### DISCUSSION

#### 1. WELCOME TO THE MEETING

The Food Security Cluster Coordinator welcomed everyone to the meeting. The meeting started with a round of introduction.

#### 2. REVIEW & APPROVAL OF MINUTES (26.06.2022)

After reviewing the last meeting action points, the previous meeting minutes was endorsed by all.

#### 3. PRESENTATION OF KEY FINDINGS OF THE RAPID ASSESSMENT

FSC CC presented the key findings of the Rapid Food Security, Livelihood and market assessment. The FSC CC thanked the partners for supporting the assessment. The Food Consumption score process was briefed by Ms. Aklima and WFP VAM colleagues. The FSC analyst team will work on the full assessment report. FSC CC will clean the full data set and share the dataset with the FSC analyst team for detail analysis. The full report is expected to be circulated before the next monthly meeting.

#### 4. UPDATE ON FLASH FLOOD RESPONSE AND FSC 4W

FSC CC has presented the 4W reporting for the Flash Flood 2022 response prepared by the Needs Assessment Working Group (NAWG). Partners from BRAC, Save the children, FAO, Dhaka Ahsaniya mission, OXFAM, WFP, World Vision, Islamic Relief, United purpose have briefed about their food security response for the flood. It was discussed by the partners that the NAWG 4W report does not serve the purpose of the cluster completely. WFP briefed about the common database, common distribution point and common call center. It is agreed that the FSC will trigger a simple Food Security Cluster and produce a response map by mid-August 2022.

- FSC will circulate a simple 4W for food security response for the flash flood 2022
- FSC will produce monthly 4W for flood response.

## **5. TRAINING ORIENTATION PLAN OF THE FSC PARTNERS**

Partners informed that there is a tracking of who is doing the Standing Orders on Disaster (SOD) orientation where. In consultation with the Department of Disaster Management, FSC may develop a plan. For SPHERE training, Mr. Moyen from Islamic Relief Bangladesh will inform FSC in consultation with the SPHERE community Bangladesh. FSC CC informed that the Nutrition Cluster is going to organize a Emergency Response Planning workshop during 9-11 Aug 2022 at BRAC CDM Savar. FSC will co-facilitate the workshop. The training plan should be discussed during the next FSC Strategic Advisory Group (SAG) meeting.
