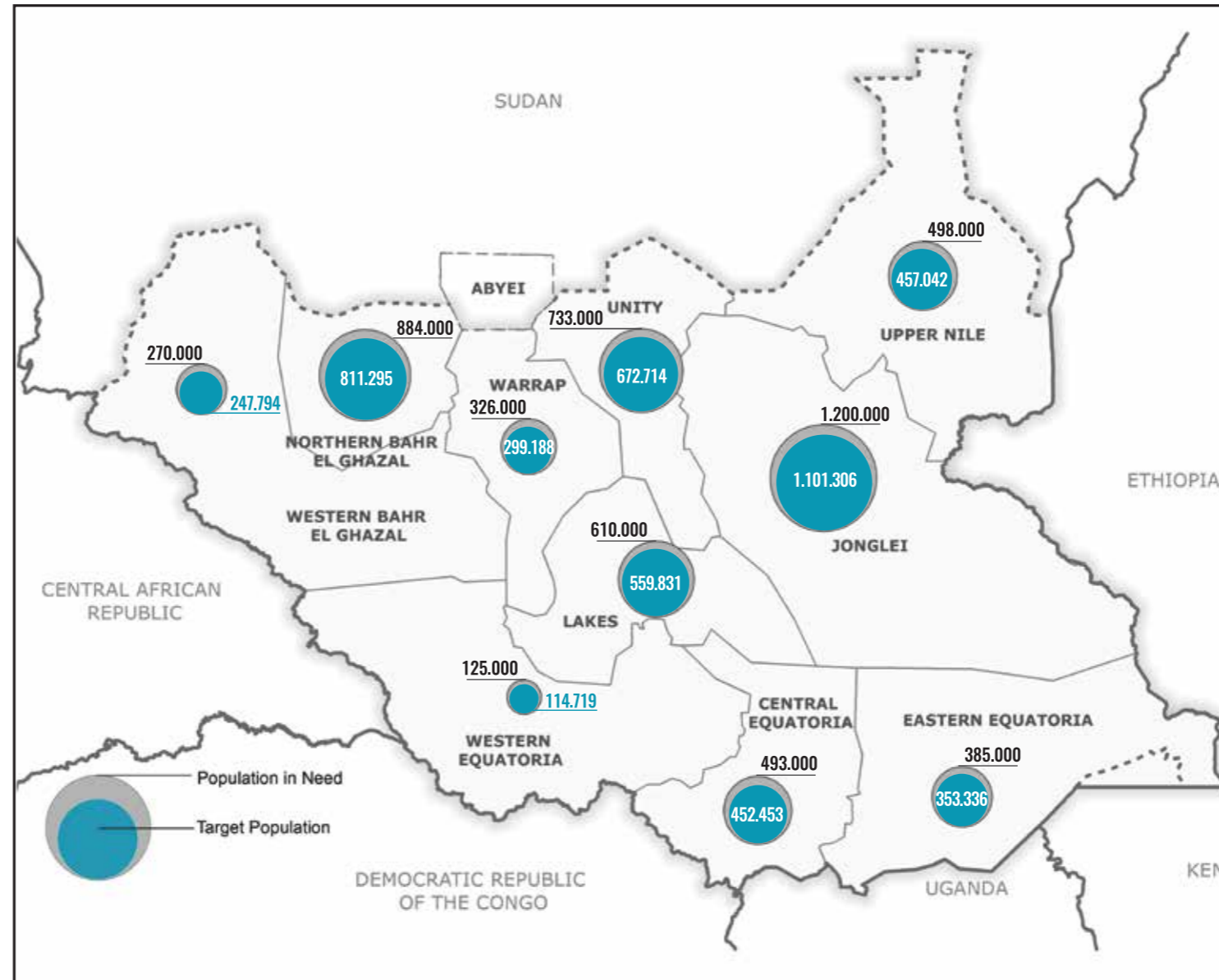

In 2017, the food security situation across South Sudan is predicted to deteriorate to the lowest levels since the 2013 crisis with famine declared in parts of Unity State due to a combination of: (1) conflict; (2) a reduction of agricultural outputs; (3) lower purchasing power (demand-related shocks); and (4) supply side shocks (reduced trade flows). There has already been an increase in the number of people requiring assistance in the Greater Bahr Ghazals, Warrap, and across the Equatorias.

Lifesaving assistance is the overall priority for the FSL-C, in addition to increasing markets based interventions and agricultural production if and where feasible. Recognising that even within lifesaving assistance, there is a need to prioritise. The FSL-C will support partners to:

- Promote and prioritise approaches that address the drivers of food insecurity, particularly as they pertain to market and supply;
- Identify and work with actors operational in 'hard to reach areas' in order to effectively execute FSL activities;
- Develop strategies and approaches targeting the most vulnerable within communities (shift from geographic targeting to vulnerability based targeting within communities);
- Gain better effectiveness across sectors and promote overall cost-efficiency, promote approaches where food and livelihood inputs support the work of other sectors, particularly nutrition and WASH.
