IASN response



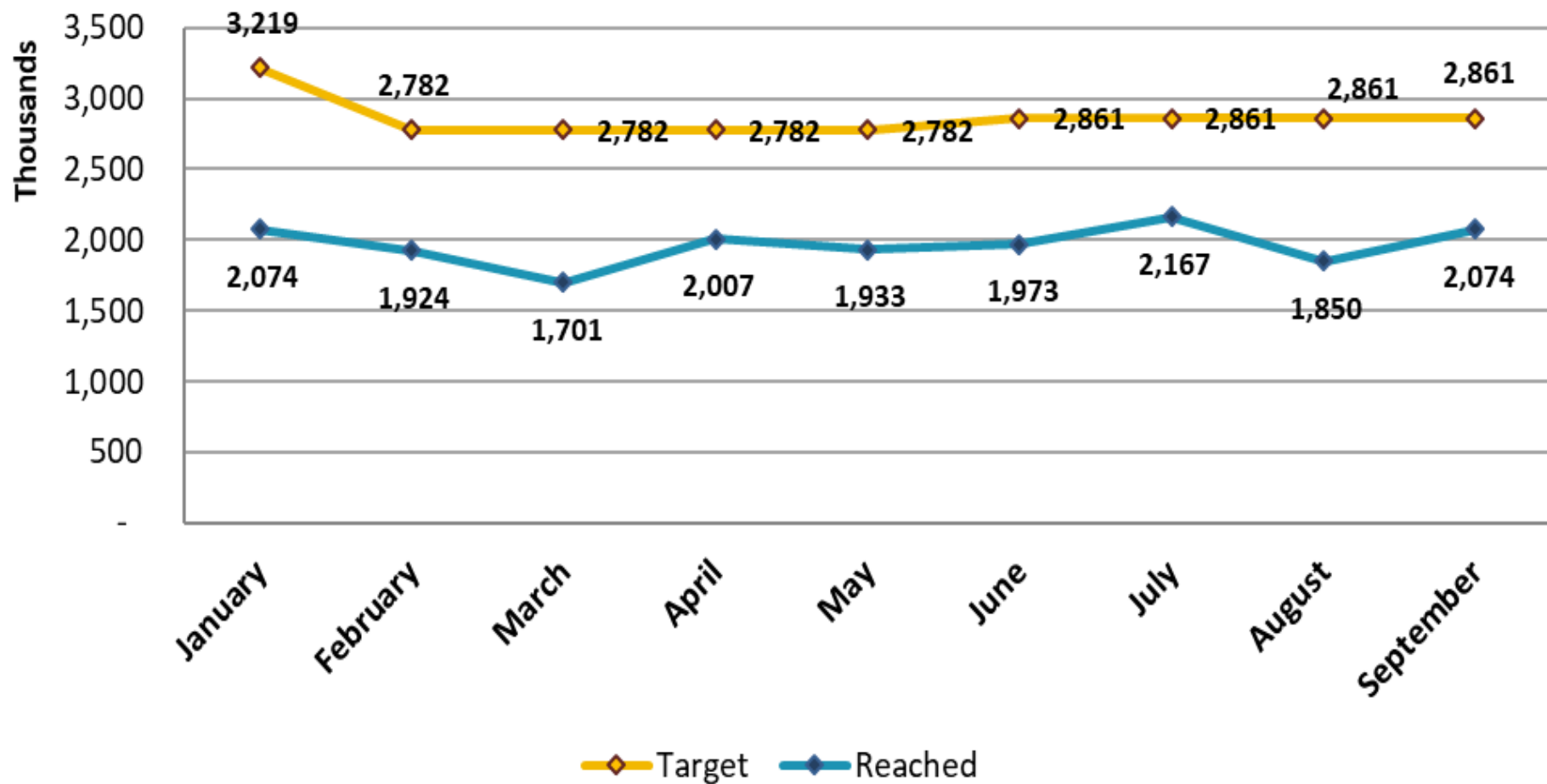
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- Of the total number of beneficiaries reached for this objective, 76% were supported through cash/ voucher transfer while 24% received in-kind support.
- WFP response constitute 60% of the response: with SCI (13%) DRC (6%), FAO (5%) and the combined responses of NRC, ACTED, CWW and Thirteen (13) other partners contributing the remaining 16%.
- Achievement is 8% higher compared to August when 65% of the targeted beneficiaries were reached.
- Notably, less than 25% of the targeted beneficiaries were assisted in Lower Shabelle, Middle Juba and Woqooyi Galbeed; this is related both to insecurity as well as availability of resources.

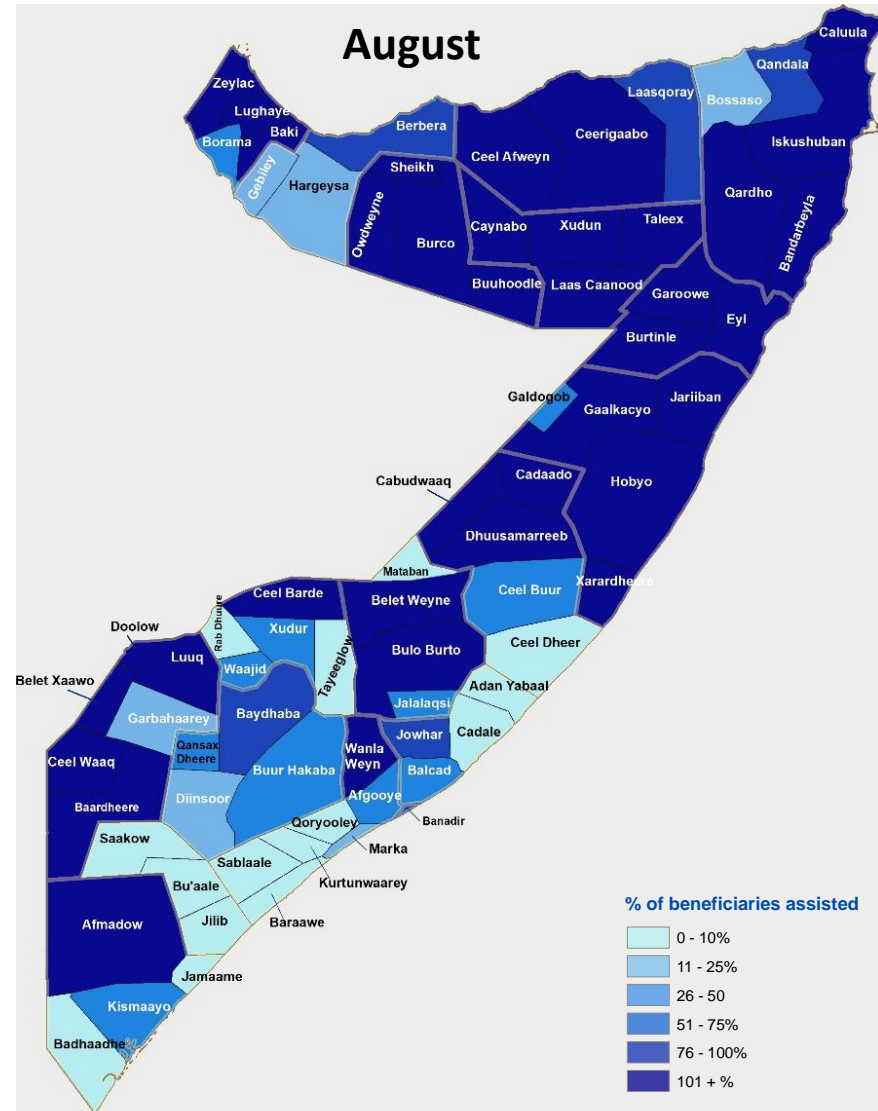

LIIN response



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- ❖ Under Objective 2 (provision of seasonal livelihood inputs), FSC partners assisted 299,598 beneficiaries with seasonal inputs including livestock assets protection related activities.
- ❖ Cumulatively from Aug to September 488,592 beneficiaries (44%) have been reached for the Dyer season compared to a target of 1,111,964.
- ❖ These activities are geared towards supporting production for Dyer season. FAO provided 90% of the responses SCI 7%, CARE 2%, WARDI and NAPAD 1% in September.

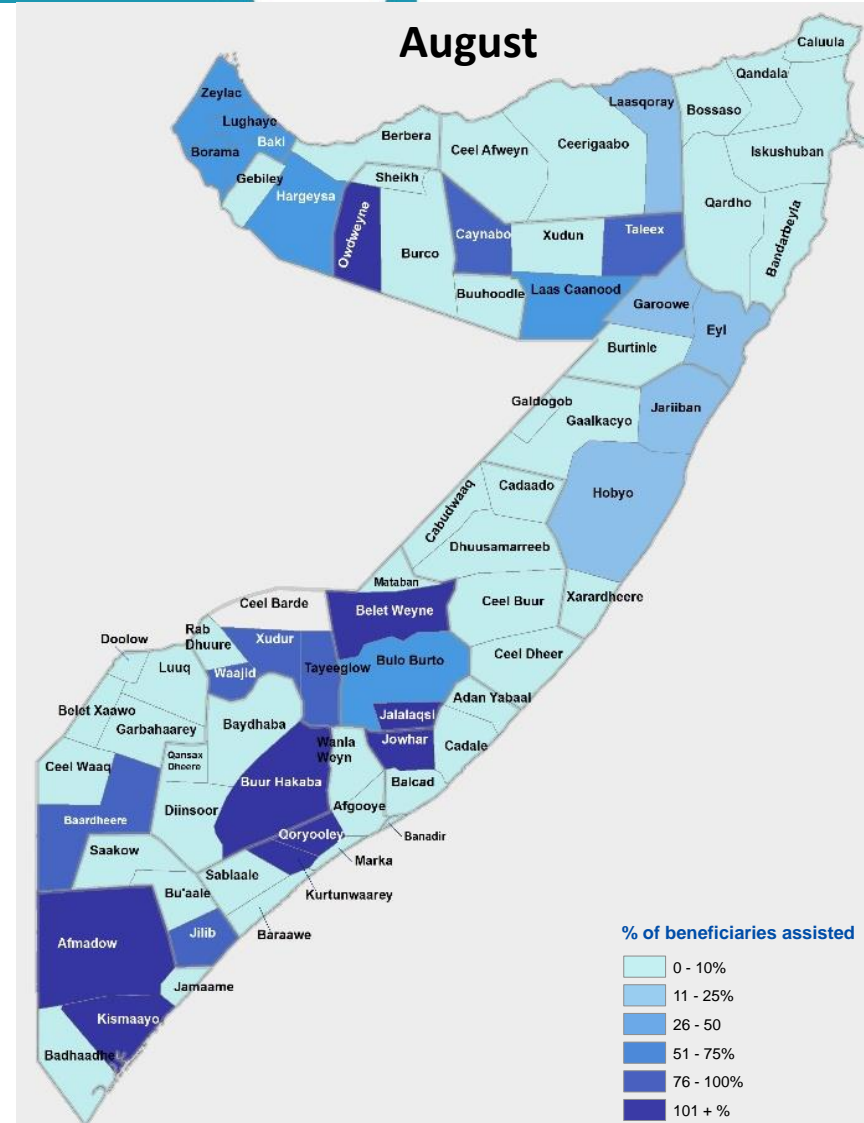

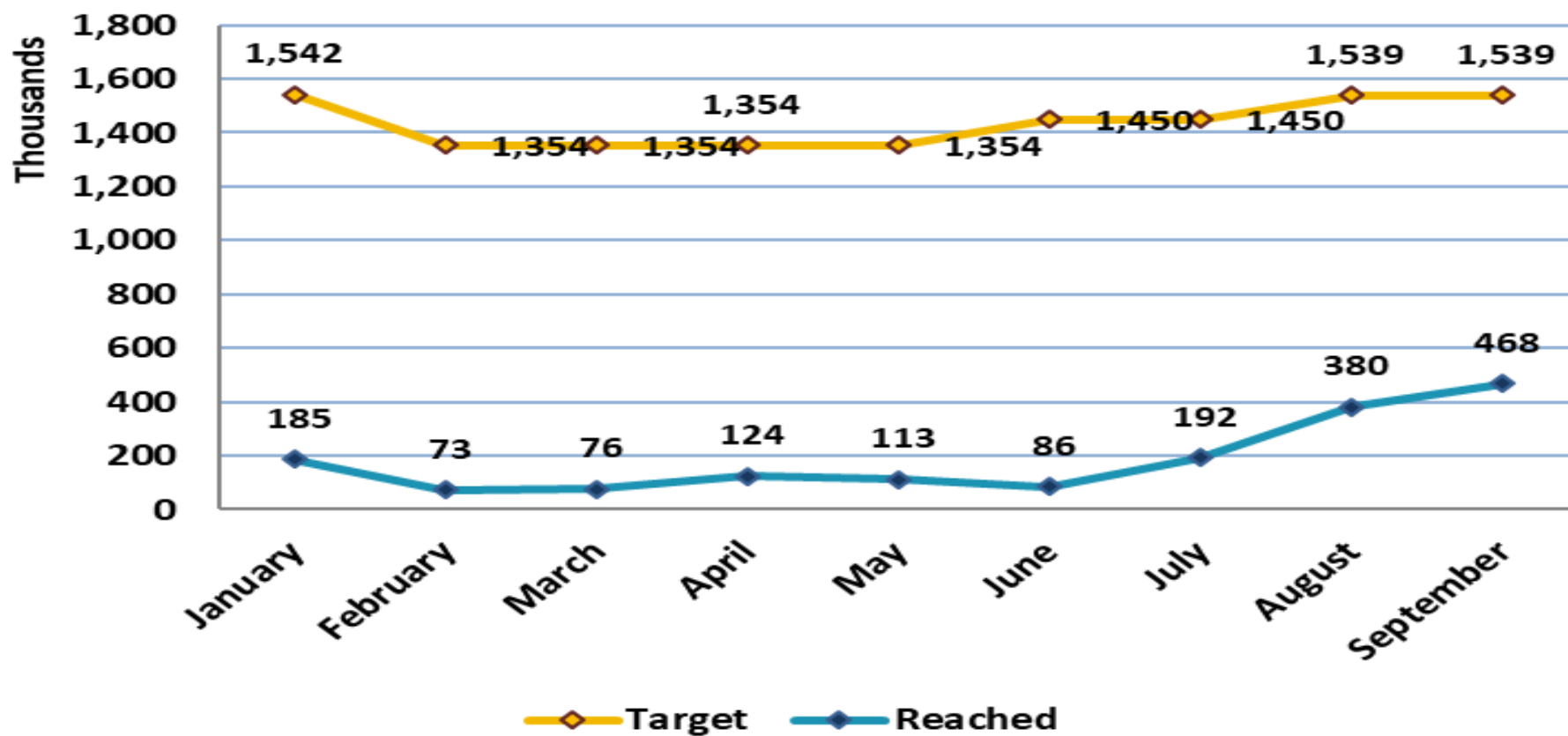
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- ❖ Of the total number of beneficiaries reached for this objective, 84% were supported through cash/voucher transfer while 16% received in-kind support.
- ❖ WFP supported 76%, ACTED 8%, ACF 5% with DRC (2%), SCI, ADESO, CESVI, CARE, HAS, WHH, WARDI, Candlelight, NRC, World Concern, PENHA and OXFAM combined reaching 8%.

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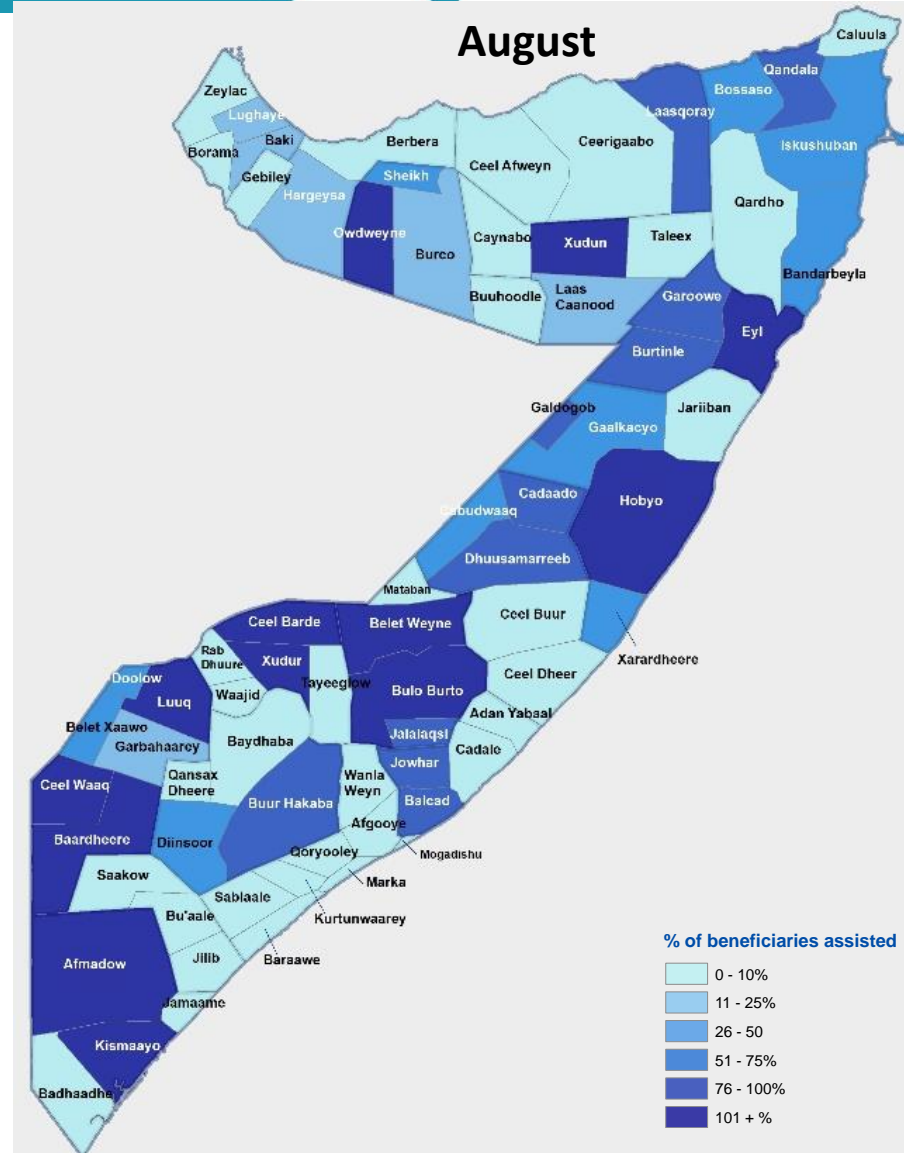

GAPS



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- **The cluster received report of increase in prices of staple food that led the IDPs in Bossaso to lower food access.**
 - The IDPs has limited purchasing power and heavily dependent on the external support.
 - The increasing food prices are also affecting food access poor urban households.
 - Report of reduction in humanitarian assistance which affect food access

- **The FSC has received report about 27,000 head livestock from Bossasso destine for export market to Saudi Arabia has retuned back. The interruption of the export market if it will persist going to affect the price of livestock by reducing the demand for live animals.**
