



Mission Report

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Travel dates: Monday 25th March to Wednesday 27th March 2019

Mission purpose: Conduct training for FSL partners at the state sub-national cluster level on Information Management data requirements, 5W monthly reporting template 2019 as well as discuss support opportunities for the sub cluster in Bor.

Objectives:

- To meet FSL partners in Bor and join the WFP led FSL cluster meeting on Tuesday 19th March and present on the topics below: -
 - 5Ws matrix data requirements based on the 4 FSL cluster objectives in HRP 2019
 - Presentation on FSL subnational strategy
 - Integration strategy and the minimum package by FSL, nutrition, health and WASH clusters
- Document challenges/gaps in support that the sub national cluster may require from the national FSL cluster in Juba.
- Discuss with FAO/WFP field office on response to ICWG (Juba level) prioritised location and process of reporting on the same.
- Discuss with Bor programme officers on county level FSL sub national cluster coordination

Monday 25th March 2019

- Flight to Bor and pick up by WFP
- Arrival & orientation including security briefing;
- Conducted an initial meeting with WFP/FAO colleagues in Bor (challenges/opportunities for support from the national cluster office)

Tuesday 26th March 2019

- Attended the FSL cluster meeting in Bor (11 participants) and presented on the topics below:
 - a. 5Ws matrix data requirements based on the 4 FSL cluster objectives in HRP 2019
 - b. Presentation on FSL subnational strategy
 - c. Integration strategy and the minimum package by FSL, nutrition, health and WASH clusters
- Met WFP head of programme colleagues to discuss response to ICWG prioritised locations and other issues in Jonglei state.

Wednesday 27th March 2019

- De-brief session with the Sub-national cluster focal person
- Report writing & wrap up
- Return to Juba

Key points for action from the mission

- I. FAW response for 2019 – FAO planned mission to Bor to train and distribute pheromone traps and tablets (with app for FAW incidence reporting) on the first week of April. FAO Bor office to update on progress. There is need for FAO to lead in communication through radio and other media with messages on FAW surveillance and IPM.



- II. Partners expressed concerns over late distribution of crop and vegetable kits by FAO. They appealed to FAO to make the kits available before the rain season for easy (cheap) distribution by road.
- III. The Seeds multiplication guidelines by FAO needs to be shared with the Bor sub sub national cluster for onward circulation (FSL cluster both in Bor and Juba to follow with officers concerned in Bor.
- IV. Sub-national cluster coordination:
 - a. There is need for national cluster to visit county clusters to offer support especially Pibor, Uror, Akobo, Fangak
 - b. The state cluster in Bor focal point will reach out to the county level cluster coordination forum to get contact lists of partners present.
 - c. There is need to work with OCHA's deep field coordination mechanism to promote FSL cluster member's active participation at the county level – National and state FSL cluster coordinators to work on this.
- V. The Bor field office programme officer will share beneficiary figures in terms completed response and plans in location prioritised by ICWG by end of the March. Canal/pigi is now being coordinated by Malakal field office
- VI. Expected returns in Gadiang village in Duk county bordering Boma, Bieh, Ayod, Twic East and Bor South counties. The state government plans to resettle and unite all the 6 ethnic tribes of Greater Jonglei state (namely Jei, Kachipo, Murle, Anyuak, Nuer and Dinka) in this location. The **ICWG in Bor** will plan a multi-sectoral response to the possible service gaps and humanitarian needs that may arise once the communities settle in this area as it was abandoned during the conflict.
