Key discussion and action points

1. Partner updates: FAW incidence & monitoring reporting
 - a. FAO to allocate at least 25 of the trained FSL cluster members to take lead in FAW incidence reporting alongside the village facilitators in 25 FAW hotspots locations using the available pheromone traps and mobile devices. This will ensure consistency in reporting across the country.
 - b. Partners requested FAO to provide the list of trained village facilitators to make it easy for the partners contact them in their areas of operation for collaboration
2. Updates from FAO:
 - a. FAO shared the first FAW map developed using the new incidence reporting template/mobile app. It was suggested to FAO that the incidence map should be overlaid with severity data to give an overall picture of FAW infestation in SSD and share in the next FAW meeting.
 - b. FAO to provide the FSL cluster with the dataset received so far in order to get IM support to develop a 2-page update on FAW response
 - c. FAO to give an update on the communication & messaging methods being shared with farmers on FAW management
 - d. Impact assessment framework. FAO will give a progress update in the next meeting.
3. Updates from regional meeting held in Nairobi. FAO and CRS attended the regional meeting. The areas of focus in the meeting were: -
 - i. Joint actors planning
 - ii. Establishment of a centrally managed information management system/portal
 - iii. Use of appropriate technologies in pest management and control
 - iv. Coordination
 - v. Resource mobilization
