	<ul> <li>GBV Mainstreaming Training Update:         <ul> <li>The chair talked about the GBV mainstreaming training that was organized with a goal of strengthening the operational capacity of Food Security Cluster partners in the area of GBV mainstreaming for food security programming. It took place in Buea on 18th and 19th August 2021 with the participation of 20 people belonging to National NGO, International NGO, United Nations or the Government. A pre and post assessment showed an overall 12% improvement of the participant's understanding of GBV mainstreaming.</li> <li>The training for NW supposed to hold 8 and 9 September however is being rescheduled due to some technical/logistical issues, new date will be communicated with participants.</li> <li>Remind partners of the 3 Cluster objectives</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	FSC to share meeting presentation
	<ul> <li>FSC Strategy HPC 2022         <ul> <li>In preparation of the upcoming HPC 2022 process, the FSC is currently drafting a strategy document which will highlight vision and priorities of the cluster.</li> <li>The strategy document will also highlight priority areas for possible targeting by partners in 2022.</li> </ul> </li> <li>The full meeting presentation can be found <u>here</u></li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>Partners Updates         <ul> <li>WFP NW</li> <li>CBT Covid Response: 24,800 beneficiaries that is 96% of the initial target. Another targeting is ongoing in urban and peri urban areas especially in Mezam, Momo, Ngo-Ketunjia and</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	



	<ul> <li>Bui divisions. The assistance will be given to beneficiaries through direct cash.</li> <li>The targeting exercise is completed. A new list of beneficiaries and site has been done.</li> <li>WFP is equally reflecting on using a rotational approach in GFD (General Food Distribution) to reach out to the over 400,000 vulnerable persons profiled during the recent targeting. Only 170,000 of these persons are being assisted by WFP as of now. The rotational approach will allow WFP to reach out to all the vulnerable persons profiled. FSC to advice on this approach</li> <li>The FSC flag out the possibility of duplication in some communities with the Mezam Division. Following discussions with the partners concern (CRS and NRC), we realize that different partners were covering different quarters in this communities. The communities involved are divided into different sections</li> <li>(challenges) Security challenges and blockage of major access to some divisions made WFP unable to reach some beneficiaries.</li> </ul>	
• <u>IRC</u>	<ul> <li>Food assistance through Voucher Programming in Meme and Ndian divisions</li> <li>Second round of voucher distribution in Ndian division</li> <li>Reached 150 HH (772 beneficiaries) assisted in Bekora and Kombe Balundo communities</li> <li>Activities in Meme Division on hold because of security reasons (challenges accessing communities)</li> <li>Network challenges in Ndian forcing to do door to door mobilization</li> </ul>	
• <u>SHUMAS</u>	<ul> <li>Food Distribution in Bui and Donga Mentung Division especially in Jakiri, Kumbo, Ndu, Misaje and Nkambe</li> <li>Construction of 100 Hen houses in 04 communities (Dumbo, Sabongida, Bebe Jama and Dee (Misaje))</li> <li>Give livelihood assistance (distribution of hens, bags of feeds, manioc, drinkers, feeders, seeds for vegetable for market gardening) to women with minor age children</li> <li>Following up with beneficiaries of livelihoods where they were given sheep and market gardening seeds in Mbefru and Menchum</li> </ul>	
• <u>FAO</u>	<ul> <li>Project support intensification in market gardening running in peri urban area of Douala and Buea</li> <li>Monitoring of 22 farmers field schools</li> <li>Updating implementing partners list in both North West and South West regions</li> </ul>

	•	<ul> <li>In the North West, NRC completed training of 375 beneficiaries in Tubah. Second round of food distribution through e-Voucher for 310 HH in Bamenda III. NRC also assisted 240 HH to acquire arable land for agriculture in Bamenda III, 50 beneficiaries of Vocational training in North West being received cash for midday rations</li> <li>In the South West, NRC completed targeting for food assistance in Limbe I (120 HH), in Kumba I (300 HH) and 255 beneficiaries for agriculture 70 beneficiaries for livestock in Modeka</li> </ul>
	•	<ul> <li>DRC Buea</li> <li>Community registration in Fako (800 HH) specifically in Tiko and West Coast</li> <li>New grant running in Fako and Meme divisions. Specific locations have not yet been specified.</li> <li>This grant targets 1,600 HH and the registration will start the 8th of September 2021.</li> <li>First distribution through Voucher system should begin by the end of September</li> <li>Support of 250HH on livelihood support in form of IGA and agricultural assistance</li> </ul>
	•	<ul> <li>CRS (not in attendance but sent updates)</li> <li>CRS conducted second round of its ACER II project food distribution in the month of August, 2021 to 16,558 individuals in 2,287 Households of Bafut, Santa, Bamenda I, II, III and Batibo of Mezam and Momo divisions respectively.</li> <li>The only challenge has been the access to some project communities in Batibo due to the restriction and closure of road by the NSAG. This meant participant in those locations were not able to receive food distribution support in August.</li> </ul>
5	<ul> <li>AOB</li> <li>As the FSC continues to improve on mini coordination efforts to avoid duplication, members were informed that; <ul> <li>WFP has been conducting targeting exercise to update its beneficiary and target areas.</li> <li>WFP has also been working with cluster and NRC and CRS through the minicoordination group in NW to ensure duplication is being avoided in some areas around Bamenda I, Bamenda II and Sata sub-divisions.</li> <li>The cluster will continue to monitor possible duplication through the 5Ws submission and coordinate with the concerned partners.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
