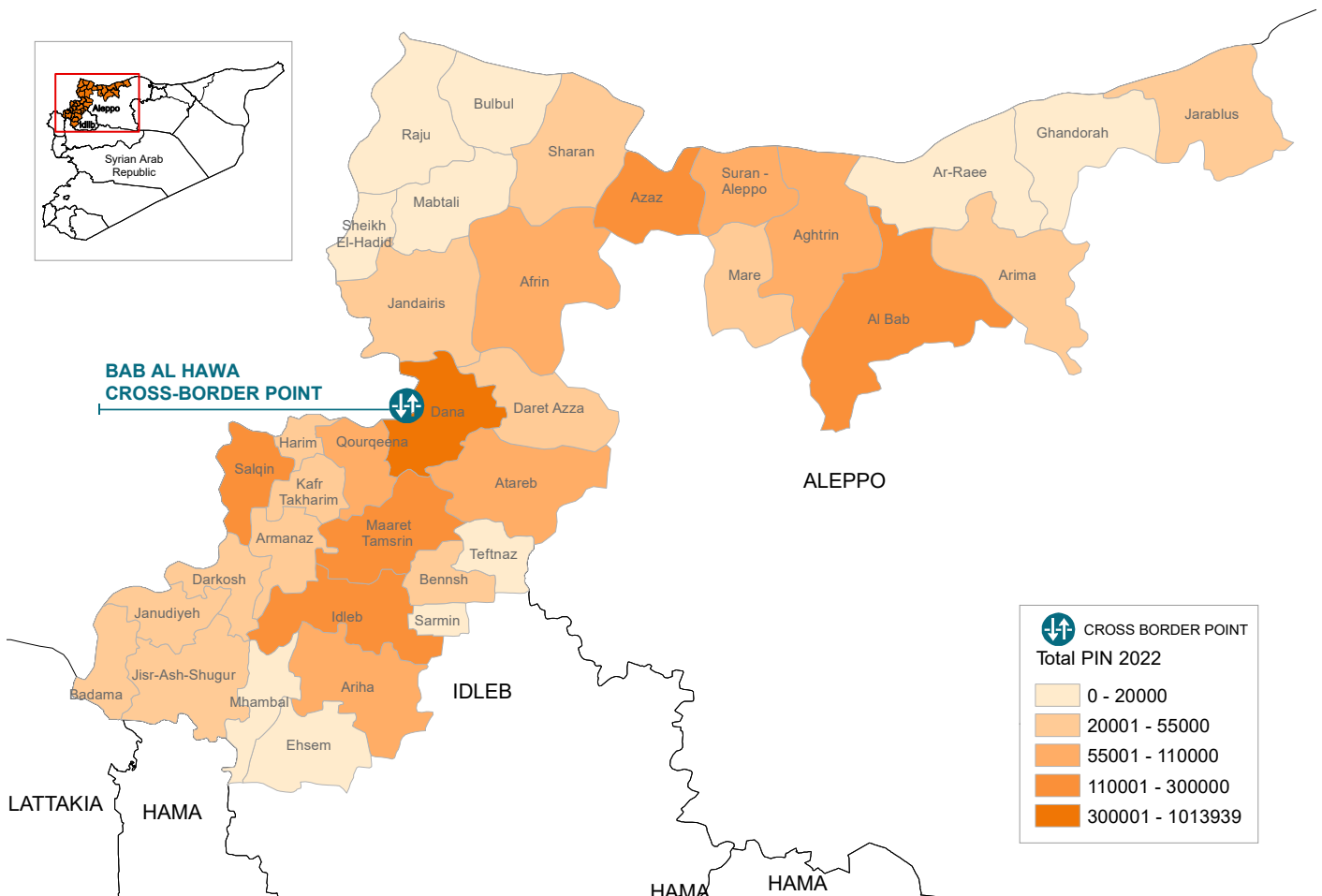

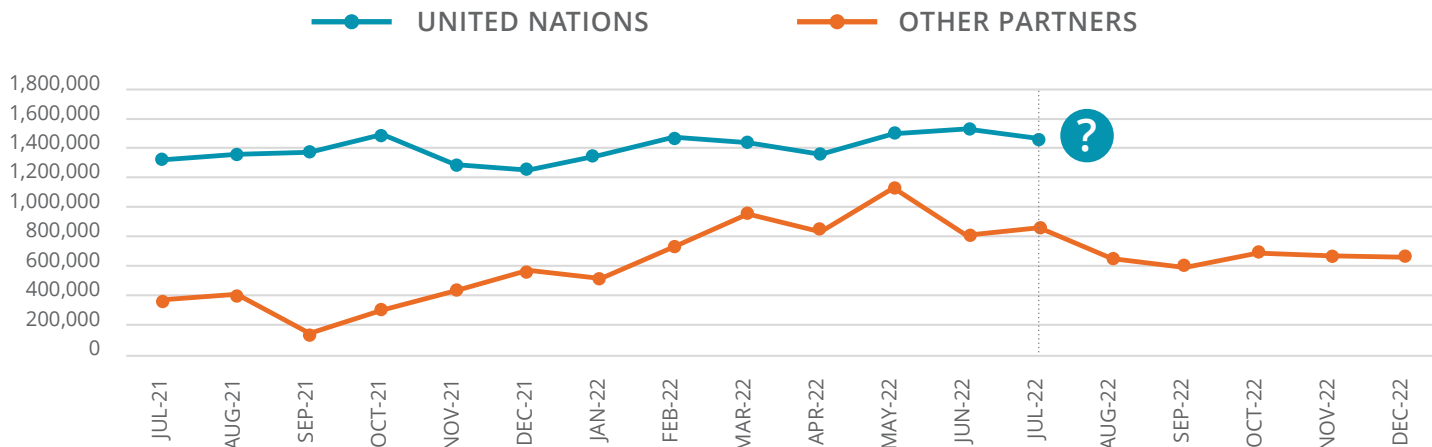

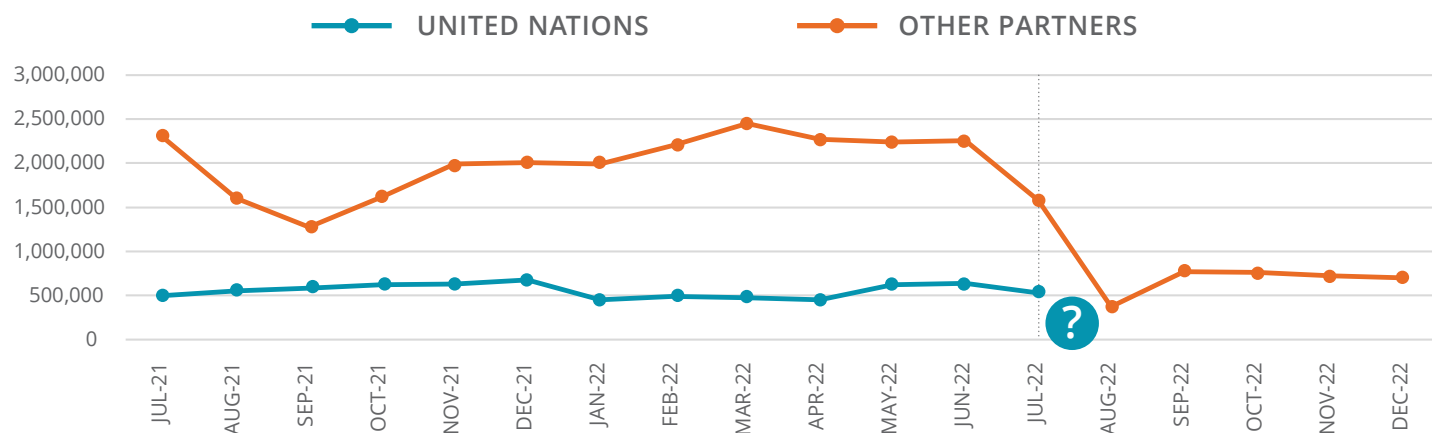

TREND ANALYSIS BY FUNDING SOURCE

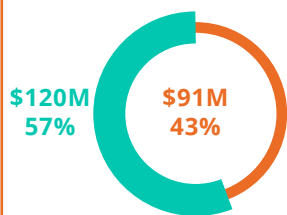


PEOPLE SUPPORTED WITH BREAD AND BAKERIES ASSISTANCE



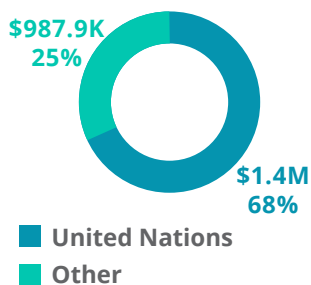
Food Security Funding Gap

Since the UN Security Council Resolution 2585 was renewed in July 2021, Food Security and Livelihoods (FSL) partners delivered food assistance to 2.1M people in need on a monthly average in Northwest Syria.

From January to April 2022, through the cross-border program, FSL partners achieved the following results in Northwest Syria:

- 2.1M people were supported with food assistance (through in-kind, cash, or voucher for food).
- 2.2M people were reached with bread or flour distribution.
- 443K people were provided with ready-to-eat rations, cooked meals, and one-off emergency food baskets.
- 354K people received mixed food items.
