FSS Updates

- Increase in COVID-19 cases – Host Community = 7166 and Refugee=504 confirmed cases and death 90 (80 Host and 10 Refugee) As of 21 April 2021 (IEDCR field Lab, Civil Surgeon Office & WHO sub office)
- Stricter lockdown extended up to 28 April 2021– [Here](#) GoB and RRRC instructions

- [August 2020 list revision of critical activities](#). Last year staff footprint already reduced to 20% of pre-COVID
- **Impact of lockdown:** last year, increase in assistance to HC

FSS Fire Updates

Fire Update (22 to 19 April 2021)



- From 22 March, 1,400,000 hot meals (lunch and dinner) have been distributed. The provision of hot meals has been discontinued since 12 April.
- Hot food kitchens were established in and around the camps to provide fresh cooked meals. Following the distribution of kitchen sets and LPG, households have redeemed their monthly April e-voucher assistance and been reintegrated into regular food assistance programming.
- Partners have distributed over 60,000 dry food snacks to fire affected households to complement main assistance.
- As many people lost essential documents in the fire, SCOPECARDS have been printed and distributed for all affected households in camps 9, 8E and 8W.

Fire Update (22 March to 19 April 2021)



- SCOPECARDS have been distributed at NFI distribution points together with kitchen kits, hygiene kits, facemasks, and dignity kits.
- Food security and child protection partners coordinated to provide high energy biscuits to over 60 temporary Child Friendly Spaces.
- Over 120 host community households affected by the fire received in-kind food and livelihoods support. WFP-MEAL and IOM-NPM conducted a joint needs assessment of host community households affected by the fire and presented [PRELIMINARY FINDINGS](#)

Fire response: Feedback

- **Challenges:**
 - Food Items or Cooked meals, Ensure quality of Meals or food, Timing during emergency, Vendor Agreement to big emergency response, implement as per contingency plan and data protection agreement
- **What Worked Well**
 - Capacity of WFP to Scale up partnership Partners
 - Quick start of Community Kitchen set up
 - Coordination with different Sector as like SMSD, WASH, Shelter & NFI etc
 - Developed linkages between different partners and stakeholder
 - Response of garbage or Waste management

- **What can be improved**
 - **Cooked Meals or Food Items** : Cooked Meals or Food items should be selected in favourable of affected Community or consulted with affected community to finalize the cooked meals or food item
 - Multipurpose community centre is needed to be used as a community kitchen during emergency
 - Disposal point of waste management is needed to be consideration
- **Cyclone/Monsoon Preparedness:**
 - Rapid Response, hot food kitchen capacity, partners capacity
 - Preparedness plan needed to be update
