Security updates

- NSAG activity has been minimal in December, with considerably lower attacks and movement levels reported as compared to the past two months
- Militant attacks are concentrated around Muidumbe and northern Macomia indicating a high likelihood of the presence of a significant number of NSAG fighters in the central region. Recent attacks and displacements confirmed this likelihood (Macomia and Matemo).
- The downturn of activities in recent weeks remains attributable to access challenges and hampered mobility due to the ongoing rainy season.
- N380 road between Macomia and Mocimboa districts is expected to be a key point for security operations in nearby forested areas particularly around Chai and in Miangalewa towns where NSAGs have been active in recent months.
- While NSAGs in Cabo Delgado have been weakened during 2023 as compared to 2022 or 2021, militants remain active across a small number of central districts. Need to follow up SAMMIM forces withdrawal in 2024.

Humanitarian updates: (1) Recent displacement and movements

Muidumbe 14.12.2023

Displacement of 211 people/42 households in Miengueleva, Muidumbe district following a Non-State Armed Group attack on 09 December. According to the report, 172 people/34 households among them 73 children and 52 women fled towards Muidumbe sede, while 39 individuals/14 households including eight children and 16 women arrived in Namacande.

JRP consortium (WFP, IOM, UNICEF) assisted the displaced families with shelter/NFI, food, and hygiene kits).

Macomia 28.12.2023

Between 26-28 December, attacks, and fear of attacks by Non-State Armed Groups in Macomia district (Mucojo and Pagane) triggered 434 individual displacements.

Assessment teams record 33 families/121 individuals displaced to Nanga A Host Community (Macomia) and 82 families/313 individuals displaced to Matemo Island (Ibo). Approximately 68 families/255 Individuals arriving on Matemo Island intend to proceed to Quirimbas Island within the next weeks.

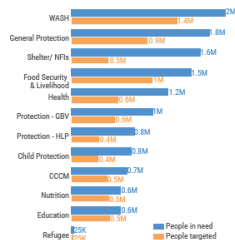

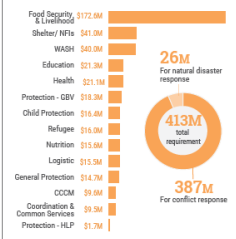

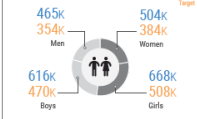
PEOPLE IN NEED AND TARGETED BY CLUSTER



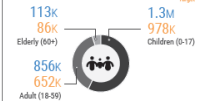
FINANCIAL REQUIREMENTS BY CLUSTER

Humanitarian updates: (2) HRP/ HNO 2024

- **Conflict response** US\$ 166,749,237 implemented by 14 partners, covering both humanitarian food assistance and livelihood support.

- **Natural Disasters response** US\$ 5,850,000, which is the unitary cost for a basic assistance of 1 week food assistance and a return kit to 96,500 people and livelihood support with seeds and tools for the 2nd season cereals and horticultures to 83,000 people

UPDATES – FOOD ASSISTANCE

WFP updates (November-December cycle):

- 749,680 beneficiaries (149,936 HHs) were assisted, representing 89% of the target.
- Distributions completed in 12 districts (Chiure, Ibo, Namuno, Nangade, Macomia, Montepuez, Pemba, Metuge, Quissanga, Palma, Mueda, Mocimboa da Praia and Muidumbe).
- In this cycle, emergency response was provided in Macomia for 365HHs and 212 HHs in Ibo, due to the latest attacks (new IDPs).
- No distribution in Ancuabe and Balama, due to not acceptance of VBT lists.

*** WFP to reduce food assistance for 2024, VBT based lists and geographical/seasonal targeting to be implemented in all districts to be assisted. Communication already shared with government and with Cooperating Partners.**

UPDATES – LIVELIHOODS

- In the upcoming weeks, the FSC coordinators will ask partners to report against the planned livelihood-support activities to analyze the trends of the assistance during the rainy season.
- Guideline Food Security response packages (food assistance, crop production, livestock, and fisheries) will be shared in February with the support of AWG, DPAP, and SPAE.
- AWG will schedule a meeting to discuss the seeds regulation in Mozambique (include process for certification of seeds)
- Quarterly meeting ICCG-INGD on overall achievements of humanitarian assistance in 2023 postponed in December and to be rescheduled
