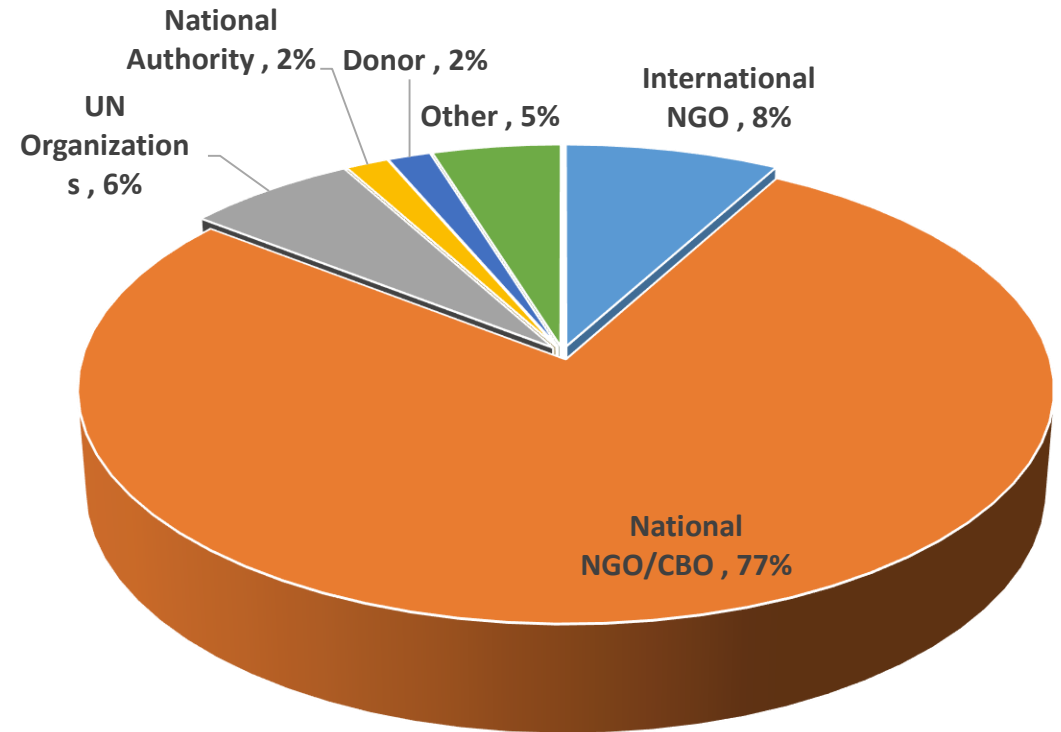

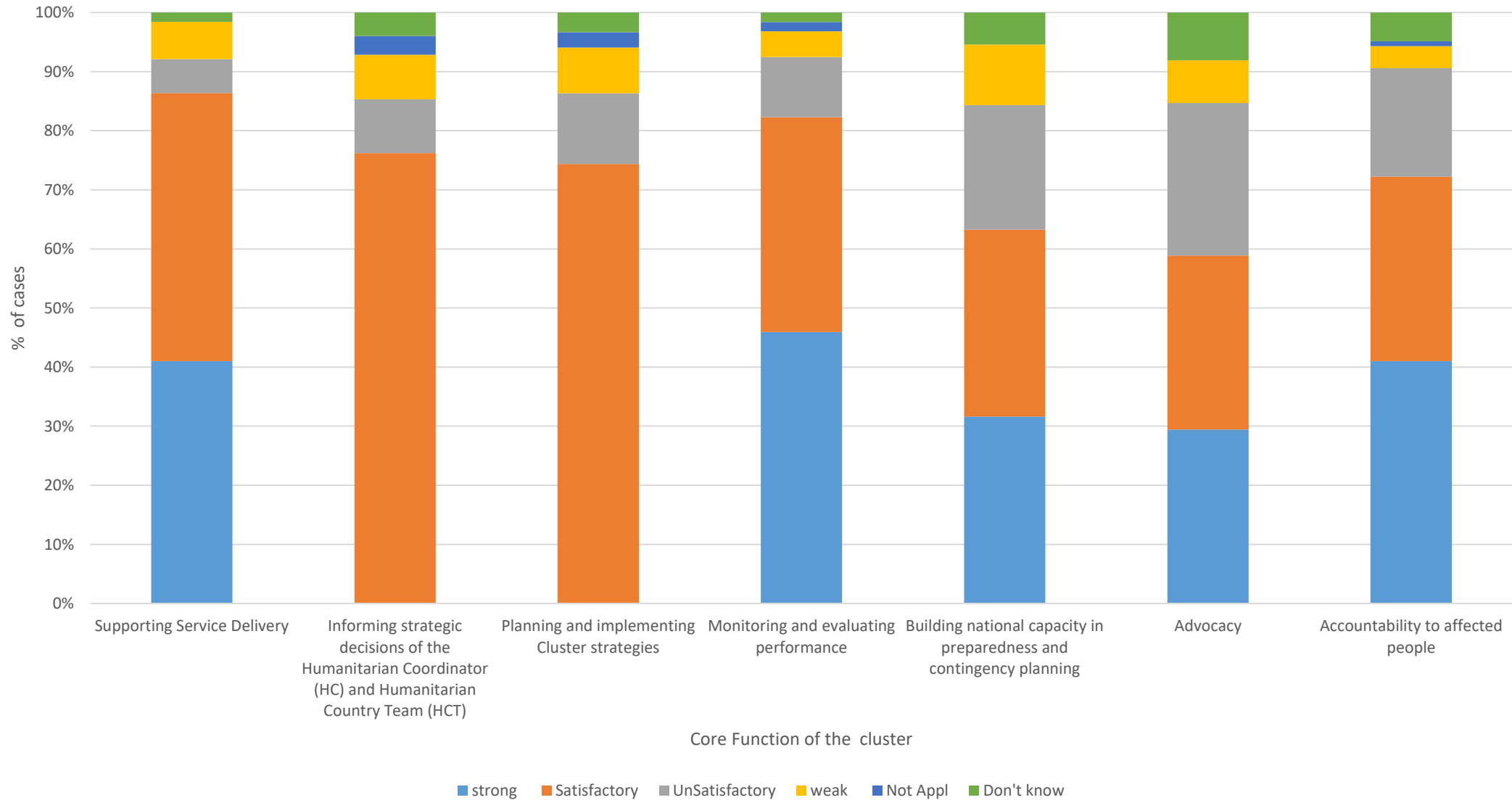
What is the CCPM?

- CCPM is a country-led self-assessment exercise where country Clusters assess their performance against **six core cluster functions** and on **accountability to affected populations**. The process enables all cluster partners and coordinators to identify **strengths** and **weaknesses** of performance and **agree actions towards improvement**.
- Somalia FSC launched the CCPM for 2019 in early 2020
- 62 organizations participated in the survey

Some of the suggestions for improvement



- Strengthening sub national coordination platform
- Improve participation of national organizations and the local authorities in decision making process (inclusivity)
- Improve service delivery in hard to reach area/ vulnerable communities
- Enhance partners resources mobilization knowledge / skills to increase their service delivery to affected communities including access to SHF
- Discussion (advocacy) how best the need of marginalized and minority communities addressed
- Improve on some aspects of cross cutting issue e.g. gender and disability (Program quality)
- Strengthening national capacity on disaster preparedness and contingency planning in collaboration with other actors
- Engage in monitoring project activities of partners ?
