
Ethiopia: National Response Dashboard


January - June 2023



The 2023 Kiremit season commenced in July and this farming season presents a good opportunity for households to produce adequate food to meet their households requirements until the next harvest in 2024. Limited agricultural inputs (crop seeds and fertilizer), army worm infestation (especially in Oromia, Amhara and Tigray regions) and limited funding if not addressed will likely result in a sub-optimal farming season. There is a shortage of improved locally adaptable seeds in most regions; the most affected crop is maize as with other cereals the farmers are using retained seed. About 1.39 million returnees in Amhara and about 600,000 returnees in Tigray are in need of urgent livelihood and agricultural support using the proposed returnee package.



Trend of People in need, Targeted & Financial Requirement(in millions*) 2018-2023.




Only 25% of the people targeted by the Agriculture Task Force have been covered by at least one type of assistance i.e. 2.3 out of 9.1 million*.


