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1. Minutes of the previous meeting held on October 2nd were endorsed. The minutes are available on this website www.fscluster.org/rohingya_crisis
 2. Ranjan of FAO, gave a brief presentation on the World Food Day (WFD) and the event planned to take place at the District Commission's (DC) office in Cox's bazar and Country level office in Dhakar. The theme for 2018 WFD: “ *Our actions are our future. A Zero Hunger world by 2030 is possible* “

World Food Day, 16th October 2018

FAO marks world food day each year on 16 October the day on which the organization was .
World Food Day was first held on 16th October 1981.

World Food Day is a day of action dedicated to tackling global hunger

The theme of World Food Day 2018:

Our actions are our future. A #Zero Hunger world by 2030 is possible

Mandates and Objective of World Food Day:

To raise public awareness
Focus attention on food security
Disseminate information

Mobilize public opinion and funds in favour of the global fight against hunger





3. Interchurch Organisation for Development Cooperation (ICCO) gave a presentation on Post Distribution Monitoring of Food Distribution through paper voucher modality, a project being implemented in partnership with Gana Unnayan Kendra (GUK). *Presentation is attached*
4. Oxfam explained that they select their item for Fresh Food Voucher through community consultation. ICCO borrowed this approach. Handicap International (HI) and Relief International (RI) are planning to start implementing Fresh Food Voucher and will learn from ICCO experience.
5. World Food Program (WFP) disaster Risk Reduction (DRR) will organize a 2 days' workshop on 24th and 25th of October on Lesson learned.

LESSONS LEARNED FROM WFP's DRR & THE WAY FORWARD

- 1. LESSONS LEARNED**
To discuss insights and experiences from the previous (and on-going) DRR interventions. Specifically, what worked well, areas of improvement and what should be done differently next time.
- 2. DRR PROGRAMME PRIORITY AREAS**
 - Preventing new disaster risk;
 - Reducing existing disaster risk;
 - Managing residual risk;
 - Bringing new perspectives
- 3. RISKS AND ASSUMPTIONS**
To identify common risks and assumptions; and come up with risk management strategy.

6. The Joint Response Planning (JRP) for 2019 process has been initiated. By 1st of November, the Sectors are required to submit;
 - a. Updated needs analysis
 - b. Sector PIN and targets
 - c. Sector objectives and key activities
 - d. Sector Monitoring Framework
 - e. Indicative budget requirement for 2019
- It was agreed in the meeting to have a workshop on Tuesday 23rd of October to discuss this.
7. AOB
 - a. The partners raised concern regarding the priority list for FD7 approval that has been submitted by RRRC to NGO AB for approval. Though the FSS provided a comprehensive list of activities; the sector is not included in the document and only a list of few food items has been listed under Non-food relief assistance.



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- The sector Coordinator will raise this issue in the next Sector Coordinator's meeting to be included in agenda for discussion in the meeting with RRRC.
 - The NGOs should also pursue the issue through the NGO platform.
