Points of discussion:

The meeting started at 11:00 am with a round of introduction and the meeting was chaired by Francesco Slaviero, FSS Coordinator, that presented the analysis and mapping on CFV implementation and identified gaps.

1. Analysis of Complementary Food Voucher
 - Currently OXFAM, ICCO and World Vision are implementing CFV in the CAMP 3, 4, 4 EXT, 13, 14, 15 & 16
 - Relief International has completed the CFV implementation in March 2019
 - OXFAM will phase out in camp 19 in June 2019 and Camp 4, 4 EXT in August 2019.
 - ICCO will phase out Camp 14 (May), Camps 15 and 16 (June)
 - World Vision will phase out September 2019
 - World Vision targeting is Pregnant and Lactating Woman
 - Around 18,000 HHs are receiving CFV within this Camp 14, 15 and 16
 - There are price variations across the food items as OXFAM and ICCO negotiate price in a monthly basis where WVI negotiate 6-month basis. Seasonal fresh food's price also depends on availability.
2. Discussion and way forward
 - WFP will share the revised E- Voucher roll out plan and FSS will update the MAP.
 - Beneficiary mainly buy protein item using the reselling price of commodity in kind. Its important to make sure the beneficiaries access good quality protein item with chipper price to decrees the resell of in – Kind Commodity.
 - Harmonizing the CFV food basket may restrict individual organization of its ability to respond.
 - FSS will finalize the strategic paper on CFV and will share within the group.
 - Beneficiaries redeem their vouchers once – Its important to build the trust to the beneficiaries they can redeem the vouchers in the whole period of month rather then spending all at once.
