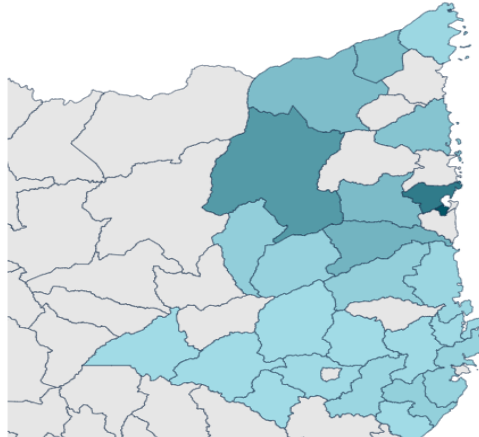
MAP: TOTAL OF BENEFICIARIES REACHED BY DISTRICT

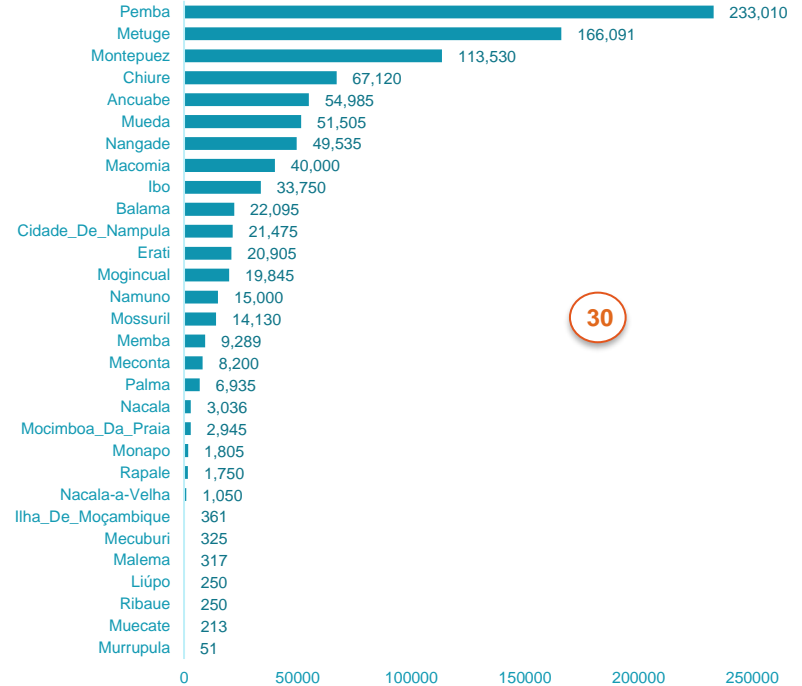

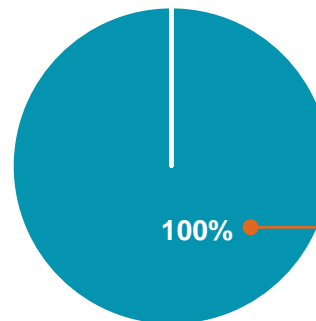

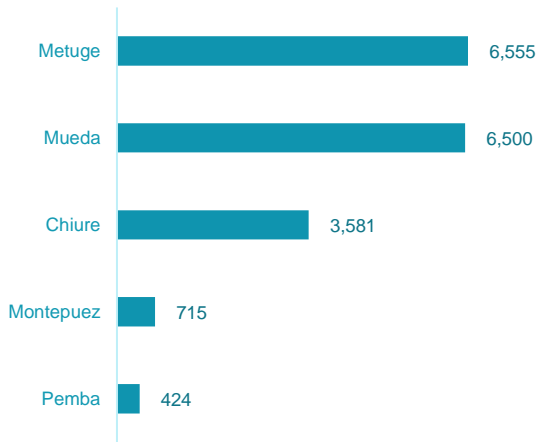

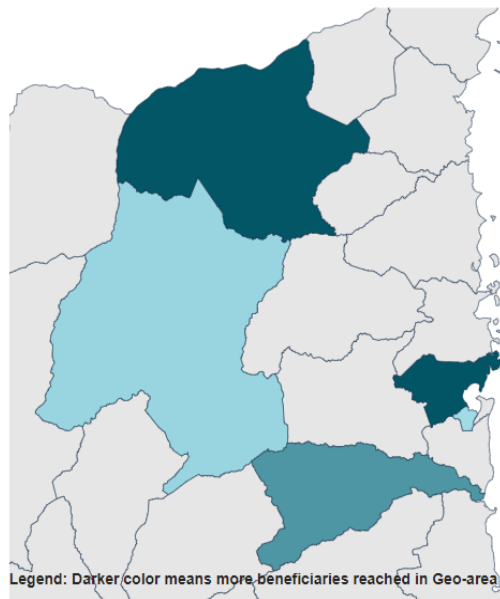
MAP: TOTAL OF BENEFICIARIES REACHED BY DISTRICT

Introduction

- In 2022, we decided to run a GAP Analysis based on the quantities of commodities or cash distributed for the areas under HRP assistance in Mozambique.
- The aim of this analysis is to determine whether the beneficiaries' minimum assistance requirements are met, or if more interventions are required.
- This tool is to be used for advocacy with the donors and coordination among humanitarian partners.
- This exercise enables a deeper analysis on the quality of the response, going further than the % of beneficiaries reached and focusing on their needs being met.
- The analysis is currently focused on SO1.

- **Assumptions – Based on country context:**
- **Steps:**
 - i. **First: Data Collection**
 - ii. **Second: Data Compilation/Cleaning**
 - iii. **Third: Calculating unique beneficiaries reached**
 - iv. **Fourth: Running the analysis**



Limitations

- The data needs to be cleaned several times with partners in some cases;
- The variability of the composition of the ration of FA or the amount of cash distributed;
- Regions with high levels of displacement can have high coverage ratio results since the HRP target was calculated earlier in the year and the context has significantly evolved since;
- Multipurpose cash activities are hard to calculate, a percentage based on the food basket can be applied to get an estimative number;
- Reports have to be received on a timely basis.;
- Indicative analysis : not focusing on calories intake of food basket distributed;

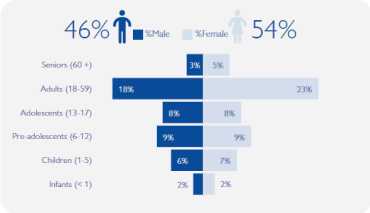
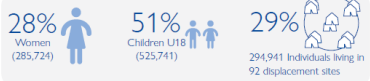
- MILITARY OPERATION TARGETS NON STATE ARMED GROUP (NSAG): Mozambican Army, Rwandan, and Southern African forces have been carrying out operations targeting NSAG bases in **Macomia** during the reporting period, reportedly clashing with militants near Chai and Litamanda villages. Additional operations also occurred around Chombaindo, near Nkoe. This military offensive is part of the ongoing Vulcan IV operation to destroy NSAG bases along the **Messalo River on the Macomia/Muidumbe district border.**
- The effort by security forces ultimately seeks to dislodge militants from the banks of the Messalo River, roughly from the Miangalewa area all the way to Xaxaxa in Northern Meluco and perhaps even further west. After militants were pushed out of the Katupa Forest in eastern Macomia District in mid-2022, a large cell, regrouped west of the National 380 road and has since made this area along the Macomia/Muidumbe border the most significant base of a NSAG in Cabo Delgado. The initial/ongoing military operation will likely focus on clearing areas immediately west of the N380 road near Chai and Miangalewa and then further expand to clearing villages in southern Muidumbe, including several villages recently attacked and overrun south of Namacande.

- On 4th January, the Islamic State released a statement claiming that during 2022 its militants in Mozambique had conducted a total of 156 attacks across Cabo Delgado, Niassa and Nampula provinces in which more than 331 people were wounded and killed. The IS group published an infographic detailing attacks carried out in 22 countries across the world, with high activity numbers being reported in Nigeria, Syria, Iraq, Afghanistan, DR Congo and Mozambique. During the reporting period, the IS in Mozambique released its first ever public video montage - showcasing militants in training exercises and cells pledging their allegiance to the new global leader (Dec 2022).
- In the start of 2023, military/security forces in Cabo Delgado have attempted to consolidate efforts against NSAGs with activity mainly centered within Macomia and Muidumbe districts - due to sustained militant attacks and movement in the area throughout the second half of 2022. It is likely that the international coalition of military forces will double down on counter-insurgent operations during the near term, seeking to significantly disrupt NSAG activities and strategy in the currently occupied areas (see analysis). However, NSAG militants retain the capacity and intent to launch attacks against civilians. As militants cells flee security operations, heightened threats of attacks are notable further west into Montepuez and Mueda District, and/or south into Meluco and potentially Ancuabe.

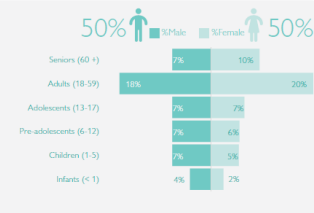
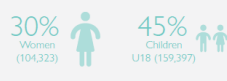

IDPs - Internally Displaced Persons



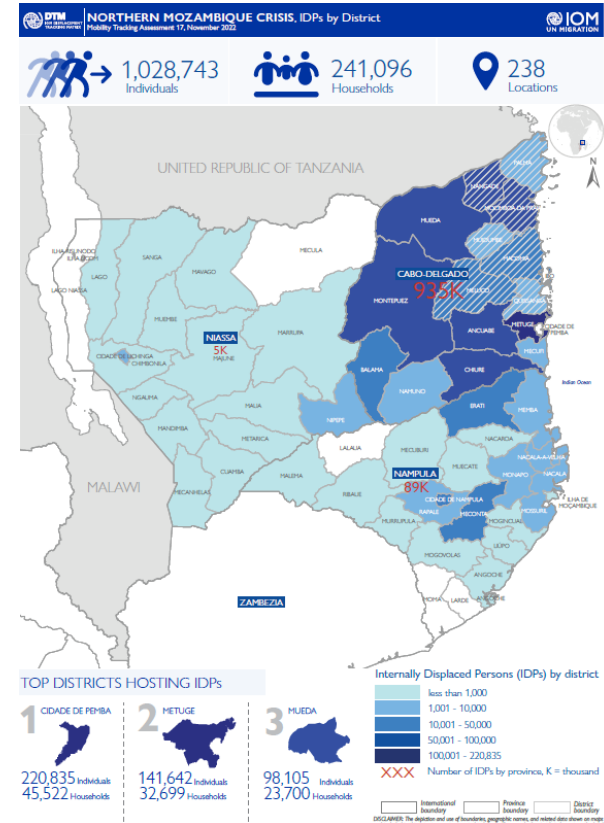
Returnees



- IOM DTM mapped a total of **1,028,743 IDPs** and **352,437 returnees*** in 238 locations across Northern Mozambique as of November 2022. Despite the observed presence of returns in newly accessible locations, there remains a significant number of new displacements between June to November 2022 triggered by sporadic attacks in Ancuabe, Balama, Chiure, Erati Meluco, Namuno and Nangade.
- IOM observed an **overall net increase from 946,508 IDPs in Round 16 (June 2022) to 1,028,743 IDPs in Round 17 (November 2022)**. The difference between Round 16 and Round 17 figures can be attributed to: additional locations assessed, continued sporadic attacks and verification and registration activities.



- As of November 2022, an estimated **935,130 IDPs were identified in Cabo Delgado**, an estimated 89,016 IDPs identified in Nampula and 4,597 IDPs identified in Niassa. 70% are IDPs in host communities. Half of the total IDPs present at the time of assessment are located across the districts of Pemba (220,835), Metuge (141,642), Nangade (74,869), Mocimboa da Praia (73,349) and Ancuabe (59,480).
- It was observed an **overall net increase in Cabo Delgado** from 869,603 IDPs in Round 16 (June 2022) to 935,130 IDP's in Round 17 (November 2022). – **Increase of 65,527 IDP (+/-8%)**.
- DTM observed an **overall net increase of 146% from 143,333 returnees in Round 16 (June 2022) to 352,437 returnees in Round 17 (November 2022)**. Overall results from the Mobility Tracking Assessments show that the top districts of previous displacement amongst returnees are Muidumbe district, Mocimboa da Praia, Mueda, Palma and Quissanga districts.
- In Cabo Delgado, **food items are now overall the highest need**, followed by access to documents (birth registration and National Identification Cards) and shelter.



UPDATES - FOOD ASSISTANCE & LIVELIHOODS


- Cycle of January has started with a bit of delays for WFP - full rations assistance. WFP is facing a pipeline break in February 2023
- WFP assistance:
 - Distributions ongoing in Ancuabe, Chiure, Ibo, Macomia, Metuge, Montepuez, Namuno and Pemba
 - Some delays in CBT assistance
 - Target: 980,000 people
- Arco Iris that had reported pipeline break and stopped assistance in most of sites is ready to resume in some sites
- FH and Plan food assistance projects in Metuge and Ancuabe have terminated.
- Good Neighbours (Japanese organization) expected to start assistance in March (Metuge)
- ❖ WFP – V&R from VBT to start in the month of February

MAIN AGRICULTURAL SEASON

- FSC finalized the analysis of Online AWG matrix for this main agricultural campaign. Meeting held on the 5th December with cluster partners involved in the campaign;
- FSC shared the assistance plans with SPAE/DPAP and INGD;
- Some partners are late in some districts where rains already started (Namuno and Balama);
- Ongoing meetings with SDAE in several districts.

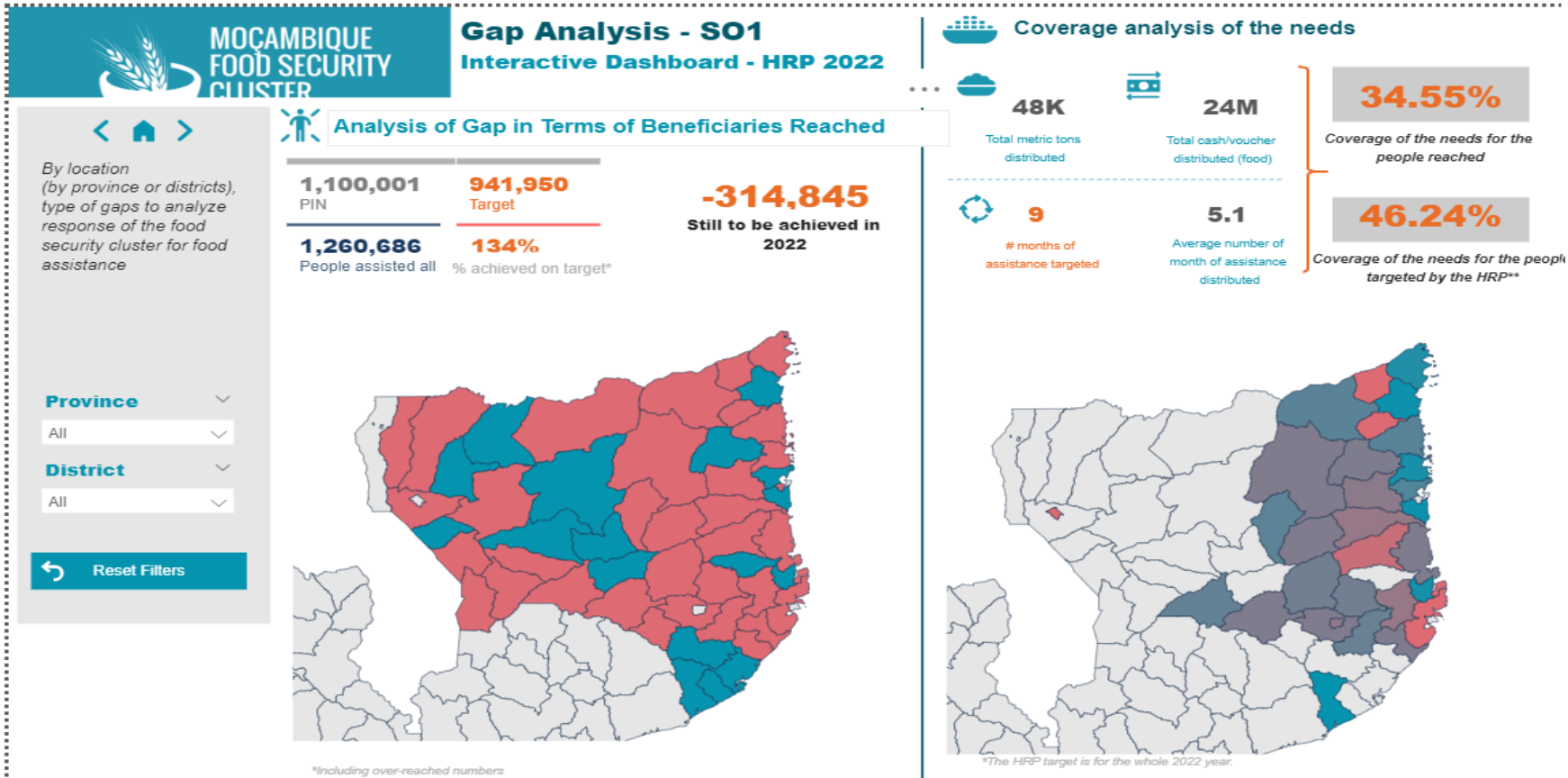

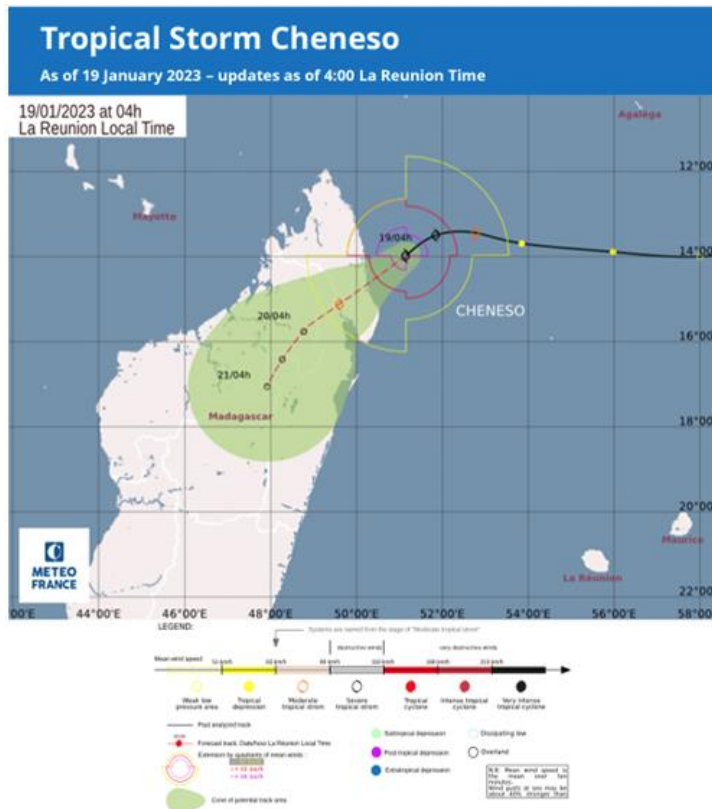

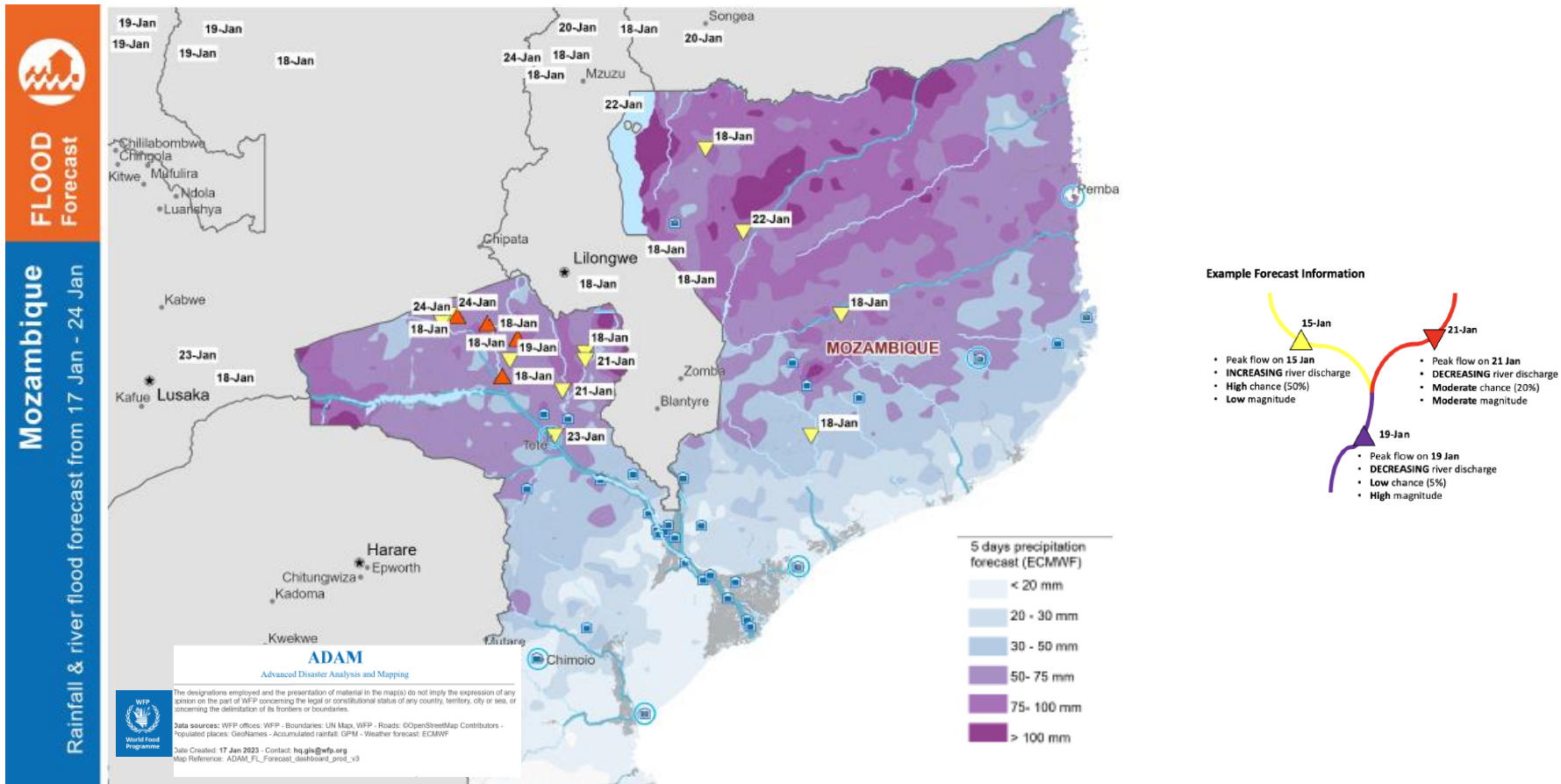

Monitoria de Ciclones Tropicais

A Perturbação Tropical que se formou a leste de Madagáscar, no dia 14 de Janeiro, evoluiu para Depressão Tropical. As projecções actuais indicam que este sistema meteorológico poderá evoluir nas próximas horas e atingir o estágio de Tempestade Tropical moderada, encostando-se a costa leste de Madagáscar no dia 19 de Janeiro de 2023 com ocorrência de ventos fortes, chuvas fortes e trovoadas severas, contudo ainda é prematuro se afirmar que vai afectar o canal de Moçambique e a parte continental do nosso país.

O INAM, IP continua a monitorar esse fenómeno e, mais uma vez, apela a população para que continue acompanhar a informação meteorológica e os avisos difundidos pelas autoridades nacionais competentes.





Emergency Preparedness and Response Plan (ERP)



- It is based on last year ICCG preparedness plan and examples from other countries
- It includes previously agreed points related to coordination, IM, needs assessments, etc.
- It stresses the need of a regular engagement with INAM and INGD for risk monitoring
- It focuses on two main predictable hazards: floods and cyclones
- It considers the agreed thresholds to trigger international humanitarian response (besides GoM ad-hoc requests for support)
- Floods: 200mm of rain in 24h (>150,000 people affected)
- Cyclones: category 3 with 120km/h winds (>400,000 people affected)
- It takes into account the National Contingency Plan for the 2022/2023 rainy season

- Revision of the ERP by FSC
- Sharing information from INAM and INGD about the forecast
- Stocks/pipeline mapping
- Confirmation of presence of FSC partners at provincial and district level
- Roster of FSC basic-trained staff on EFSA (emergency food security assessment)
- Inputs on the revision of MIRA's questionnaire
- Revision of the protection FSC checklist for a Rapid onset emergency and dissemination amongst partners
- Revision of Food assistance SOPs for rapid onset emergencies (April 2022)

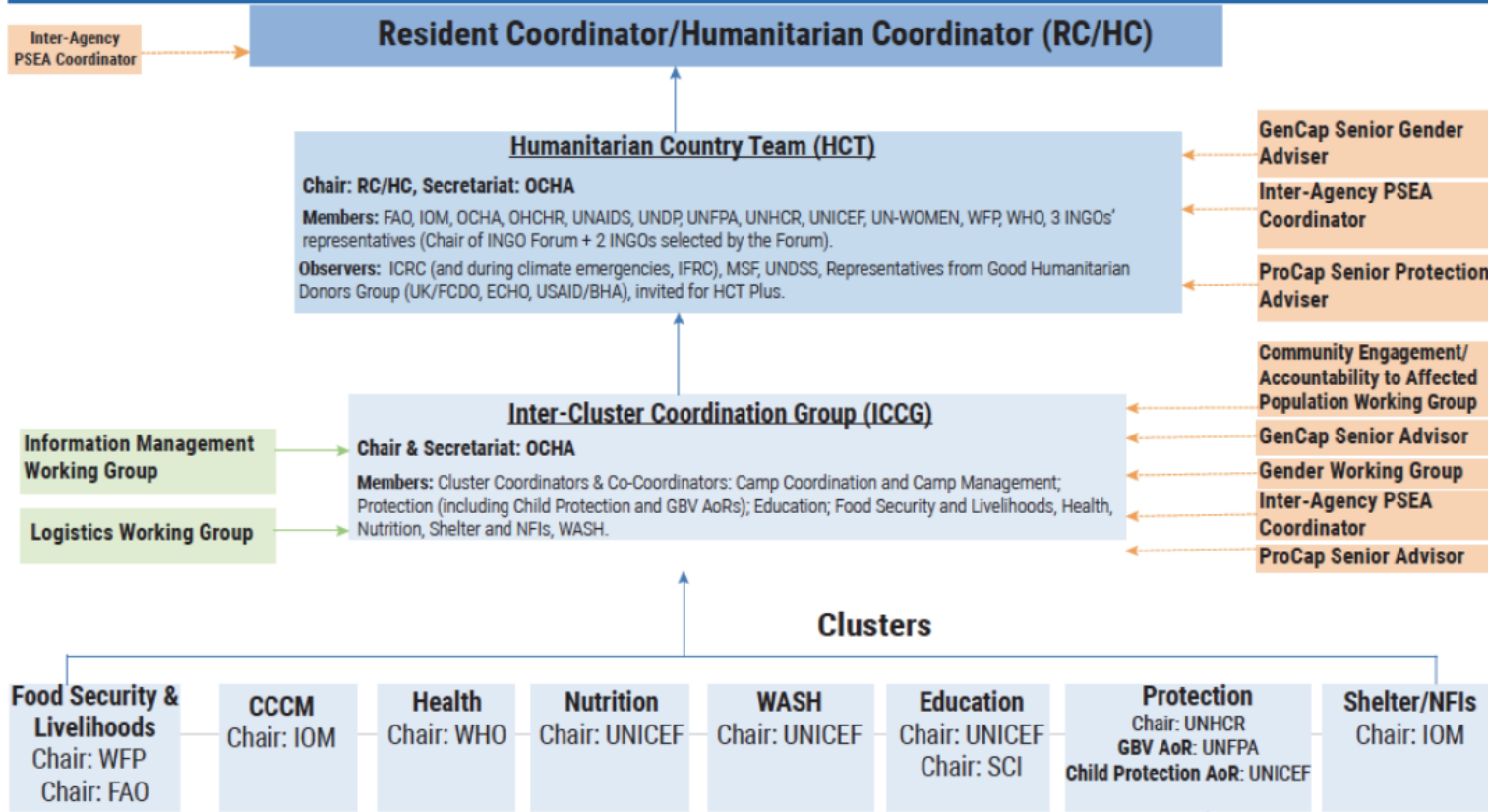
