Highlights of 2021 Rainy Season Programme

Targeting

- FAO Established presence in Nigeria since 1978 and NE Nigeria since 2016 in BAY States in response to the more than decade long insurgency
- Part of the humanitarian efforts – focusing of agricultural based livelihoods
- Coverage – 50% portfolio for Borno, 30% Yobe and 20% Adamawa
- Geographical targeting is based on CH analysis results – targeting LGAs in phases 3 +
- Local targeting with LGAs is determined by the local leadership at the LGA
- Targeting mainly the vulnerable and able among IDPs, returnees and host communities with secure access to land, willing to farm

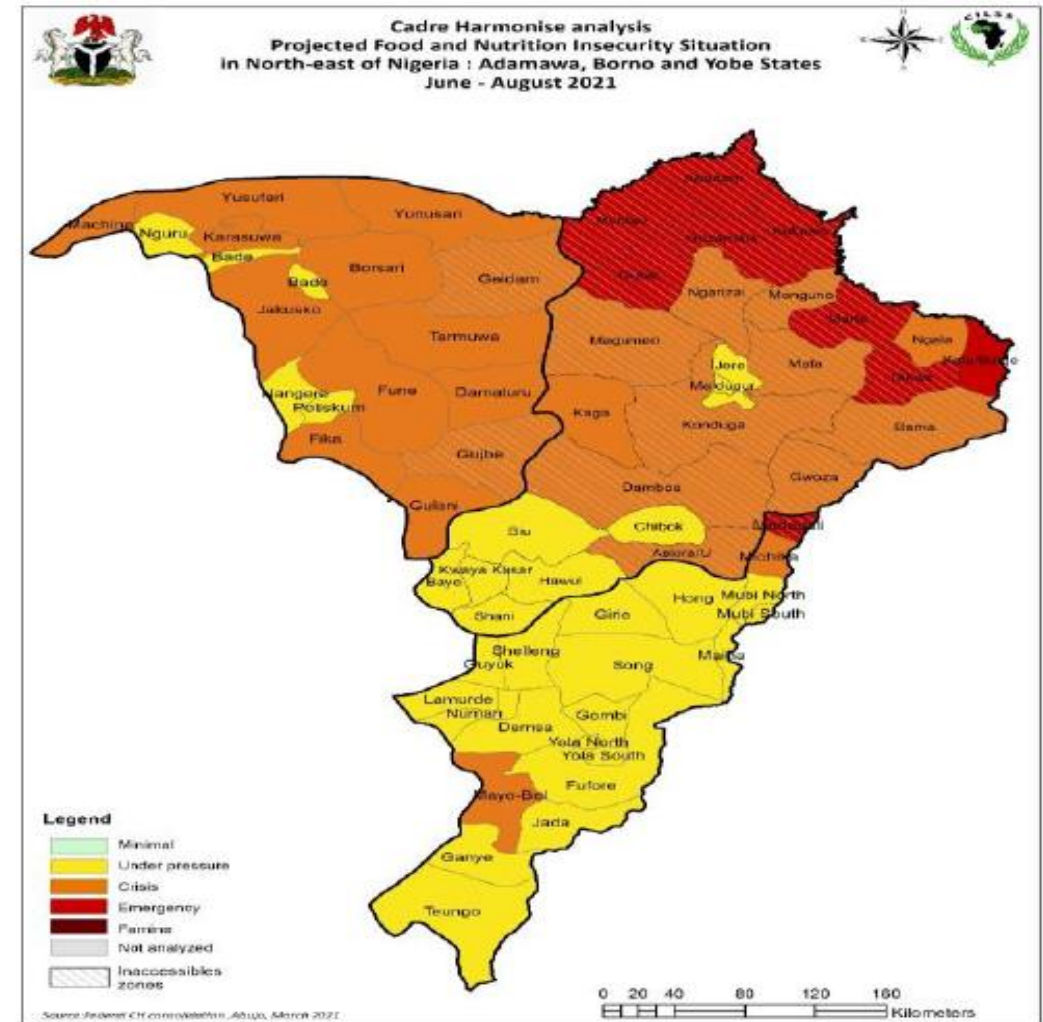

Geographical Coverage of 2021 Rainy Season Programme

The Rainy Season Programme covered 36 LGAs across Borno, Adamawa and Yobe States (BAY)

- Adamawa – **Nine (9) Local Government Areas** in Adamawa were reached under the rainy season programme.
- Borno – In **Borno sixteen (16)** were covered with the input distributions.
- A total of **11 LGAs** from Yobe State benefitted from the 2021 Rainy Season intervention.
- The input distribution support targeted vulnerable conflict-affected populations including: **Host Communities, Returnees and Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs).**

2021 Rainy Season Programme Achievements

Number of Beneficiaries Reached by State

- **15,480 HH were reached with seeds and fertilizer in Yobe State.**
 - **10,320 HH had been supported with farming inputs in Adamawa State.**
 - **A total of 40,000 HH had been reached with the necessary support to grow**
- their foods for enhanced food security in Borno State.**
- **In Summary, 65,800 HH across the BAY States were targeted and supported with needed farming inputs to produce food for:**
 - ❑ **increased household food and nutrition security**

Quantity of Seeds and Fertilizers Distributed During The 2021 Rainy Season Programme

Cereals:

1. Maize- 163,500 kg
2. Sorghum – 43,600 kg
3. Millet - 93,200 kg

Legumes:

1. Cowpea – 334,600 kg
2. Groundnut – 74,500 kg
3. Sesame – 11,580 kg

Vegetables:

1. Okra – 5,301 kg
2. Amaranth – 3,534 kg

Fertilizer

1. NPK (15:15:15) – 1,278.25 MT
 - Females only benefited vegetables
 - Both males and females benefited cereals, legumes and fertilizers



FAO-WFP Twin-Track Approach

- The Twin-track Approach (TTA) collaboration and complementarity of efforts between Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) and World Food Programme (WFP) continued during the season;
- The two agencies worked together and provided assistance that include food aid and farm input support;
- An estimated 7000 households were reached with both food items, seeds and fertilizer in different local government areas of Borno and Adamawa and Yobe states that engaged in rainy season food production;
- These supports were delivered with the assistance of locally sourced vendors and implementing partners

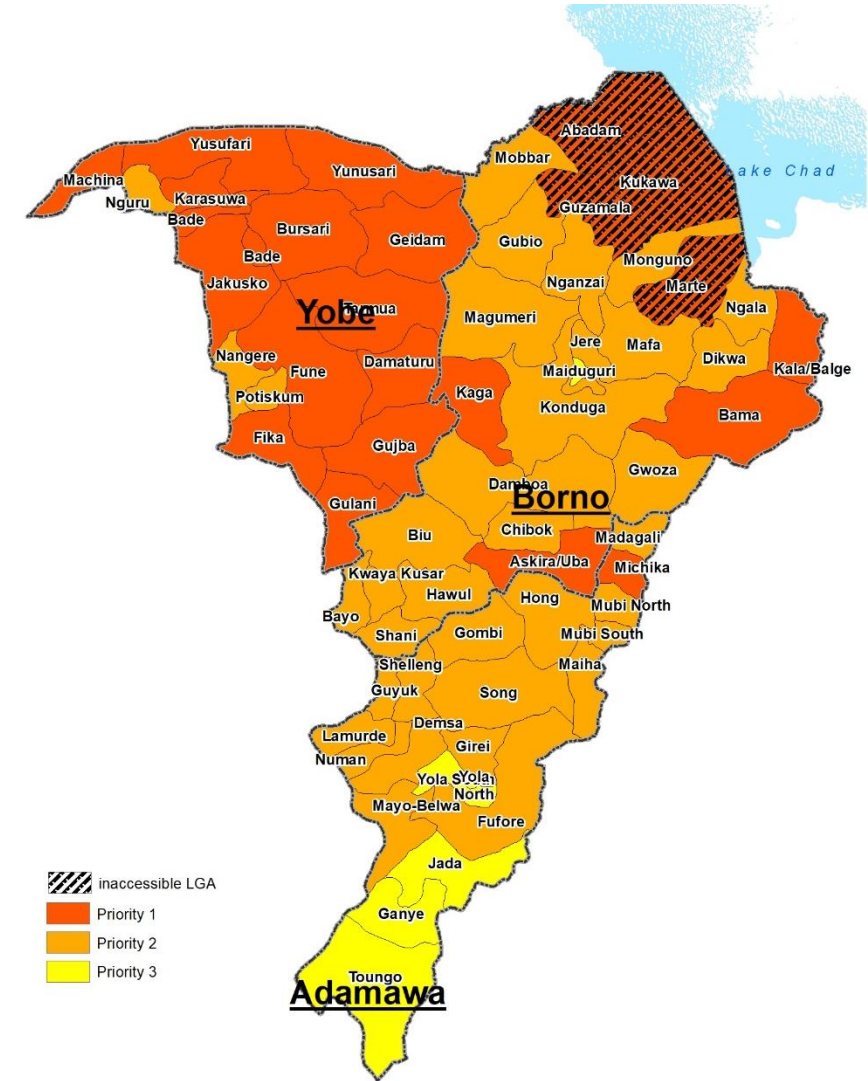




Highlights of Work plan for 2021/2022 Dry Season Programme

Targeting

- The area of intervention comprises 19 LGAs in Adamawa, Borno and Yobe states of Northeast Nigeria
- **Adamawa** – Demsa, Ganye, Furfore, Song, Mayo Belwa, Madagali.
- **Borno** – Bama, Dikwa, Jere, Konduga, Mobbar, Monguno, Ngala.
- **Yobe** – Bade, Fika, Geidam, Jakusko, Karasuwa, and Potiskum.
- These being LGAs in phase 3-5 of Cadre Harmonisé Analysis March 2021.
- The target population will be IDPs, returnees and Host communities, with strict adherence to criteria of vulnerability



Distribution of Households Targeted Per State

- The work plan targets 21700 households across the BAY states in north east Nigeria
- 4340 HH in 6 LGAs in Adamawa State
- 10850 HH in 7 LGAs in Borno
- 6510 HH in 6 LGAs in Yobe

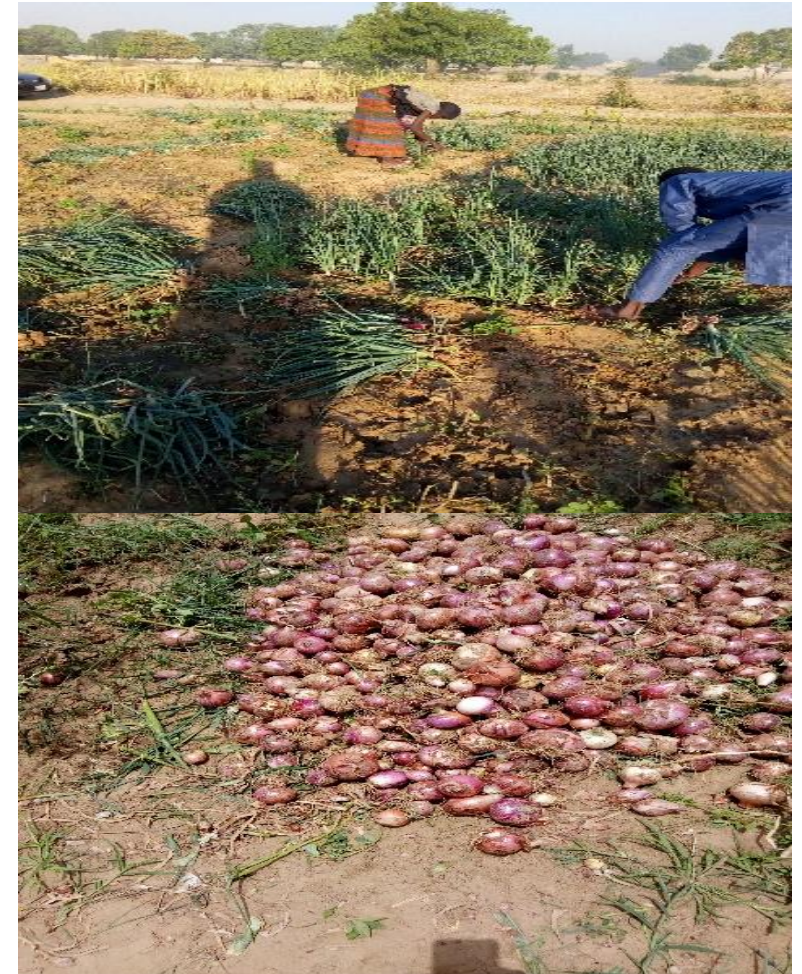
