3. AOBs (FAW/SSHF/cluster updates(Ntando):

FAW:

- Training is going on and it is very crucial for partners, donor and local authority
- 5 years strategic plan is in place and trainings at state level have been completed.
- 400 people were trained as of now
- Awareness raising is ongoing
- Plan to start radio program
- Posters, brochures have been developed and disseminated in communities.
- Partners will draft a operational plan after current planning meeting which is currently going on at Nile Fortune Hotel

SSHF

- 12 projects were selected (8 NGOs and 4 Ingos) They are covering 70,000 HHs in NBeG and Warrap
