# Introduction

- In 2022, we decided to run a GAP Analysis based on the quantities of commodities or cash distributed for the areas under HRP assistance in Mozambique (Cabo Delgado, Niassa and Nampula).
- The aim of this analysis is to determine whether the beneficiaries' minimum assistance requirements are met, or if more interventions are required.
- This tool is to be used for advocacy with the donors and coordination among humanitarian partners.
- This exercise enables a deeper analysis on the quality of the response, going further than the % of beneficiaries reached and focusing on their needs being met.
- The analysis is currently focused on SO1. This year we are planning to have the same analysis for SO2.

- **Assumptions – Based on country context:**
  - The assistance (In-kind) is based on rations covering 78% of the 2,100 kilocalories needed for a balanced diet for HH with an average of 5 members;
  - The CBT assistance in Voucher or Commodity Voucher is equivalent to 3,600 MZN (56.92 \$);
  - 9 months of assistance with full rations (6 months with full rations and 6 with half rations).

## First Step: Data Collection

- Collecting the 5Ws among all partners;
- Important indicators to collect that will be used for gap analysis:
  - Number of beneficiaries reached since January per activity and location;
  - Quantities distributed (kg/\$);
  - Number of months of distributions;

## Second Step: Data Compilation/Cleaning

- Compiling the monthly quantity of commodities and money distributed;
- Quarterly/monthly data quality check made at the data collection stage;

## Third Step: Calculating unique beneficiaries reached

- Based on the Admin level (Admin 2 - District) chosen we compiled the beneficiaries reached each month by Lead Organization. Here to avoid duplications and double counting we considered the highest number of unique beneficiaries reached in the month as the **MAX**.
- Making sure the numbers are coherent across the different reports (gFSC reporting, OCHA, Dashboards, etc.).



## Fourth Step: Running the analysis

- Once the compilation is finalised, results are weighted against the HRP targets and food assistance standard package (In-kind/CBT), resulting in a percentage (%) of needs covered.
- This result can be disaggregated by admin level, depending on the basis of the HRP targeting methodology and/or data quality (Admin2).

To calculate those % we:

- i. Calculate the amount of quantities to be distributed by modality (in-kind and cash) based on the number of beneficiaries targeted and on the number of beneficiaries actually reached since the start of the year.
- ii. Calculate the quantities distributed by modality since the start of the year.
- iii. Calculate the coverage ratio of the quantities distributed (2) against the distribution's target package (1) based on the expected scenario :  $A - \text{beneficiaries reached} ; B - \text{Beneficiaries targeted}$ .
- iv. Sum the % of the two modalities to get the indicative percentage of needs coverage (quantities).

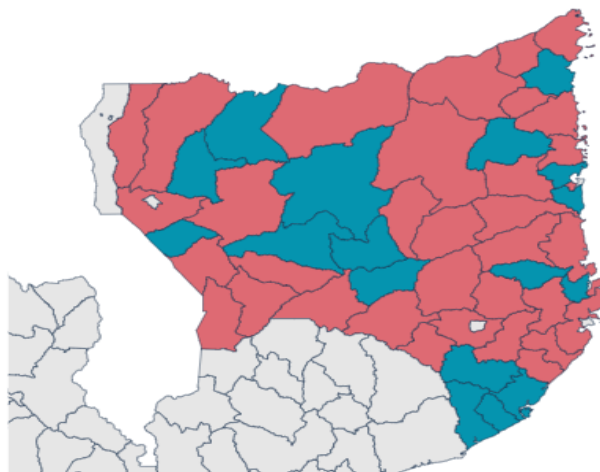

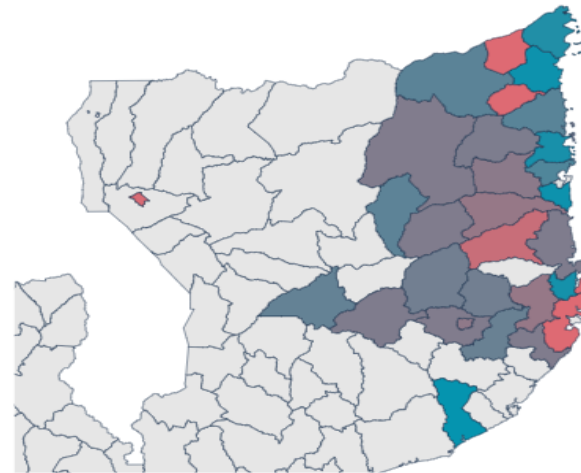

# Limitations

- The data needs to be cleaned several times with partners in some cases;
- The variability of the composition of the ration of FA or the amount of cash distributed;
- Regions with high levels of displacement can have high coverage ratio results since the HRP target was calculated earlier in the year and the context has significantly evolved since;
- Multipurpose cash activities are hard to calculate, a percentage based on the food basket can be applied to get an estimative number;
- Reports have to be received on a timely basis.;
- Indicative analysis : not focusing on calories intake of food basket distributed;

## **The gap analysis is:**

- Adding value to advocacy efforts among donors and partners;
- Supporting coordination by providing in-depth information on gaps;
- Powerful tool for evidence-based decisions for food assistance interventions;

## **Next Steps:**

- Including Kcal data to deepen the analysis;
- Adapting the analysis to types of beneficiaries (Household size, IDPs/Refugees needs, etc.) ;
- Adapting the analysis to improve coordination and planning between Rapid Response Mechanisms (RRM) and emergency partners;
- Develop a gap analysis for SO2;
- Supporting the IPC analysis (response indicators);

## SECURITY UPDATES

- The recent clash in Nairoto, (Montepuez) between NSAG (Non State Armed Group) militants and local security forces occurred several days after sources reported that a large NSAG cell travelled through villages in the Nairoto area. The recent manoeuvring by militants was likely part of a reconnaissance attempt to identify the presence of security forces in the wider countryside of northern Montepuez district.
- NSAG cells remain active in central Cabo Delgado, and have demonstrated their intent and capacity to carry out attacks against civilians- also including in Namoro village along the Montepuez-Mueda road. Direct attacks against security forces is likely part of a strategy by NSAGs in effort to deter any progression of military operations in central Cabo Delgado. Notable is that NSAGs have carried out at least three confirmed roadside ambushes within 4 weeks, mainly along the N380 road around Muidumbe, targeting both civilians and security officers.

## SECURITY UPDATES

- ARMED CLASHES: a NSAG attacked a position of the Border Guard (Guarda Fronteiriça) in Nairoto, Montepuez district at around around midnight 13 February. Militants clashed with security forces, with reports indicting that at least five people were killed, two police vehicles set on fire, and looting of the town occurred.
- ROADSIDE AMBUSH: On 13 February, NSAG members ambushed a security vehicle traveling along the N381 road between Maua and Pedreira, on the border of Meluco and Ancuabe districts. Information on the extent of damage or casualties remains unconfirmed.

## SECURITY OUTLOOK

- Attacks against security forces during the reporting period are expected to prompt an attempted expansion of current military operations targeting NSAGs in the central Cabo Delgado districts.
- Key roads in the province are likely to report additional security patrols and escorts for civilians in the wake of upsurge of roadside ambushes. The district border area between Montepuez and Meluco has reportedly endured increased NSAG movement/activity in the past two weeks; demonstrating a sustained militant presence, and what is considered an elevated threat of continued attacks in the area within the near to medium term.
- The impact from NSAG roadside ambushes and reported presence on strategic routes (along R698 and N380 roadways) may begin to interfere with general road and supply chain activity connecting northern and southern halves of the province-forcing WFP logistics to explore and enact alternative means/routes of transport for the delivery of commodities.



## DISPLACEMENT ALERT:

- Entire village of Namoro moved to the District Command of Montepuez on (05.02.2023), where in turn were relocated to the centre of Nicuapa. Displacements are still active and also to Chimoio and Mararange resettlement sites.
- FSC mission to Montepuez to monitor situation.
- ForAfrika, 1<sup>st</sup> organization to assist with fortified rice and WFP has been assisting since then with the following numbers:

**New Arrival**

**Key highlights:** Since 04 January 2023, District Planning and Infrastructure Service (SDPI), UNHCR and CCCM partner AVSI Foundation and the in Montepuez have registered 541 families approx. 2705 individuals new forcibly displaced persons from the Namoro village, in the district of Namoro, following reports of violent attacks in these villages by Non-State Armed Groups (NSAGs). Families are still arriving on foot from Namoro, lacking the critical transport support. As numbers are expected to grow by end of the day, the IDPs families have found safety in the site of Nacaca (Nicuapa neighbourhood) and are temporarily located at the Church and at the community centre waiting for NFI and food assistance. Most of the new arrivals are women and children with urgent needs, including protection, shelter, food, NFIs and hygiene kits. In coordination with SDPI, UNHCR partner AVSI is supporting the identification of empty shelters in Nacaca, Nacaca Massingao and other sites, where people can be safely accommodated. SDPI and UNHCR/CCCM partner AVSI are coordinating with all actors involved to ensure that relocation and access to services is provided in a dignified way.

**Note:** Population figures changed based on the actual registration of families. Figures provided as of 07.02.2023

**CCCM**  
SDPI, jointly with UNHCR and CCCM Partner AVSI, is in the process of identifying empty shelters in Nacaca to be allocated to the new arrivals. Coordination and registration is also going on. Site Management Committees (SMCs) and community mobilizers are supporting with key messaging on service and referrals, as required. Coordination with all actors is ensured to mobilize multi-sector response. New arrivals are consulted on shelter options applying beneficiaries centred approach.

**Protection**  
Majority of the newly displaced are women and children with immediate need for protection. There is an urgent need to identify groups at risk including children, women, elderly, PWD persons with specific needs and ensure rapid mitigation and response measures. CCCM and Protection teams are supporting with the basic registration of families with an Age, Gender breakdown to facilitate assistance including identifying persons with specific needs for the prioritized shelter allocation. UNHCR partner CIAMM is working to provide awareness and access to lifesaving services for OGV survivors, as well as emergency psychosocial support for persons with MHPPSS needs.

**Food Security**  
Food is an urgent need for the newly displaced families. The significant increase in population entails an urgent need to provide emergency food ration to meet the growing needs. NGO For Afrika has provided 700 kg of enriched rice to 494 families (50 boxes of 14kg each). SDPI and AVSI are coordinating with other agencies to request emergency food support. CCCM cluster would reach out to food cluster to further assist with mobilization of assistance.

**Shelter**  
Shelters for the newly displaced are urgently required. SDPI, in coordination with UNHCR and its CCCM partner AVSI is currently assessing existing empty shelters to be allocated to the new arrivals, based on initial registration and vulnerability criteria. To meet all the needs, SDPI is coordinating the relocation to other centres in Montepuez, where empty shelters are available. Distribution of tarpaulins and plastic sheets is underway to ensure people can be moved to the new shelters amid the raining season. Distribution of Core Relief Items, including blankets, kitchen sets, buckets, solar lamps are being mobilized and UNHCR is mobilizing resources for distribution.

**Health**  
In Nacaca, there is one health facility available in the site, which can provide immediate care and support. At the moment, the existing facilities are responding to the current needs. There is a need to reinforce health prevention messages and ensure access to basic health care when needed. CCCM cluster is reaching out to Health cluster for mobilization of support.

**WASH**  
Access to water is available in Nacaca, with six water points. Access to water in other sites in Montepuez, including Massingao and Chimoio, remain a serious gap. As families have not been relocated yet, emergency latrines and hygiene kits are one of the main needs identified. UNHCR partner AVSI is supporting with dissemination of awareness raising messages.

**Response Mobilization:** There is an urgent need to mobilize partners and resources to provide immediate support to new arrivals. Main needs are protection, food, shelter, Core Relief Items, clothes, access to hygiene and sanitation services. UNHCR and AVSI/CCCM teams are closely collaborating with SDPI, Montepuez and the District Administration, deploying protection and CCCM team to support identification of new arrival and allocation of existing shelters. AVSI/CCCM teams are also engaged at district level coordination with partners present to mobilize multi-sector response. UNHCR is mobilizing CRIs support whereas identification of shelter is ongoing by its teams.

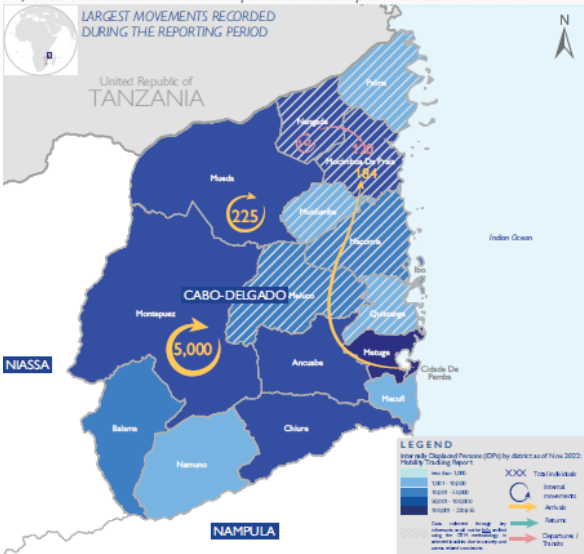
## DISPLACEMENT TRACKING MATRIX - Mozambique EMERGENCY TRACKING TOOL (ETT) - Cabo Delgado

DTM Emergency Tracking Tool (ETT) is deployed to track and provide up-to-date information on sudden displacement and other population movements



ETT Report: No. 199/08 - 14 February

During the reporting period (08 to 14 February 2023), a total of 30 movements were recorded - 8 arrivals (5,549 individuals), 18 departures (658 individuals), and 4 returns (41 individuals). The largest arrival movements were recorded in Montepuez (5,000 individuals), Mueda (225 individuals) and Mocimboa da Praia (184 individuals). The largest departure movements were recorded in Nangade (344 individuals), and Balama (99 individuals). The largest return movement was observed within Quissanga (17 individuals). Of the total population, 85 per cent of mobile groups were displaced for the first time, 8 per cent for a second time and 7 per cent were displaced at least three times.

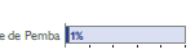
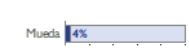

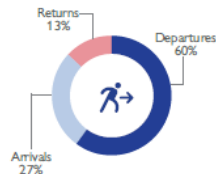
**PEOPLE ON THE MOVE:** Indicative individual movements triggered by conflicts/attacks, fear of attacks, search of livelihoods, access to humanitarian assistance, natural disaster, intended returns, relocation or family reunification.

**TYPES OF MOVEMENT FLOWS:** To capture the dynamic characteristics of migration, the ETT categorizes 4 types of movement flows: arrivals, departures and returns. Each category is dependent on the recorded triggers of movement, duration of movement as well as movement intentions.

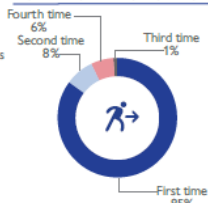
- ARRIVALS:** Individuals arriving at the point of assessment with intentions to stay more than 1 month in current location
- TRANSITS:** Individuals arriving at the point of assessment, with an intention to spend less than one month at current location.
- DEPARTURES:** Individuals leaving the point of assessment to another location.
- RETURNS:** Individuals returning to their locality of origin from previous place of displacement. Please note, the returnee category, for the purpose of DTM data collection, is restricted to individuals who returned to the location/Bairro of their individual residence, or an adjacent area based on a free decision. Mozambique displaced persons having returned to districts of origin without having reached their locality of origin are self-displaced and as such not counted in the returnee category.



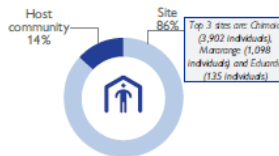
### TYPE OF MOVEMENTS



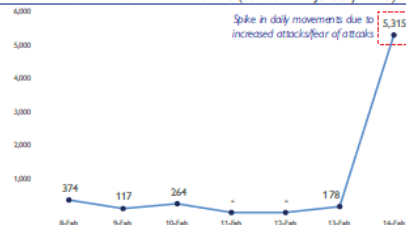
### NUMBER OF TIMES DISPLACED



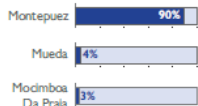
### WHERE ARE THEY LIVING

### MAIN ARRIVAL DISTRICTS

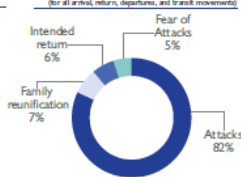


### MEANS OF DISPLACEMENT

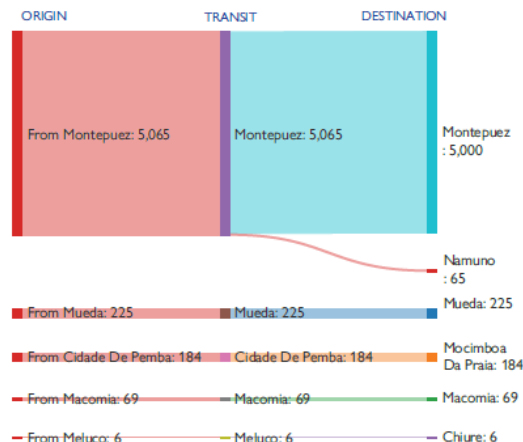

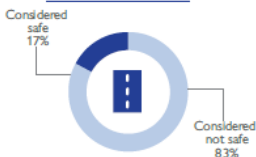

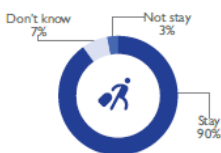
### DISPLACEMENT FLOWS BY DISTRICTS (ARRIVALS)

## UPDATES - FOOD ASSISTANCE & LIVELIHOODS

- Cycle of January - full rations assistance. WFP is facing a pipeline break in February 2023
- WFP assistance:
  - Distributions completed in Ancuabe, Balama, Chiure, Ibo, Macomia, Metuge, Montepuez, Namuno and Pemba
  - Some delays in CBT assistance – Chiure
  - Assistance finalized in Mocimboa da Praia to 4.000HH and Palma to 2.400HH
  - Target: 980,000 people
- Arco Iris that had reported a funding gap is ready to resume in some sites
- Good Neighbours (Japanese organization) expected to start assistance in April (Metuge)
- Preparation of next cycle of food assistance for WFP and partners. Quissanga to be targeted and also the previous districts.
- ❖ WFP – V&R from VBT to start in the month of February

- Monitoring: ongoing meetings with SDAEs in several districts;
- Compilation of effective assistance provided in this main agricultural season - ongoing.
- Livelihoods activities to be implemented – IGA and others.
- **Rapid Need Assessment Report, District of Quissanga, Community of 19 Outubro – RRM SI/ACF/NRC**
  - 575 IDP and 16 returnees’ families present. Food security and livelihoods: There is no food, part of the population resorts to wild foods as a daily food. The agricultural land has been recently cultivated and has not had time to produce. The seeds used are not diversified. Direct observations show signs that the population seems to be weakened and some of the people reported not having enough strength or energy due to lack of food to build latrines or improve shelters.

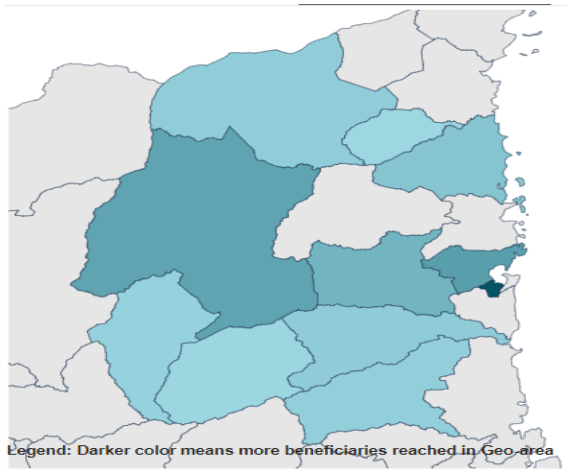
## MAP: TOTAL OF BENEFICIARIES REACHED BY DISTRICT

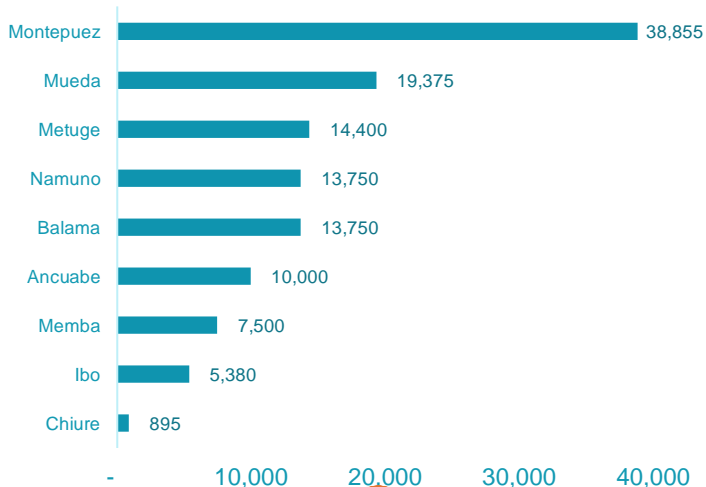
