5Ws: update –as of April 12th

UKRAINE FOOD SECURITY & LIVELIHOODS CLUSTER Strengthening Humanitarian Response

Cumulative Summary: Since the 24th February

- Individuals Reached: 6 million people (approx.) have been assisted through either completed or ongoing activities
- **Reporting to cluster**: A total of **35 organisations** have submitted their 5Ws to the Cluster.
- Locations: 25 Oblasts have been reported The highest reached figures were reported in Kharkivska (1.7M approx.), followed by Lvivska (1.2M approx.) and Mykolaivska (523k approx.)

Round Update (06 April – 12 April)

• **Reporting to cluster:** A total of 22 partners provided their updates to the Cluster. We had 5 new partners (report for the first time).




- Partner Presence and Reached (2 Pager): currently uploaded on website and circulated Friday COB (weekly)


