Overview

Type of Intervention/Project: Geographical Coverage/location: Eight locations were covered during the period under review between Orozo FCT Abuja and Nasarawa State

Activities and Results Achieved

Key activities/achievements and results: Facilitating the processing of obtaining loans to IDPs Farmer in Nasarawa who are into production of cowpea enterprises from the above camps, who have cultivated over 1000 ha. In 2016 and will do twice this year with vigorous monitoring and evaluation. 2). Mobilising support for an IDP woman who delivered Triplets all baby girls three months old with food and non-food items. Mrs Mbumtu live with her five children in Dille Camp in Askira/ Uba L.G.A who could be reach on 08131820585

Number of beneficiaries targeted and reached so far: 150 women and young girls have been benefited from our training and fully empowered. We have adopted a model called each one train two and so far more trainees are being recorded from our programme and 60 women are waiting to receive start-up package where each woman will be given sewing machine and start-up capital not less than 10k. Also more than 2000 was engaged in the farming last where we recorded success and as a results, more IDPs have join the train this year due to the last year success. We are targeting at-least 6000 farmers in 2017 wet season farmers.

Issues/Challenges/Problems

Key issues: More IDPs need to be train in skills so that they can be economically sound. Farming inputs for IDPs farmers to enable more participate in farming activities this year. Condition of the IDPs who returned from Minawao camp in Cameroun are not good at all, they could not farm last year are under severe hunger in Kugbaru camp up to 60 families and payment of house rent that are between 2000 to 3000 naira per month is given them problem. , challenges: In Abuja, activities of IDPs are not coordinated and need to be organized, several IDPs are being killed and nobody report it. The host communities have sky rocketed their farmland lease fair to about five digit depending on the distance and its accessibility. Idps staying on farmland are very difficult to access especially as from next month when the amount of rain is higher. and problems encountered during the reporting period: Lack of means of transportation to enable us locate those in remote areas and the distance apart as the farming cluster increase as a result of increase in participants. Lack of access to finance, this is to enable hire more hands to monitor some achievement and report success back to the house. Lack of central body that coordinate the activities of NGOs the way it is done in the Northeast.

Plans and way forward

Planned activities and wayward for the next two weeks: we planned to support the woman that delivered triplets with food and non-food items this week. We also want to profile widows whose husbands was killed by boko haram in Askira/Uba so that we can plan intervention for them against the wet season farming period. MUSSA COMMUNITY NEED TO BE SUPPORTED because of several devastating effect of insurgency attacked on the community. Local NGOs need to be assign to carry out assessment so that data obtained could be used to plan intervention for them.
