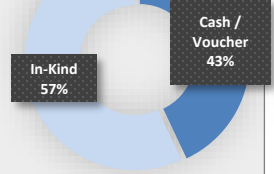

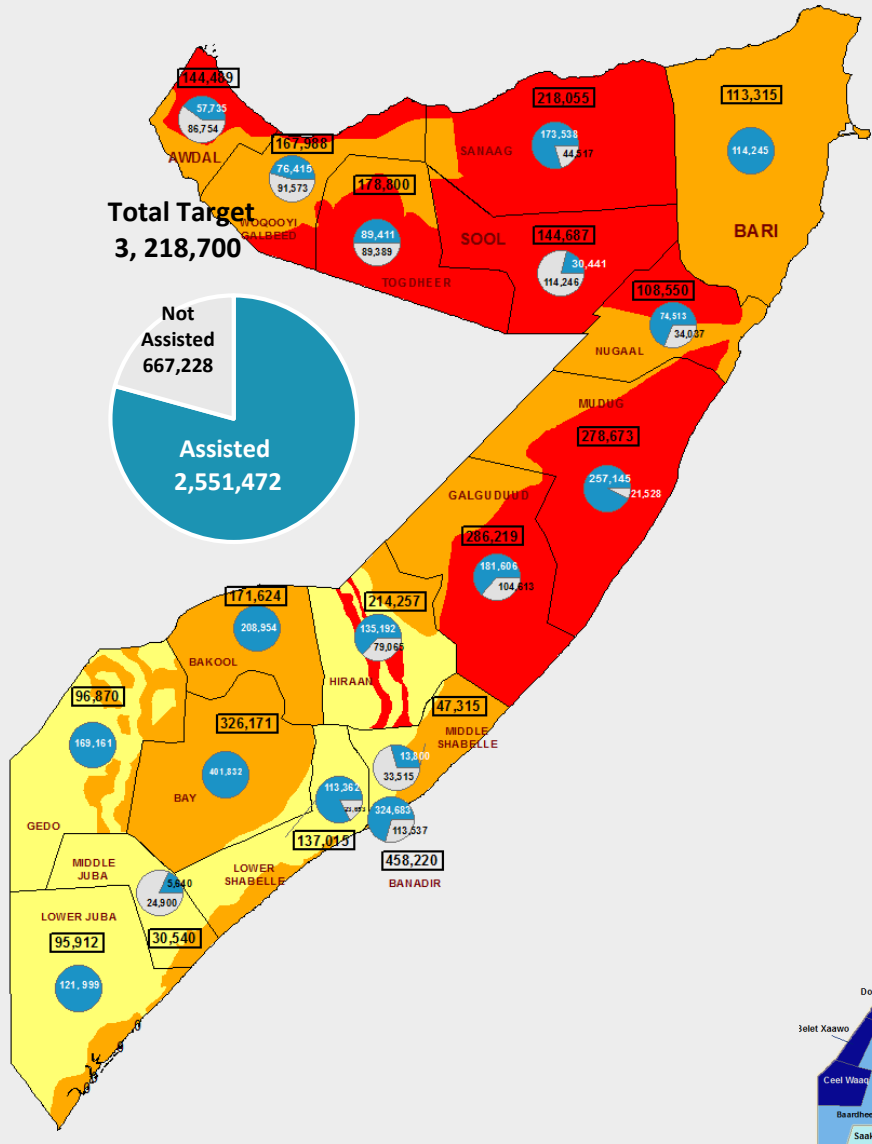
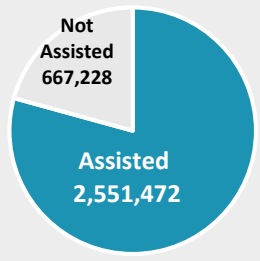

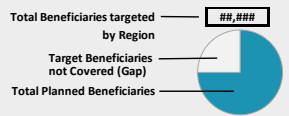
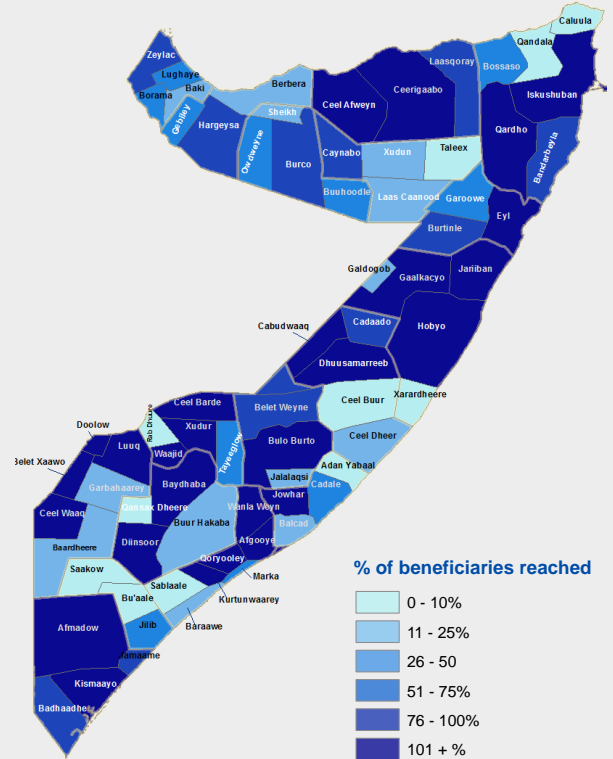

Strategic Objective 1 Update

The Improved Access to Food and Safety Net (IASN) has continued to be the focus of the partners. The partners have collectively assisted 2,551,472 people out of 3.2 targeted in December with various types of IASN assistance (accounting 79 percent of the target). The response in December overall have reduced by 117,512 beneficiaries (4 percent) as compared to last month.

The IASN response in most of the regions in Somalia either comparable with last month or some level of reduction was reported. The level of reduction in Middle Shebelle, Sool and Togdheer regions in particular is significant and of concern to cluster given the level of response in these regions were below 50% of the target. On the contrary, Bakool, Lower Juba, Lower Shebelle, Middle Juba, were some of the exceptional regions increment of 18-55% of IASN were reported. Overall, the decline of reporting partners and associated response level is concern of to the cluster particularly at this critical time where food insecurity outlook is considered as unfavourable.

In-kind assistance (food distributions of various type) constitutes approximately 57% of the total beneficiaries assisted in unconditional assistance in December while the remaining 43% of the beneficiaries received cash related assistance in the cash/cheque or voucher form. In terms of proportion unconditional assistance contributors include WFP (52%), FAO (13%) and others (35%) in December.
