1. Operational overview: FSLC weekly achievements to date



5Ws: update –as of May 17th



Cumulative Summary: Since the 24th February

- Individuals Reached: 6 million people (approx.) have been assisted through either completed or ongoing
 activities
- Reporting to cluster: A total of 39 organisations have submitted their 5Ws to the Cluster.
- **Locations**: 24 Oblasts and Kyiv have been reported The highest reached figures were reported in Kharkivska (1.6m approx.), followed by Poltavska (507k approx.), Kyiv city (459 approx.), Zaporizka (411 approx), Dnipropetrovska (403k approx.).
- **Livelihood** Activities: 3 Organisations have reported ongoing/completed distribution of Emergency Agricultural Inputs. In total 15 Oblasts covered, with a Total Reach of: 87k
- Top 3 Activities: [approx.] Hot meals: 834k / In Kind Food Distribution: 2.58m / Emergency Food Kits: 2.52m

Round Update (11 May– 17 May)

• Reporting to cluster: A total of 14 partners provided their updates to the Cluster; Including 1 new partner.
