3	Partners update	<p><b>ACF:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Has completed its unconditional CT of N 25,000 each HH in 3 wards of the Gujba LGA.</li> <li>• At Planning stage to support 6000 HHs in Gujba LGA in Gotala, Gujba, Goniri and Mutai.</li> <li>• They were in 5 wards for the same project targeting 1500HHs (Damagum A&amp;B, Ngelzarma A/B and Daura in Fune LGA.</li> <li>• Damaturu/Potiskum full out based on CH analysis</li> <li>• Assessment: on market streath trying to identify the market situation before and after the crises.</li> <li>• Tarmuwa, Nangere and Gujba ACF is in plating stage to support PLW and the maintained LOA.</li> </ul> <p><b>COOPI:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Support to 1440HHs in Damaturu, Fika and Potiskum LGAs will ending by November 2015.</li> <li>• Bade, Geidam and Yunusari LGAs: COOPI has a meeting with</li> </ul>	Damaturu is on IPC 3

In the mentioned 3 LGAs, the beneficiaries for the rainy season will start receiving CT.</li> <li>• Planning to support 16,300 HHs in 10 LGAs of the</li> <li>• Also planning to support 3200 HHs for rice farmers in the state</li> <li>• Livestock support to women (small ruminants) and youth (Bull fattening) to 12,390 HHs in 9 LGAs (kit for beneficiaries)</li> <li>• Planning to vaccinate 9000 animals in 2018.</li> <li>• Planning to distribute animal feeds in 2018</li> </ul> <p><b>WFP:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 192,000 people has been reached through ACF/COOPI in 9 LGAs for general food distribution and E-Voucher.</li> <li>• Target for the month of September 2017 is same as for August 2017.</li> <li>• WFP is in consultation with CRS but has not finalized, outcome of the consultation will be made known.</li> <li>• WFP agreed to continue with all its activities, while trying to reach partners so as to avoid project duplication and find out areas of overlapping in Gujba, Gulani, Geidam and Jakusko LGAs.</li> <li>• Assessment: Emergency assessment report expected by end of October 2017, the report is expected to fit in to the CH analysis upcoming training for enumerators by NBS next week in Damaturu.</li> </ul> <p><b>CRS:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• has reached 11,345 (81,753 people) in Five LGAs Bursari, Gujba, Gulani, Jakusko and Karasuwa across 36 political wards of the 5 LGAs.</li> <li>• Nutrition: support to 12,244 individuals on IVC/Key household practices in Jakusko, Karasuwa and Bursari LGAs.</li> </ul> <p><b>CCDRN:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• is a M/E organization (NGO) with its head office in Kaduna, Kaduna state.</li> <li>• Currently in partnership with FAO in Borno Yobe and Adamawa state for its raining season support project. 4.	Lessons learned on field during lean period/raining season support	<p><b>ACF:</b> - in Gujba LGA, there is security constraints more especially Goniri and Gotumba communities.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Accessibility (terrain) to reach Gotumba community on which</li> </ul>	

		<p>they collaborate with the authority.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- In Fune ACF experienced elite capture of beneficiary's selection.</li> <li>- Also noticed that since IDP no of IDPs has reduced, HC members tends to be IDPs in order to benefit from the support. But finally ACF was able to overcome the problem.</li> </ul> <p><b>COOP:-</b> experienced the challenge of late redeeming of in kind food distribution.</p> <p><b>FAO:</b> - Security clearance for fertilizer delivery to Damaturu and from Damaturu to community is one of the constraint observed during the raining season distribution of inputs.</p> <p><b>WFP/FAO:</b> Rainy season distribution food/cash for inputs protections needs to be reviewed</p> <p><b>Common constrain:</b> targeting of eligible beneficiaries for support is a common constrain to partners. One of the colleagues informed the partners at Maiduguri level there is a task force working on common challenges.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- In Gujba/Gulani LGAs lack of GSM coverage has been also highlighted as communication problem.</li> </ul>
