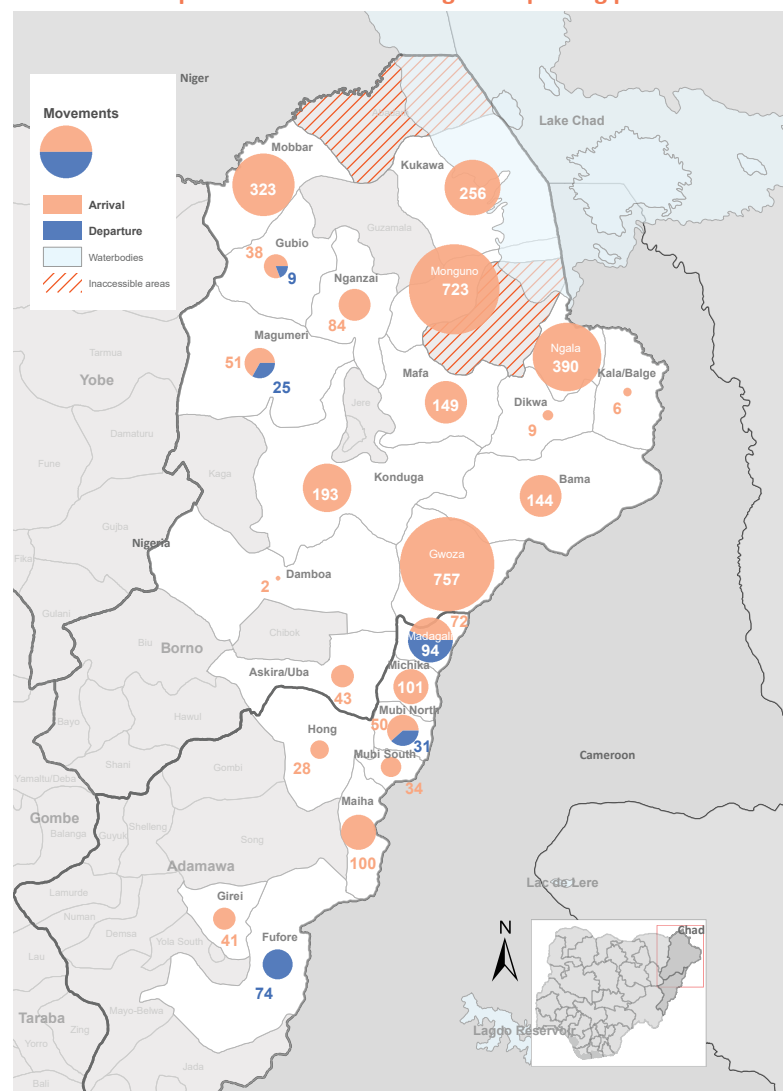


Arrivals and departures recorded during the reporting period

Summary

Jere (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 957 individuals (INDs) were relocated to Custom House Camp in Jere from Shuwari Transit Centre during the reporting the period. The relocation exercise started on 28 December 2017 and was concluded on 2 January 2018.

Gwoza (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 757 new arrivals were recorded in Gwoza during the reporting period. These include 240 INDs who returned to Wakane community from Mubi South LGA, 126 INDs who arrived at Pulka Transit Camp from surrounding wards, 46 arrivals at the Transit Camp from Cameroon, 234 arrivals at Wakane community from Jere LGA, and 111 arrivals at Hausari Community from Maiduguri.

Monguno (Triggers: military operations, voluntary relocation): 723 arrivals were recorded in Monguno during the reporting period. These include 710 arrivals at GGSS Camp from Marte LGA due to military operations in the area, and 13 arrivals at Fulatari Camp from Kukawa LGA.

Ngala (Triggers: poor living conditions, attack): 390 arrivals were recorded in Ngala during the reporting period. These include 184 arrivals at International School Camp from Cameroon, 59 arrivals at the Camp from Maiduguri, 142 arrivals at the Camp from surrounding wards in Ngala and 5 arrivals at Arabic Camp B from Maiduguri.

Mobbar (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 323 INDs arrived at Damasak Central ward of Mobbar LGA from Difa in Niger Republic.

Kukawa (Triggers: poor living conditions, improved security): 256 arrivals were recorded in Kukawa during the reporting period. These include 98 arrivals from Kebbi State, 43 arrivals from Yobe State, 45 arrivals from Maiduguri LGA, 29 arrivals from Abadam LGA, 19 arrivals from Monguno LGA, 10 arrivals from Jere LGA and 12 arrivals from Baga ward of Kukawa.

Konduga (Trigger: attack): 193 arrivals were recorded in Konduga during the reporting period. These include 138 arrivals at Konduga town from surrounding wards due to recent attacks in the area and 55 arrivals at Boarding Primary School Camp from Bama (31 INDs) and Yalee ward of Konduga (24 INDs).

Madagali (Triggers: voluntary relocation, attack): 72 arrivals and 94 departures were recorded in Madagali during the reporting period. These include 63 arrivals at Madagali town from surrounding wards, 9 arrivals at the town from Yola North LGA, 60 INDs who left for Girei LGA, and 17 INDs respectively who left for Gulak ward of Madagali and Gude ward of Mubi South LGA.

Mafa (Triggers: poor living conditions, military operations, improved security): 149 arrivals were recorded in Mafa during the reporting period. These include 126 arrivals at Mafa Camp B, 11 arrivals at Bulamari community and 6 arrivals respectively at Ajari and Hausari communities.

Bama (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 144 arrivals were recorded in Bama during the reporting period. These include 65 arrivals at GSSSS Camp from Soye ward of Bama, 22 arrivals at the camp from Gwoza LGA, 8 arrivals at the camp from Maiduguri M.C LGA, 30 arrivals at Banki Camp from Jere LGA and 19 arrivals at Banki Camp from Morwa in Cameroon.

Michika (Triggers: attack, poor living conditions): 101 arrivals were recorded in Michika during the reporting period. These include 61 arrivals from Cameroon, 13 arrivals from Yola South LGA, 12 arrivals from Girei LGA, 8 arrivals from Osun State and 7 arrivals from Plateau State.

Maiha (Triggers: attack, voluntary relocation): 100 arrivals were recorded in Maiha during the reporting period. These include 49 arrivals at the town from Sourau B ward of Maiha due to recent attacks in the area, 21 arrivals from Demsa LGA, 16 arrivals from Cameroon and 14 arrivals from Madagali LGA.

Nganzai (Triggers: military operations, voluntary relocation): 84 arrivals were recorded at Gajiram ward of Nganzai during the reporting period. These include 36 arrivals at the town from surrounding villages due to military operations in the area, 28 arrivals from Magumeri LGA and 20 arrivals from Monguno LGA.

Mubi North (Triggers: poor living conditions, voluntary relocation): 50 arrivals and 31 departures were recorded in Mubi North during the reporting period. These include 20 arrivals from Madagali LGA, 15 arrivals respectively from Michika and Mafa LGAs, 18 departures for Girei LGA and 13 departures for Madagali LGA.

Magumeri (Triggers: voluntary relocation, military operation): 51 INDs arrived at Gajiganna ward of Magumeri from surrounding villages and 25 INDs left Gajiganna for Bolori ward of Maiduguri LGA.

Fufore (Triggers: attack, improved security): 74 departures were recorded in Fufore during the reporting period. These include 63 INDs who left Wuro Bokki for Dasin ward of Fufore LGA due to recent attacks in Wuro Bokki area and 11 INDs who left for Numan LGA.

Gubio (Trigger: poor living conditions): 38 arrivals and 9 departures were recorded in Gubio during the reporting period. These include 22 arrivals from Maiduguri M.C., 16 arrivals from Gazabure ward of Gubio and 9 departures for Jere LGA.

Askira/Uba (Triggers: improved security, voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 43 arrivals were recorded in Askira/Uba during the reporting period. These include 37 arrivals at the town from surrounding wards, 4 arrivals from Maiduguri M.C. and 2 arrivals from Gombe State.

Girei (Triggers: voluntary relocation, poor living conditions): 41 arrivals were recorded in Girei during the reporting period. These include 26 arrivals from Madagali LGA and 15 arrivals from Mubi North LGA.

Mubi South (Triggers: voluntary relocation, military operation): 34 arrivals were recorded in Gude ward of Mubi South during the reporting period. These include 27 arrivals from Madagali LGA and 7 arrivals from Konduga LGA.

Hong (Trigger: poor living conditions): 28 INDs arrived at Garaha/Gaya ward of Hong LGA from Jos North LGA of Plateau State.

Dikwa (Trigger: voluntary relocation): 9 INDs arrived at Dikwa Central during the reporting period. These include 8 arrivals at FOB Arrival Center and 1 arrival at the town.

Kala/Balge (Trigger: poor living conditions): 6 INDs arrived at Rann in Kala/Balge during the reporting period. These include 5 arrivals from Cameroon and 1 IND who arrived from Jarawa ward of Kala/Balge.

Damboa (Trigger: poor living conditions): 2 INDs arrived at General Hospital Camp in Damboa from Wawa/Korode community in Damboa.
