

## Minimum Emergency Response Kits

Food Security and Livelihood	
<p><b>Emergency Food Assistance</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A one off 50% ration 15 days (for short-term emergencies)</li> <li>• In IPC 4 counties with pockets of IPC 5 a 70% ration is provided for 8 months.</li> <li>• In all other IPC 4 locations will receive a 50% ration for a 5 to 7 months' period (dependent upon resources).</li> </ul> <p><b>Livelihood &amp; Livestock Support</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Floods: fishing kits (twine, monofilament &amp; hooks); and where appropriate a vegetable kit (3 quick maturing varieties + tool) - for flood emergencies.</li> <li>• Other emergencies: emergency crop kit (cereal, pulses + tool); livestock vaccination &amp; treatment, where the context permits, during the main farming season.</li> </ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• COVID-19 Masks</li> <li>• First aid kits (<i>Only by community health volunteers where available</i>)</li> <li>• Basic Health Emergency Kit (<i>Only to be delivered where there is specialized medical capacity.</i>)</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Sanitary / dignity kits</li> <li>• Psycho-social kits</li> <li>• Recreational kits and tents (Child Protection)</li> <li>• Family Tracing and Reunification forms, IEC materials and tool kits</li> </ul>

### Note

- Except for the flood kit, and due to financial and logistics constraints, the S/NFI Cluster is rarely able to provide a full minimum standard kit except in formal displacement sites. Otherwise, shelter and NFI partners will assess the most critical items out of the response package and the request will be fulfilled based on material availability and needs.
- Quantities contingent upon availability of stock at the time of emergency.
- All bulky items (S/NFI, WASH) are to be assembled at the final destination to maximize air transport capacity.
- Clusters are encouraged to preposition emergency response kit items at strategic warehouses.
