1. Opening Remarks

- Mr. Nicolas Joannic, the Food Security cluster coordinator opened the meeting and welcomed the participants
- He thanked the partners for their timely attendance, cooperation, and commitment to assist the people in need in this critical time of the drought.
- He gave a brief update about the agendas of the meeting and welcomed FSNAU to update the partners on the latest Somalia Pos Gu assessment and IPC results

2. Post Gu Assessment and IPC results

- Key Messages:
 - Deteriorating humanitarian situation in most parts of Somalia since the beginning of this year, levels of acute food insecurity, malnutrition and mortality are worsening and approaching the thresholds of famine (IPC Phase 5) in several areas,
 - Humanitarian needs are extremely high due to the impacts of four consecutive season of poor rainfall, an anticipated 5th season of below-average rainfall from October to December.
 - Moreover, the nutrition situation has deteriorated across most parts of the country. Acute malnutrition case admissions among children under age five have continued to raise sharply.

- Amid scale down in funded humanitarian assistance in late 2022, approximately, 6.7 million people (47% of the total population) across Somalia are expected to face crisis (IPC phase 3).
- Furthermore, famine (IPC Phase 5) is projected among agropastoral populations in Baidoa and Burhakaba districts and displaced people in Baidoa town of Bay region in southern Somalia where malnutrition and mortality levels are very high.

3. FSC Update

3.1 FSC updated the partners on August responses

- In August 2022, FSC partners assisted 5.6 million people out of the 6.37 million targeted (87% reach against the improved access to food target). 56% of the food assistance was undertaken through cash and vouchers with approximately USD \$72 million disbursed to beneficiaries.
- Under livelihood support, partners have assisted 412,000 people cumulatively from January to August. This translated to only 49% achievement against the target based on the current needs which are approximately 838,000 individuals. 83% of the livelihoods support was undertaken through in-kind while only 8% of the assistance was delivered through cash and vouchers.
- The cluster appreciates the partners for scaling up interventions in response to the drought and the increasing risk of famine.

3.2 Financial Tracking Tool

- It is important for FSC cluster to track the funding requirements, funding received / committed from different sources and funding gaps for both UN agencies, INGOs, NNGOs, and etc..
- It will provide the FSC cluster with the visibility on who is funding what across the partners operations
- FSC partner will provide us with the funding updates on monthly basis
- A separate orientation session on the financial Tracking Tool is to be conducted by FSC on 26th Sep 2022

3.3 Key issues to note with Partners monthly response data

- Deadline of submitting the partners data is 3rd of each month for partners and 5th for WFP.
- The new template of 5Ws must be used (It will be shared in the reminder email)

- Implementing Partner should be selected from the drop-down list, not entered as we had to clean most of the names or if its new, the format is as follows
Partner Acronym| Full name of partner organization
- Provide the correct type of your organization.
- The start date should not be in September as we report on August, and the end date should not be in July.
- The date format is MM/DD/YYYY
- Regions and Districts should be selected from the dropdown list not entered
- Beneficiary type, we do not have Urban or Rural under this field, please stick to the list we have IDP, Non-IDPs (host / local community), Non-IDPs(returnee)
- Response type must be drought not regular.
- For all drop down columns, please select from the list instead of entering to report quality data.

4. FSC and CWG Revised Transfer Values (Food MEB and MPCA)

- FSC shared the technical release on revised Transfer Values for the various regions of Somalia. The technical guidance has been revised jointly by FSC and the Cash Working Group (CWG). The revision has been done in line with the current increased needs and risk of famine in some parts of the country.
