



Context – operational challenges



General **logistics capacity stretched**, and ongoing challenges faced in transporting inputs due to road conditions and insecurity outside Juba town.



Restricted movement in Baggari, Wau owing to ongoing insecurity.



Potential increase in cattle raiding as dry season approaches.

Highlights

- World Food Day was celebrated on 16 October, with the a very relevant theme for South Sudan: “Change the future of migration. Invest in food security and rural development”.
- The procurement process is underway for the 2018 main season.
- Dry season and rapid response activities planned in Greater Upper Nile and Greater Bahr el Ghazal.
- The latest report of the Integrated Food Security Phase Classification was issued on 6 November, highlighting continued severe hunger despite the onset of the harvest season.
- Latest Crop Watch reported benefits of high rainfall in August and September and overall good crop production, compared to last year where most cropping areas were affected by prolonged dry spells.


FAO-WFP joint Mundri response

FAO and WFP carried out a joint distribution of vegetable kits and food assistance to 1 858 households (11 145 people) in Mvolo and Mundri West (Western Equatoria) through a joint partner – Food for the Hungry – from 16 to 22 October. This reflects the two agencies’ broader efforts to increase collaboration on the ground and thus ensure greater impact for affected populations. Increased conflict and general insecurity in Greater Mundri has created pockets of inaccessible areas and displacements, severely affecting the livelihoods of both hosting community and displaced people.

Kit composition



Crop kits

3 types of seeds and 1 hoe/maloda

Provides: One year of staple crops for a whole family



Vegetable kits

5-7 types of seeds and 1 hoe/maloda

Provides: 6 months of nutritious vegetables for one family



Fishing kits

1 coil of monofilament, 100 hooks, and 2 spools of twine

Provides: Fishing capacity to feed 25 families for one day



Rapid response kits


A varied combination of kits (crop, vegetable and /or fishing) based on context

Provides: Life-saving assistance to severely food insecure families in remote areas

Delivery of crop and vegetable seeds (including seed fairs)
