# FSC Objective 1:

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- To improve immediate access to food:
  - Priority activities include both (a) unconditional (e.g. food assistance), and (b) conditional transfers e.g. cash/food-for-work for livelihood interventions that will support community recover their livelihood and meet their immediate needs. Activities include rehabilitation and establishment of community infrastructure such as water catchments, feeder roads and canals; skills training to increase household income; Soil and water conservation efforts mostly soil bunds that aim at pasture regeneration and rangeland rehabilitation and support productive capacities of communities through agricultural inputs and establishment of kitchen gardens and smallholder farms.
  - Approximately 3.1 million people facing severe levels of food insecurity (IPC 3 and above) will be supported under this objective.

## FSC Objective 2:



- To protect and restore livelihoods related to food and income sources.
  - Priority activities include provision of: (i) seasonally appropriate agricultural inputs (e.g. quality seed, farm tools, training, land preparation and irrigation support); (ii) emergency livestock assistance (e.g. supportive treatment, vaccination, feed, fodder production); (iii) livelihood strengthening and diversification (e.g. fishing, backyard poultry and vocational programmes); (v) improved post-harvest practices; and (vi) farmer, (agro)pastoral and coastal field schools.
  - The cumulative target for this objective is 0.9 million acutely food insecure people, including rural IDPs (IPC 3 and above).

# INTRODUCTION

- ▶ The livestock sector falls under the responsibility of the Federal Ministry of Livestock, Forestry and Range (FGS-MoLFR), with the engagement of the livestock ministries of the Federal Member States (FMSs);
- ▶ The shared vision by the FGS, FMSs and by the key stakeholders is for the livestock sector to make a major contribution by 2030 to:
  - (i) improve livelihoods through strengthened sector's climate resilience and increased incomes from livestock products;
  - (ii) enhance the nutrition and food security via an expanded supply of high-quality and hygienic animal proteins; and
  - iii) fuel stronger economic growth via more efficient, inclusive and environmentally sustainable livestock production and expanded value-adding processing.

## PURPOSE

The LWG aims at protecting the livestock asset of the pastoral and agro-pastoralist, promote lessons learning, and exchange on good livestock practices amongst the FSC membership

## ACCOUNTABILITY

The LWG is accountable to the Somalia Food Security Cluster (FSC)

# OBJECTIVES OF LWG

1. Provide a platform for cooperation among FGS-MoLFR, FMS MoL and the Somalia livestock sector stakeholders in delivery of timely livestock responses in Somalia;
2. Provide a mechanism for coordination of livestock sector stakeholders;
3. Provide technical guidance to stakeholders involved in livestock emergency and development work in the country;
4. Facilitate information exchange among livestock stakeholders including best practices based on field experiences.

# MEMBERSHIP

- ▶ Representatives of organisations and institutions directly implementing or involved in livestock emergency and development activities in Somalia
- ▶ The FGS MoLFR will keep the records of the LWG members and update them when necessary

# Updates of the last meeting

- ▶ FGS-MoLFR convened a LWG meeting on 28<sup>th</sup> Sept 2020;
- ▶ The meeting was attended by representatives of INGOs, LNGOs, Professional associations and UN-Agencies;

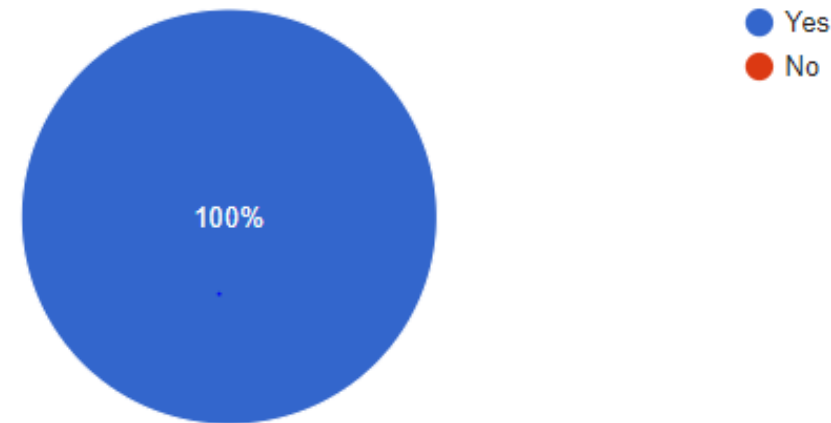

# AGRICULTURE TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP SURVEY RESULTS - 2020



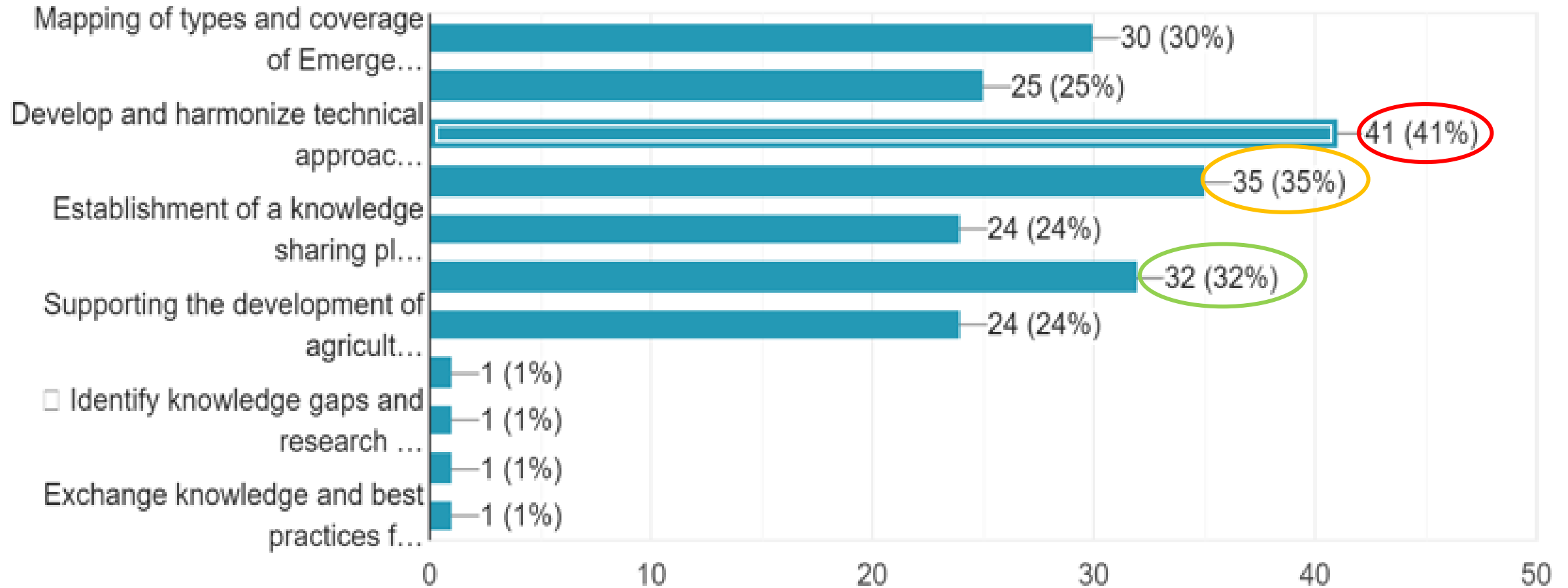
## Need for creation of the Agriculture Technical Working Group?

# AGRICULTURE TECHNICAL WORKING GROUP PRIORITIES



1. Develop and harmonize technical approaches and guidelines for emergency agriculture livelihood support (inputs/ training modules and approaches)
2. Develop Agriculture strategies/ approaches for the capacity building of partners and other stakeholders
3. Strengthen coordination and cooperation between humanitarian partners and the Ministry of Agriculture to implement solutions for issues on emergency agriculture related activities
4. Mapping of types and coverage of Emergency Agriculture Interventions in Somalia (including gaps and needs)
5. Facilitate localized agricultural emergency assessment (impact of drought, flood and major pests etc);
6. Establishment of a knowledge sharing platform to disseminate technical knowledge/ best practices related to emergency agriculture based responses in Somalia
7. Supporting the development of agricultural emergency related policies/ regulations

# ATWG MEETING OUTCOMES: 1<sup>ST</sup> SEATING



## Membership/ Governance:

- ▶ Membership include UN agencies, donors, NGOs (both international & local) etc.
- ▶ The AWG will be led by a Chair- Federal Ministry of Agriculture and Co-Chair FAO Somalia

## Agreed upon action points:

- ▶ Guide formulation of **work plans** with a set of realistic and achievable targets including relevant cross-sectoral priorities and goals linked to agricultural production/productivity.
- ▶ Facilitate discussion and build consensus on **appropriate agriculture emergency interventions** in the wake of many challenges linked to production.
- ▶ Develop **technical approaches and guidelines** for livelihood seasonal inputs
- ▶ Identify issues and **challenges** that contribute to the limited, slow pace of the emergency agriculture-based responses and put in appropriate measures to address them.
- ▶ Develop joint **communication and advocacy messages** to inform key stakeholders on strengths, weaknesses and opportunities of the agriculture based responses.
- ▶ Provide **a platform** that serves as a “help desk” to disseminate technical knowledge/ best practices related to emergency agriculture based response by the actors in Somalia.

# GLOBAL ATWG: INTRODUCTION



This is a **consortium** of agencies/ NGOs with a common interest in improving agriculture production and productivity;

- **Seed Systems** across the world
- Knowledge management and information sharing **platforms**
- **Factors** affecting agriculture productivity
- Adopting **effective practices** to enhance agriculture productivity

# GLOBAL ATWG: 1<sup>st</sup> MEETING OUTCOME



The Global and the Somalia ATWG Team held a meeting and deliberated on a few issues as below:

- ▶ The need to **revive the ATWG** in Somalia for crops, seed and livestock.
- ▶ Explore further the advances made in **supporting local seed markets** through the engagement of local traders and the adoption the e voucher;
- ▶ The objectivity/effectiveness of **Cash +Ag results in comparison with agriculture input support** in relation to agriculture productivity; success stories and lessons learnt.
- ▶ Need for collaborative efforts to create a **central repository** for training and technical materials accessible to all
- ▶ Work of techniques/methods and means of advancing farmer to farmer knowledge sharing or **community extension**

- Development and consolidation of **technical guidelines for agriculture related interventions**
