BENEFITS

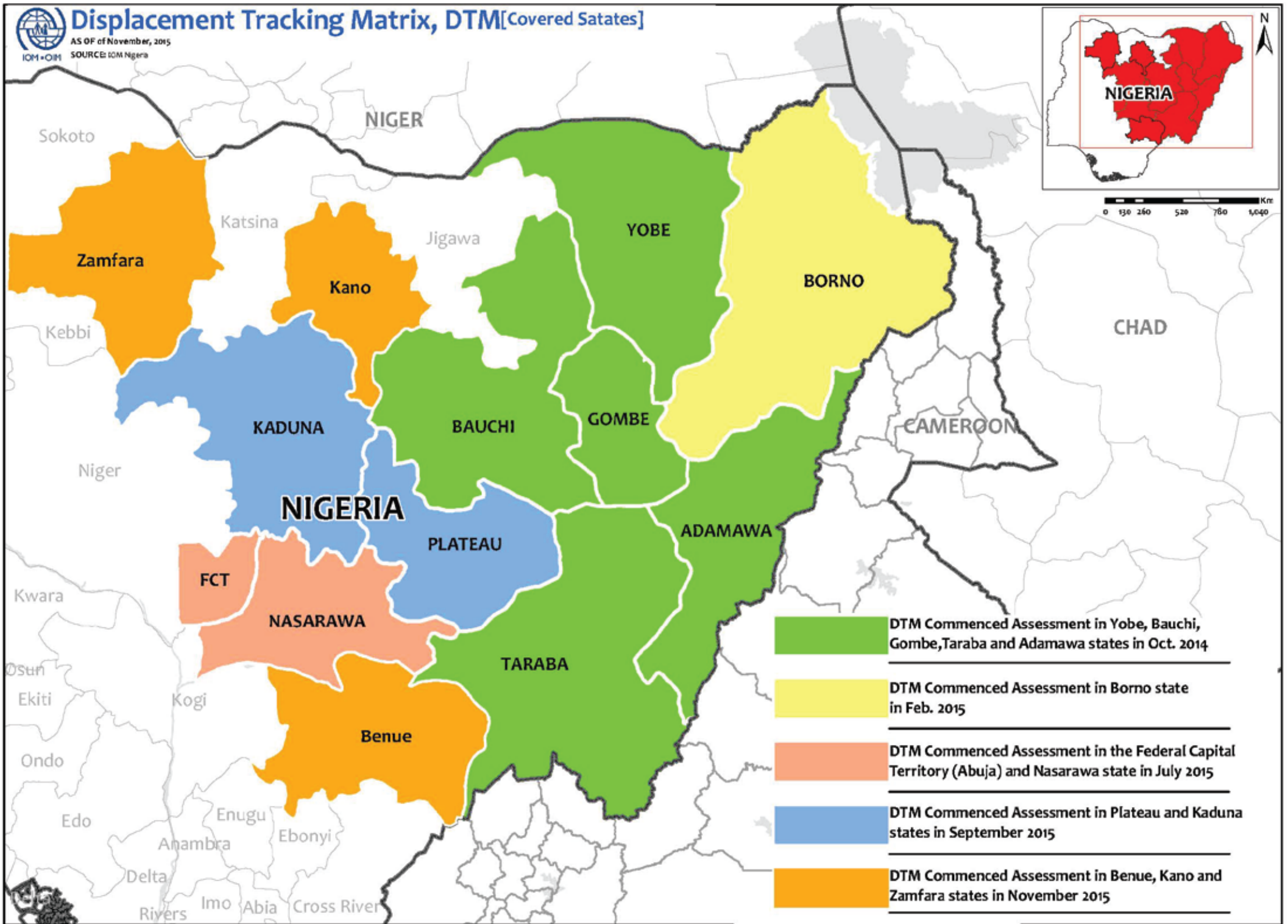

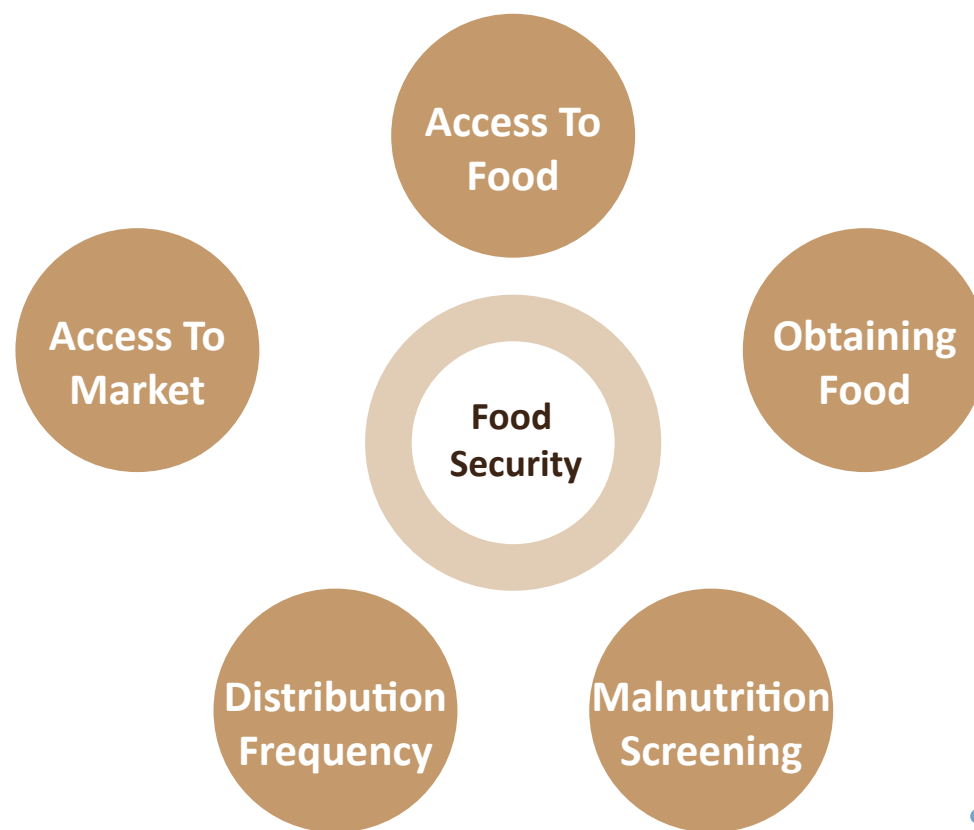

Of the 155 Sites assessed, 116 had access to food

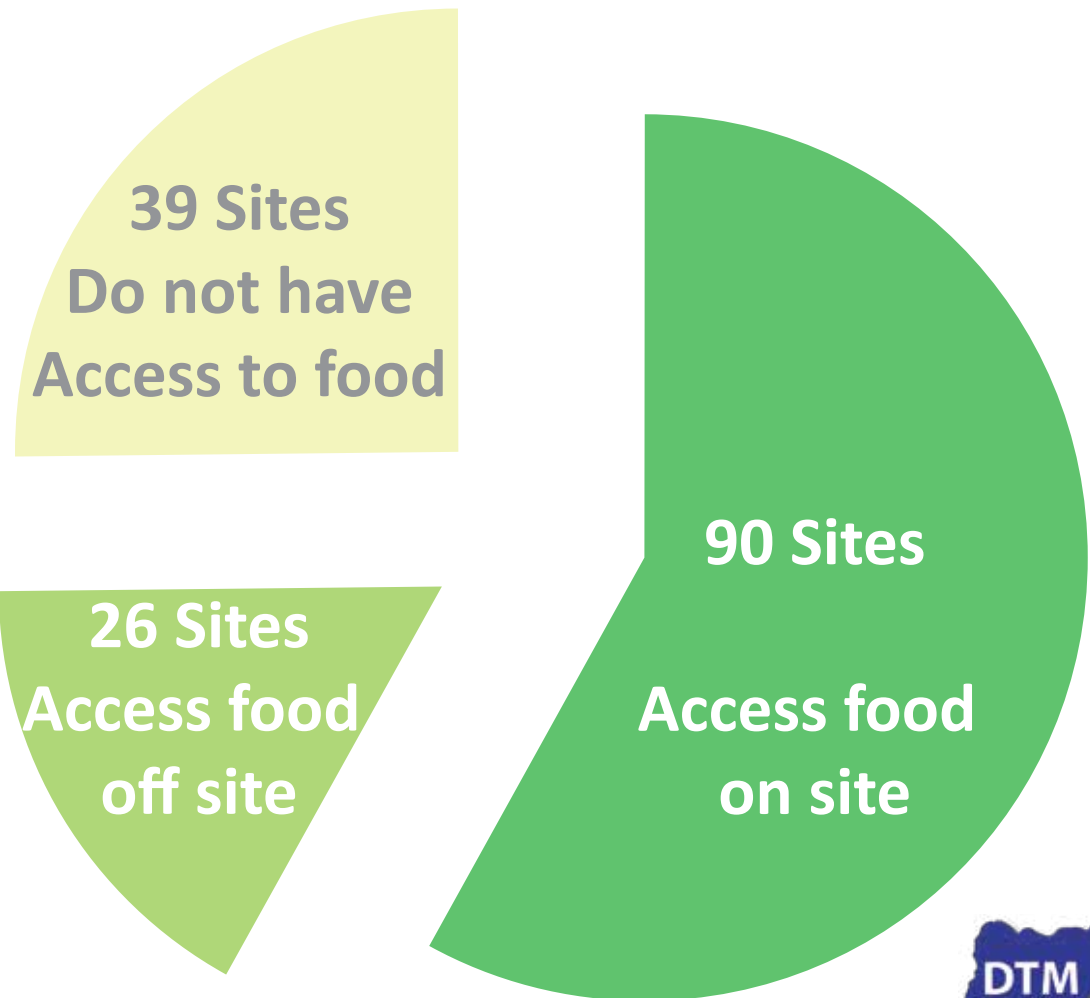
A Total of 155 sites were assessed.

conducted in 41 sites.

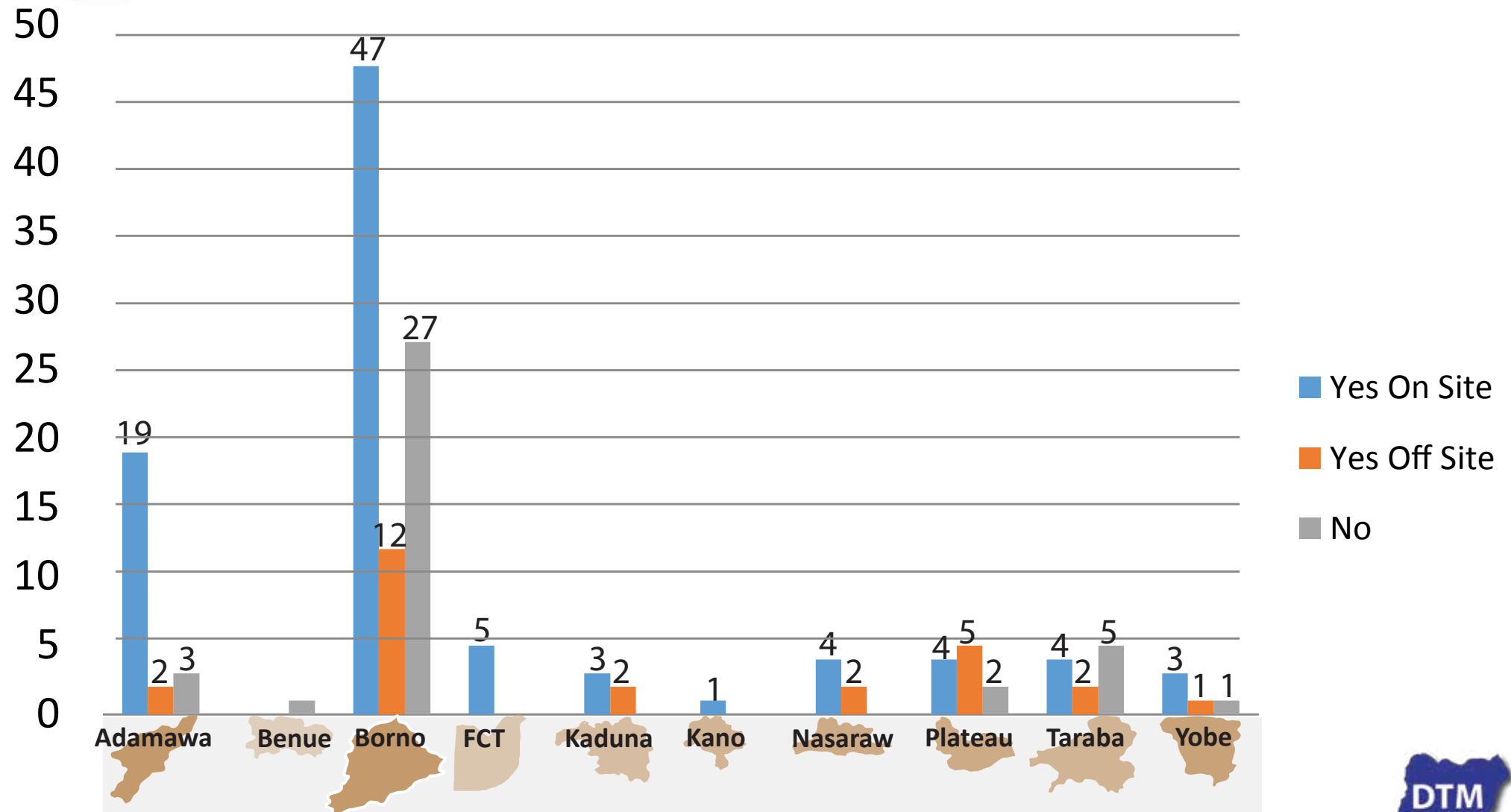
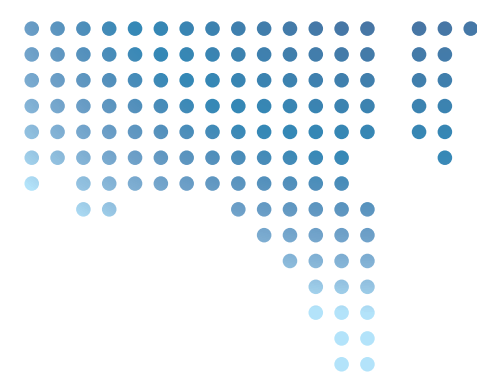

Access To Food



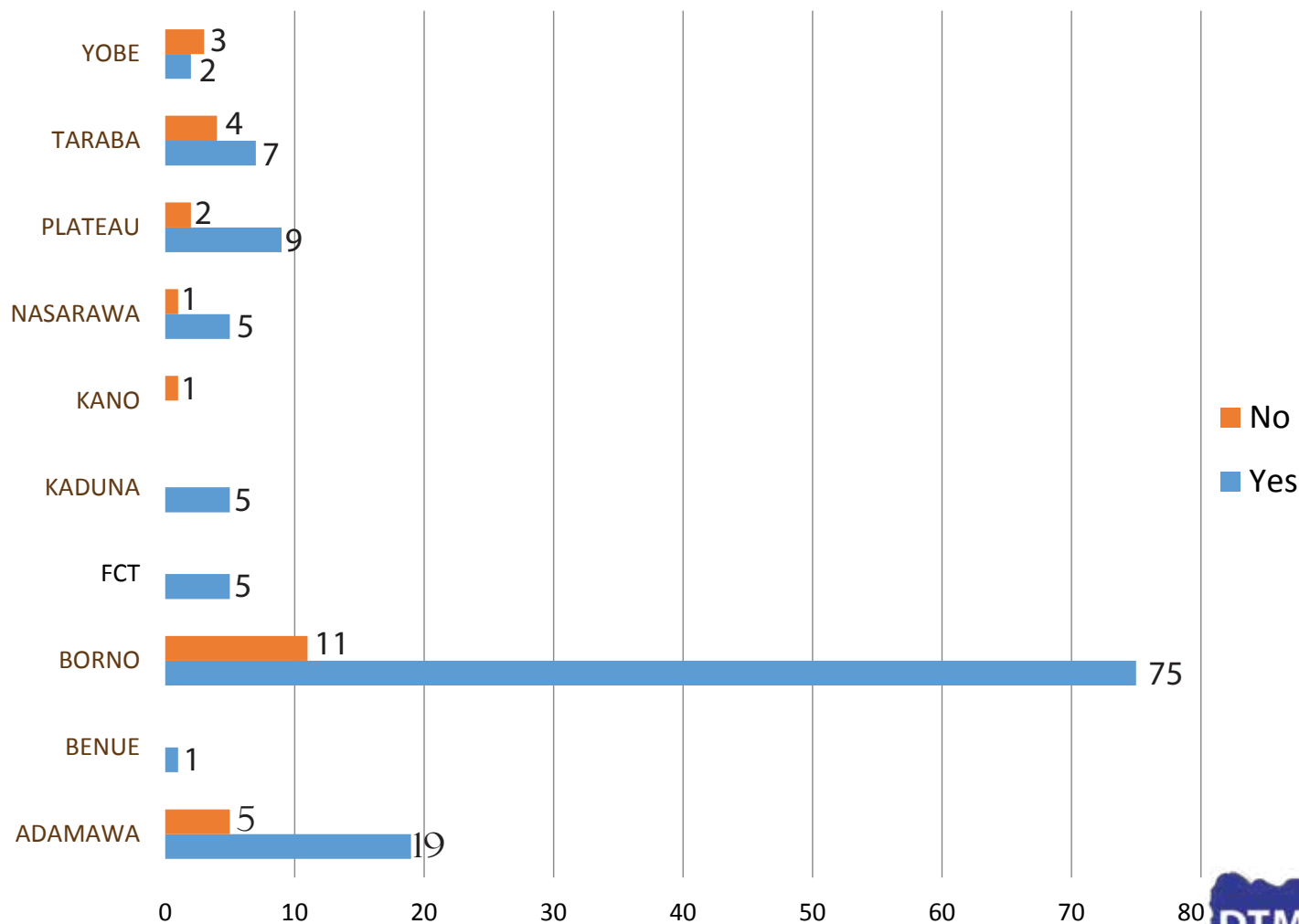
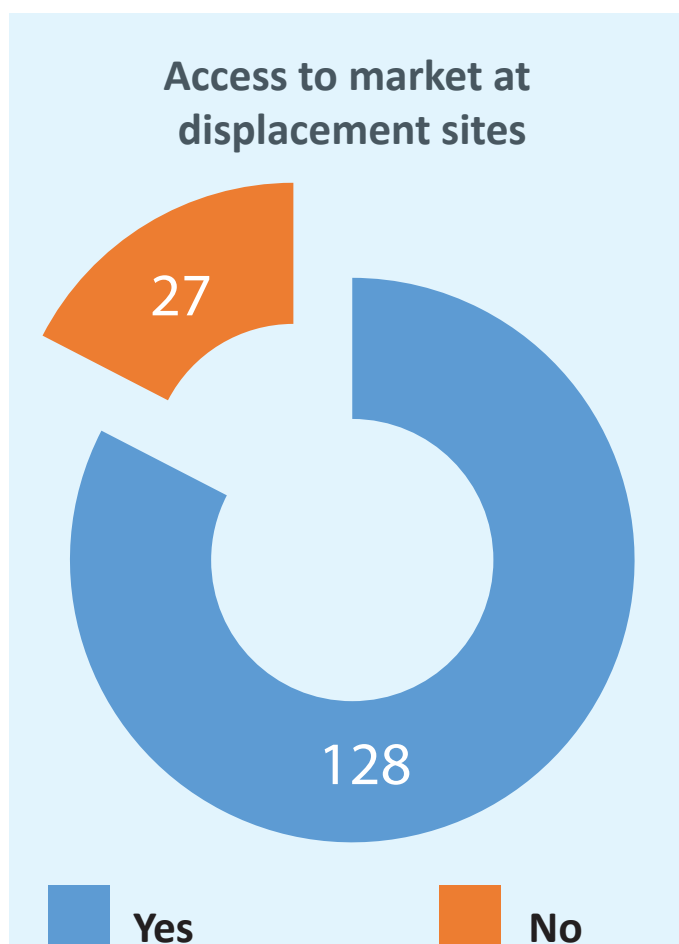
Assessment by state

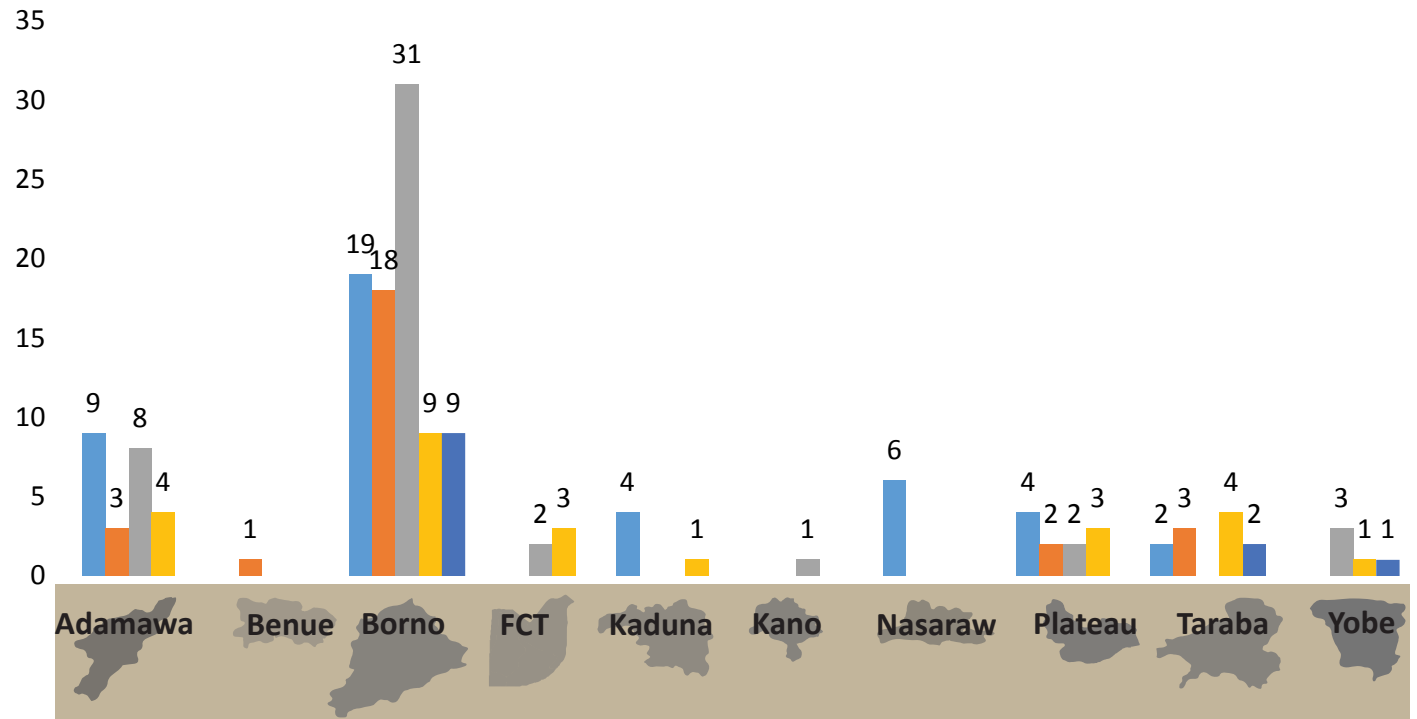
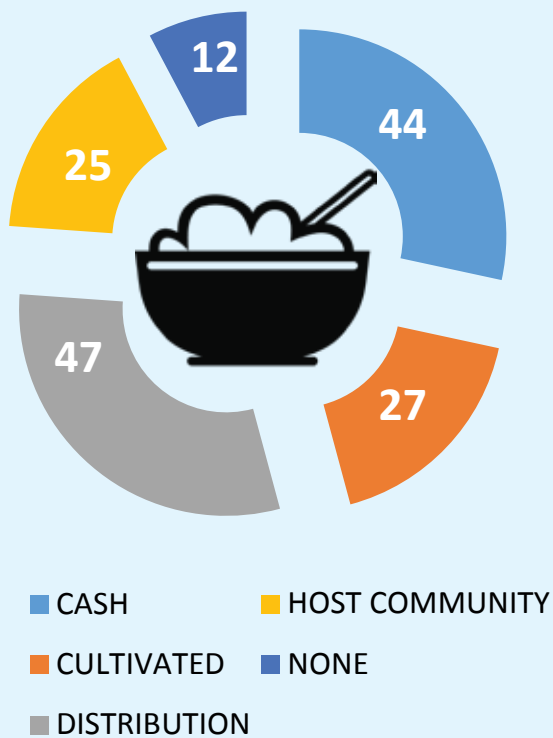

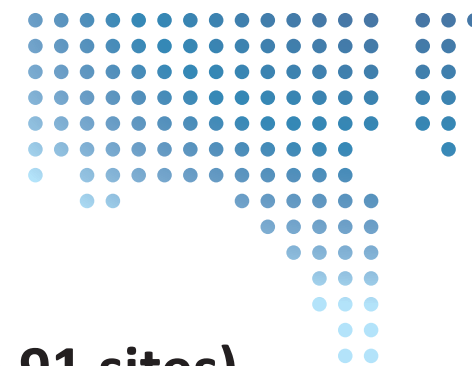
Source of obtaining food

Source Of Obtaining Food

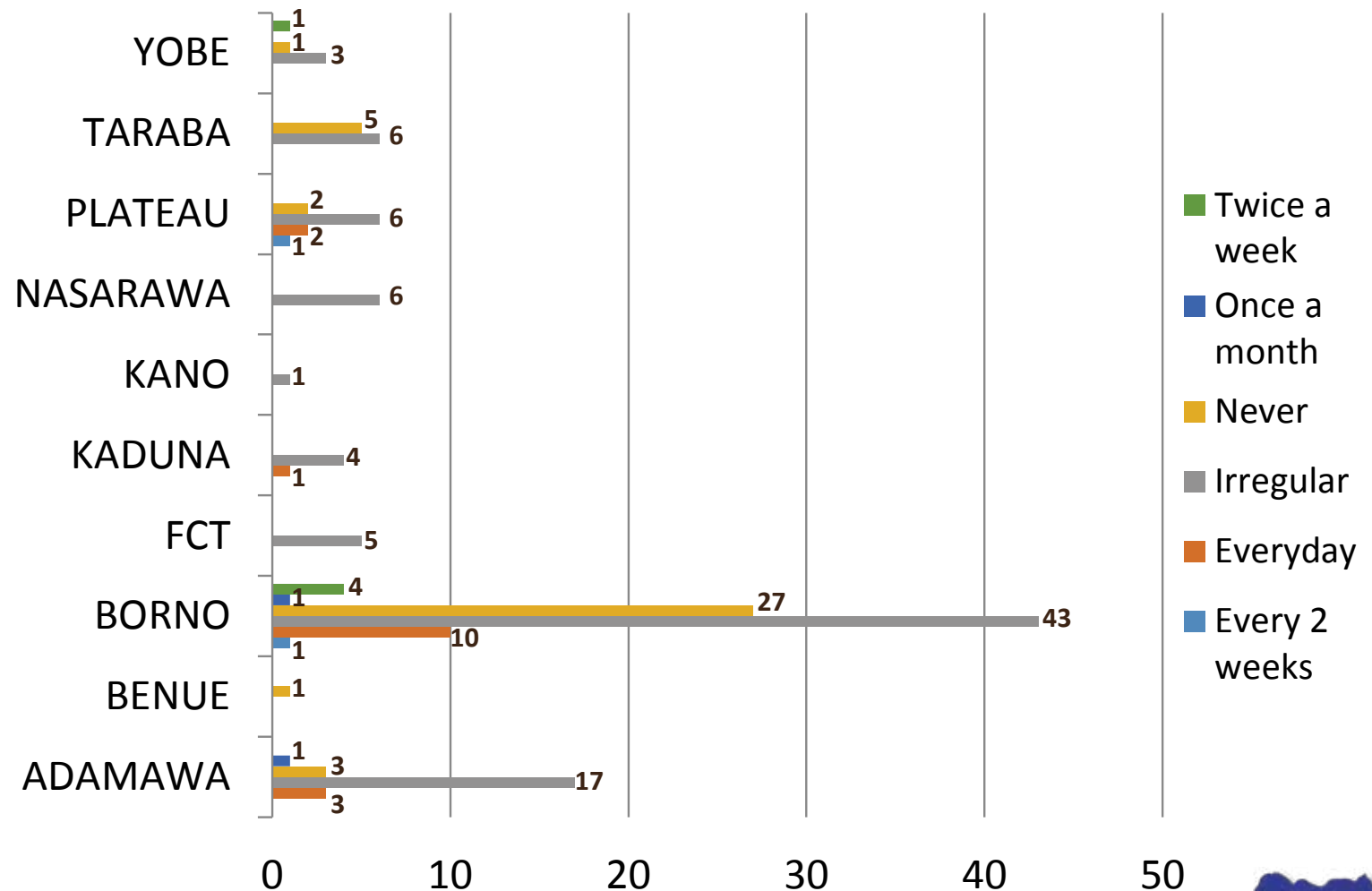
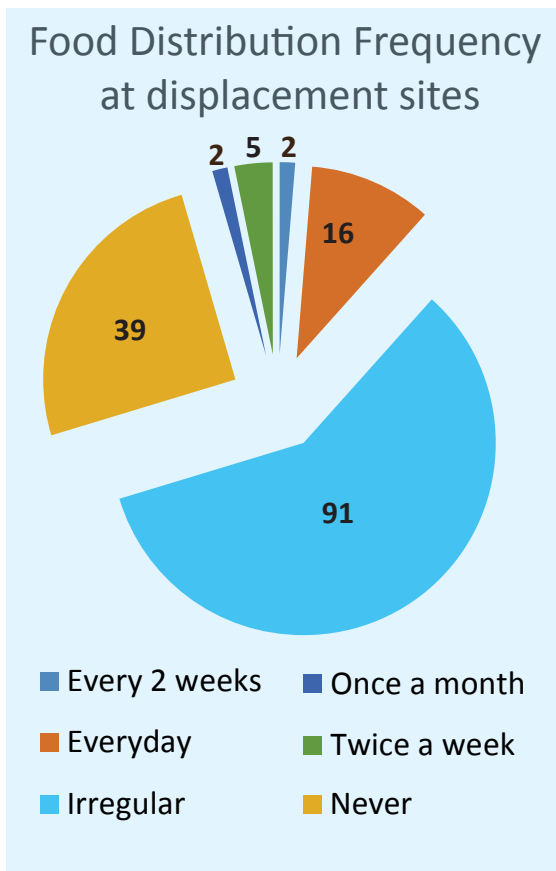


Food Distribution Frequency

Frequency of food distribution is mostly irregular (In 91 sites)

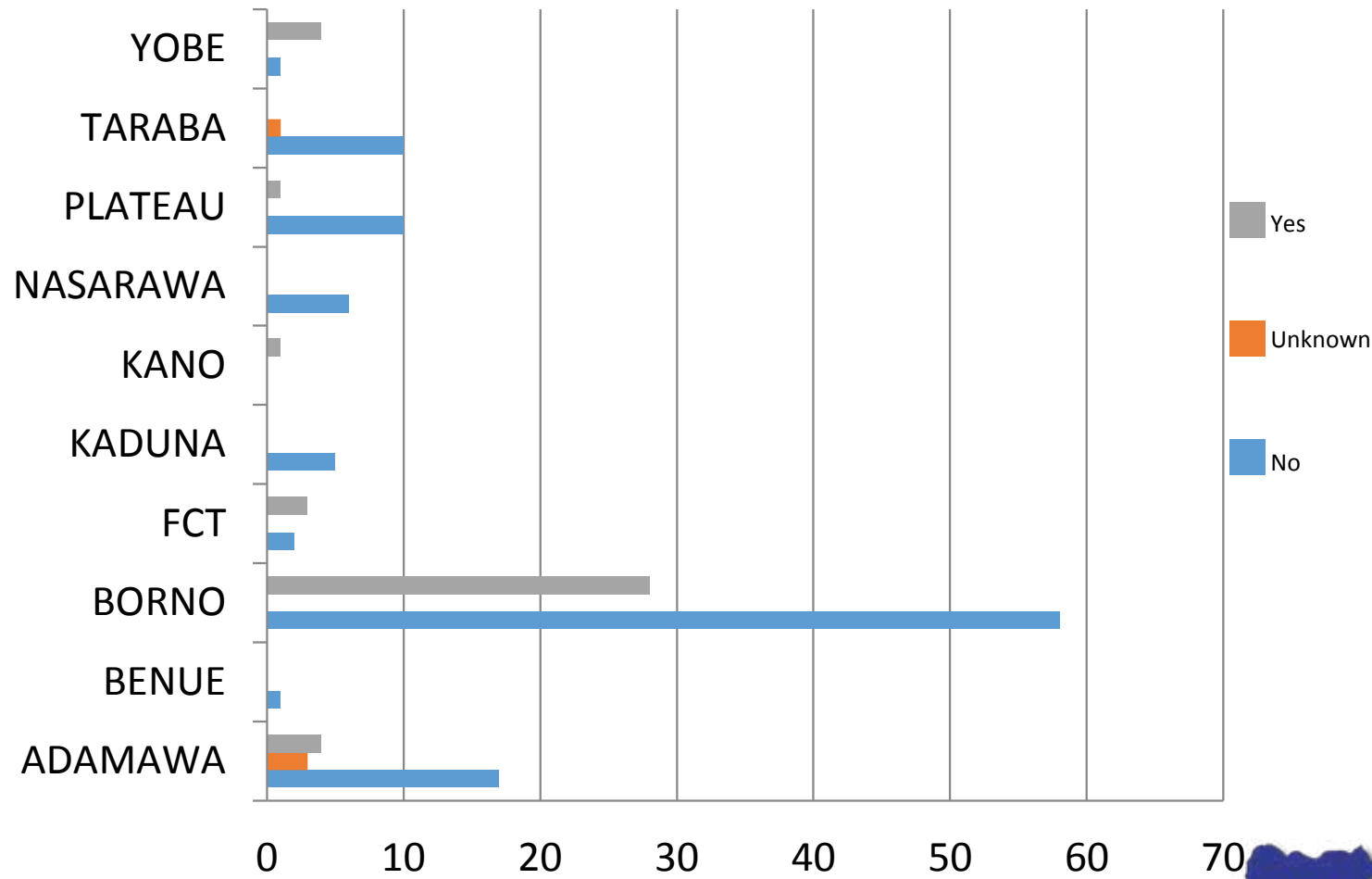
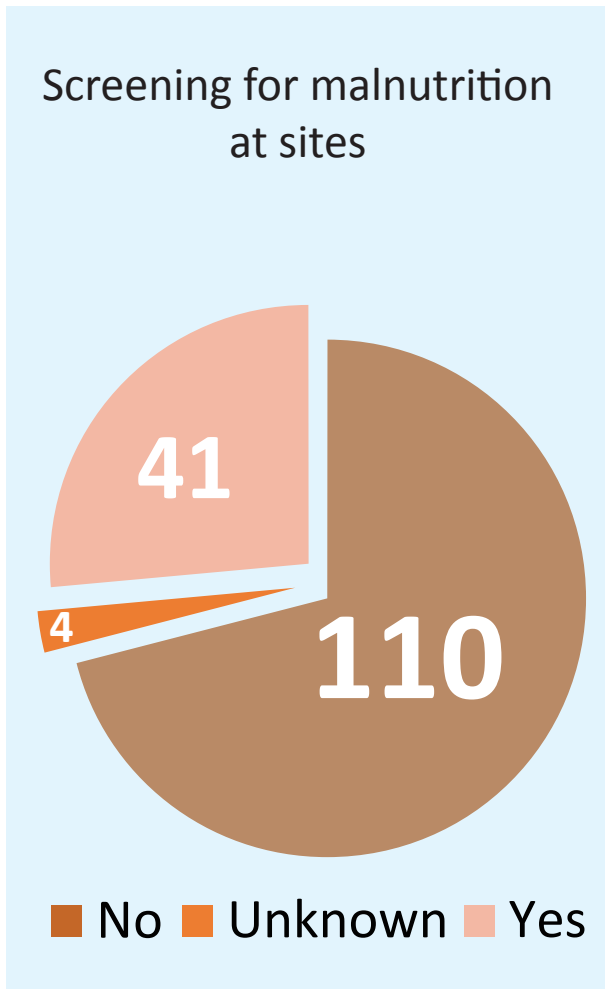




Malnutrition Screening
