

Somali: Agriculture Response Dashboard

[January - December, 2023]

The persistent droughts have diminished pastures for livestock in the region, and also jeopardizing food security due to crop failure. Livestock productivity continues to decline, harming nutrition, income, and the ability of impacted communities to manage. The prolonged drought severely devastated the region and caused livestock disease epidemics, resulting in a significant loss of animal resources - over 2 million livestock died because of the drought. Crop production prospects were relatively better compared to the previous three consecutive seasons. According to the SRS Agriculture and Natural Resource Bureau, the total area planted during the Gu' season is 640,417 hectares with an expected yield of 21.6 million quintals. In 2023, DRM-ATF targeted 1.09 million people who needed humanitarian assistance. As of December 2023, the DRM-ATF cluster partners reached 317,425 people through various interventions.

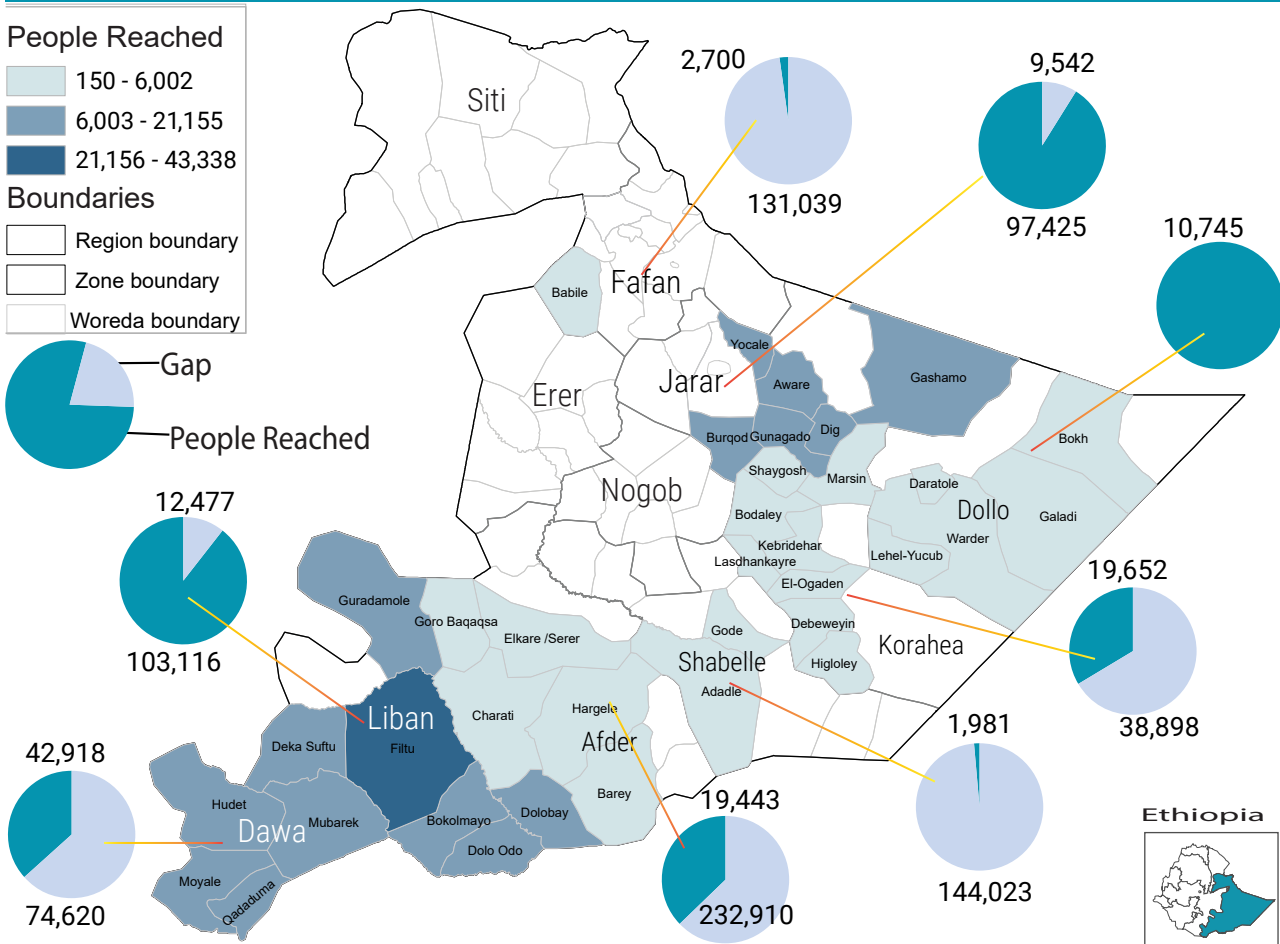

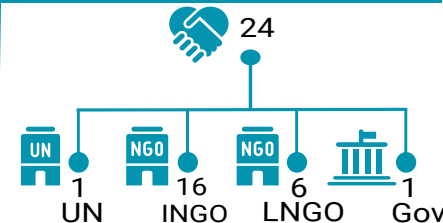
REGIONAL RESPONSE MAP



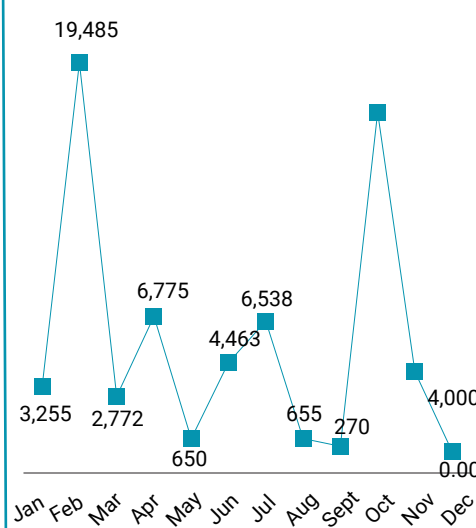

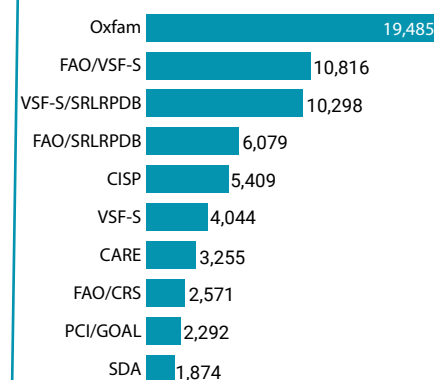
