- 3. Quality and improvement of Field Office and CP service delivery

Transitions: General Food Distribution Plus (GFD+)

GFD+ is the classic WFP lifesaving humanitarian work that is looking towards promoting early recovery. Aiming to strengthen the capacity of beneficiaries to cope, recover from, and build resilience to recurrent shocks; promote livelihoods and income-generating activities

So, while we give our general food ration our sub unit, field teams and CPs engage communities in planning sessions to understand what additional resilience benefits they need and what can be provided, which are provided unconditionally.

GFD+ is now the normative form of WFP emergency food assistance in South Sudan. Value-added solutions may be offered to any GFD beneficiary, including IDPs, refugees, returnees, resident and host communities, and other crisis-affected people, at any location where GFD programmes are being conducted

Transitions: General Food Distribution Plus (GFD+)


Examples of GFD+ interventions are:
