IM & GFA Updates

ISCG Financial Analysis by Sectors

JRP 2022 – 70% funded

USD 881 million required – USD 615.2 million received

JRP 2023 (Cox's Bazar) – 31% funded

USD 808.5 million required – USD 552.7 million funding gap

2023 Activities were categorized as firewalled, critical priority, and priority


- Across the sectors, firewalled activities include: Food Assistance (pipeline break in May) and LPG (pipeline break in June), PHCs, GBV/Child Protection, Prevention and treatment of malnutrition, Hygiene items, Maintenance of safe drinking water and sanitation facilities
- Overall firewalled funding gap: 285.1M
- Critical Priority funding gap: 142.2M
- Priority Gap 125.4M



ISCG Financial Analysis by Sectors

Food Security Sector

- Food Assistance is firewalled activity (including GFA, Fresh Food Voucher, Rapid Food Assistance)
- Critical Priority: Crop Agricultural Support, Fisheries & Livestock Support, Conditional Cash,
 Cash for Work, and School Feeding
 - As complementary access to food and nutrition





ISCG Financial Analysis by Sectors

Way Forward

- Funds to go through sectors
- Need to look at impact of funding gaps
- More real time analysis
- Immediate focus on pipeline breaks: Food and LPG
- Build back better
- Keep partners updated

Security

- Worsening security conditions in camps
- Refugee volunteers being targeted
- UNDSS resources for partners interim measures (target audience UN staff)

Security

Interim Measures by UNDSS

- In pairs while on foot missions
- Maintain radio sets
- Field missions leader to conduct daily headcount at start and end of mission day.
- Maintain coordination with your driver and remain aware of where your vehicle is parked.
- In case of any incident, staff may take shelter at the APBn Posts/UN Facilities or leave the place immediately.
- Leave camps by 4:30pm

Data Sharing with GoB

Data Processing Agreement (DPA) between UNHCR and organizations on Skills Development and Volunteer programmes

For SD Programmes:

- (a) Full name,
- (b) Individual proGres registration number,
- (c) Address (camp level),
- (d) Skills training program/activity currently undertaken,
- (e) Start and end date of the training programme/activity, and,
- (f) Organisation offering the skills training.

For Volunteer Programmes:

- (a) Full name,
- (b) Individual proGres registration number for refugee volunteers,
- (c) Birth Registration card number or National ID Card number for host community volunteers as applicable,
- (d) Address (camp level for refugees and residential address for host community, as applicable),
- (e) Role of volunteer and category (unskilled, semi-skilled, or skilled),
- (f) ISCG sector under which the volunteer is engaged,
- (g) Start and end date of engagement, and,
- (h) Hiring Organisation.

Rationalization

Principles of Rationalization

- 1. Consult with Sectors/WGs before engaging in an activity
- 2. Ensure that implementing partners meet basic requirements
- 3. Adopt an integrated approach
- 4. Ensure predictability and continuity
- 5. Ensure the right partners respond in cases of emergencies
- 6. Ensure transparency of information

FSS tools and processes

- IM products presence mapping, dashboard etc.
- Minimum standards (2023: Homestead Gardening, Market Linkage, Rapid Food Distribution)
- NID Deduplication process for HC


Homestead Gardening

Ad-hoc meeting held on Thursday 30 March

- FSS to develop minimum inputs (seeds/seedling and non-seeds) and training package draft
- Volunteers from meeting to provide inputs on the Guidance Document (inputs, trainings, baseline guidance) – as minimum standards/guideline
- FSS to share table of species and planting tools as input package – requesting amount and cost for each item

Objective:

 Common approach and harmonization of activities based on minimum standards



Market Linkage Coordination Meeting

Taking place upcoming Thursday 6 April 10am-12pm

Purpose:

- Similar approach to homestead gardening meeting discussion based meeting to identify challenges and common approaches
- Review Aggregation Centre mapping (upcoming)
- Develop sectoral strategy for linking local farmers, local markets, and fresh food corners

FSS SoP for Emergency Rapid Food Distribution

Elements of SoP:

- Coordination mechanism step by step guidance on how food distribution should be conducted and who are the stakeholders to engage (Sector, Sector Focal, CiC)
- Responding agencies target full camps or camp blocks that are affected (to prevent using 1 distribution point)
- Standardize the menu and timing of distribution (quantity and quality minimum standards)
- Include archive of all past responding agencies and contacts (especially those outside of FSS network)
- Include the quarterly updated contingency stock by FSS partners

This SoP should be endorsed by RRRC to standardize the process for all CiCs and agencies.

General Food Assistance (GFA)



General Food Assistance Updates (April 2023)

Food assistance

- General Food Assistance (GFA) and Fresh Food Corner (FFC) support is continuing through 19 e-voucher outlets and 18 FFC in the camps respectively. Ration Cut: BNFs will receive \$10.00 = BDT 1040.00 in April 2023.
- Ramadan items are available in April as flexible items (Chickpeas, Laccasemai, Vermicelli, Mustard Oil, Flatten Rice, Puffed Rice) in all outlets.
- Outlet Operation will remain close during Eid holidays as per Govt. circular & Outlet operation calendar.
- In April 2023, a total 3620 Households were temporarily excluded who didn't redeem their voucher for the last 3 or more months consistently.
- All transaction will end by 27th April, one day for absentee follow-up support 29th and 28th & 30th April will be no-transaction day as usual.
