#### 1. Opening Remarks

- Mr. Abubakar Ahmed Mohamed, the head of the Food Security and Nutrition-IPC (HFSN-IPC) ministry Of Humanitarian Affairs and Disaster Management (MOHADM) officially started the meeting and provided opening remarks
- He thanked and appreciated the FSC partners for their attendance and for undertaking Humanitarian food assistance
- He gave a brief update about the risk of drought and famine the country is undergoing and urge the partners to active participation

## 2. SWALIM Climate updates

- More than 90% of the country is experiencing severe to extreme drought conditions.
- Awdal Region and the southern coastal areas have been receiving light to moderate rains since June. The rains received provide some relief to the communities in terms of surface water recharge and pasture.
- The river level along Shabelle is below average for this period of the year while the current River level along Juba is within average
- Current global climate forecasts point towards poor October to December rainy season in the Horn of Africa region.
- The ICPAC forecast, which gives more focus in this region, will be out by the end of August, after the GHACOF.
- SWALIM and partners are following the developments keenly and will keep you updated

## 3. FSC Update

### 2.1 FSC updated the partners on June responses

- In June 2022, FSC partners assisted 3.3 million people out of the 5.4 million targeted (58% reach against the improved access to food target). 97% of the food assistance was undertaken through cash and vouchers with approximately USD \$43.8 million disbursed to beneficiaries
- Under livelihood support, partners have assisted 330,000 people cumulatively from January to June. This translated to only 30% achievement against the target based on the current needs which are 789,490 individuals 42% of the livelihoods support was undertaken through cash and vouchers with approximately USD \$0.48 million disbursed to beneficiaries
- The FSC cluster acknowledges the good effort of the partners to support people in need and urged the need to reach more people in need as IPC's last update indicates 7.1M people in need.

WARO organization- based in Bardheere district gave a brief update on Humanitarian needs in the rural and urban settings of the district, more than 10,000 HHs need life-saving assistance in the districts and need Humanitarian assistance from all sectors including Food Security and WASH.

FSC partner raised a concern on how to reduce/Prevent displacement and support the community in their area of origin.

## 2.2 5Ws monthly matrix - Enhancing quality reporting

- The cluster slightly updated the 5W matrix for monthly response data collection to improve the quality of reporting and address some of the concerns following the visit of the emergency directors' group to collect key information to better report the reach humanitarian food assistance.
- Location type Should be either URBAN, RURAL, or IDP Site (No mixed value)-
- Updated beneficiaries' type to determine the beneficiaries' type in terms of IDPs, and Non-IDPs (Host/ Local community, Returnees, Refugees only (No mixed value),
- Partners to report each location in 1 row for specific beneficiary type (IDPs or Non-IDPs (Host/ Local community, Returnees, Refugees) for several beneficiaries
- To enter the correct donor's name, for example, Acronym| Full name of the Donor.
- To enter the full details in terms of state, region, district, and specific location (with GPs coordinates) to assist in Mapping the activities to avoid duplication. Use the drop-down list for regions and districts. This is extremely important that Cluster partners are very clear about the project locations and able to tell all the stakeholders.
- Cluster partners to report the new (UNIQUE) beneficiaries for the month of reporting to avoid any duplication and double counting
- Cluster IM team will conduct an orientation session for the partners on the updated template

## 2.2 Response Dashboards - Interactive and Static maps
