Humanitarian Updates</p>	<p>Meeting was formally started with the welcome note and introduction of participants by FSL Sector coordinator, IMO and FSTS representative.</p> <p><u>Humanitarian Updates</u></p> <p>1. West Darfur - Ag Geneina:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ 149,115 individuals (30,357 households) seeking shelter in Ag Geneina and its surrounding villages, having been displaced from Krinding 1 and 2 IDP camps (37%), Hai Eljabal area (25%), Sultan House area (11%) and other sites nearby (27%). ▪ around 37% increase in displacement due to the most recent clashes, with newly displaced households arriving from Abuzar IDP camp, Althora, Um Dowin, Sultan House and the Hai Eljabal area of Ag Geneina town. ▪ WEST DARFUR OPERATIONAL PLAN; The aim of this operational plan is to outline the ongoing response and identify key gaps in humanitarian support in Ag Geneina, and with two main objectives: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> I. Provision of timely multi-sectoral lifesaving humanitarian assistance to people displaced, with particular attention to women, girls and people with disabilities. II. Provide protection services to vulnerable crisis-affected people, including those with special needs. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ FSL sector keep sharing latest humanitarian updates with partners.

FSL partners operational in Ag Geneina; WFP, FAO, SRCS ADRA, CWW, IAS, IOM, SRCS, TGH, UNDP, VSFG, WCC, WR, GAYAT, UPO, CONCERN. Reaching 100,000 beneficiary from around 188,000 people in need with Food Baskets, Vouchers, Cash and Animal Re-stocking.

2. North Darfur - Sharg Aj Jabal:

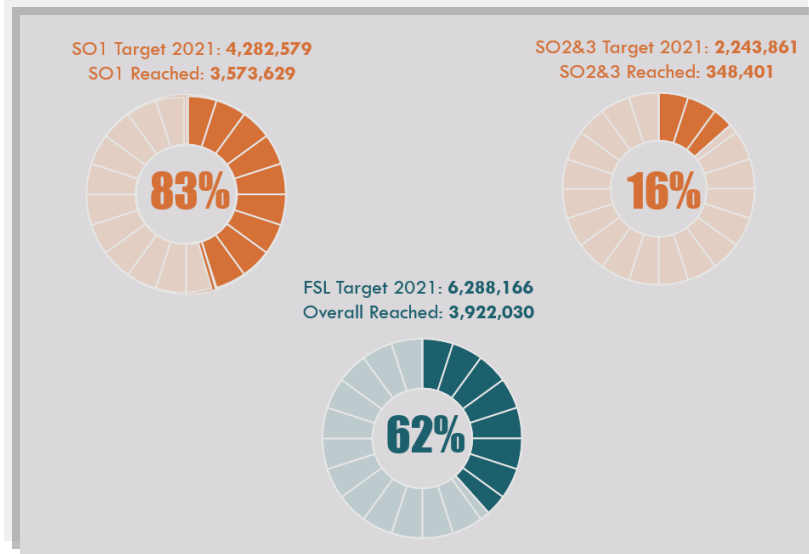
- ongoing conflict between rebel factions of the Sudan Liberation Army – Abdel Wahid (SLA-AW) in Sharg Aj Jabal (East Jabal Marrah)
- 35,242 individuals (7,056 households) seeking shelter, across Keila, Kidingeer, Mershing and Otash.

3. South Darfur – Gereida:

- estimates a total number of 8,215 individuals (1,650 households) displaced across Otash, Tuel, Dereige, Tulus, Dika, Dagama and Gereida town. due to the ongoing impact of the clashes in January.
- At least 523 individuals are reported to have additional vulnerabilities in need of assistance and support. Reports still indicate 71 individuals of the total caseload have been killed and 88 sustained injuries, whilst at least 258 internally displaced persons (IDPs) have lost personal belongings and livestock. Based on a ranking scale, the three main priority needs across the total caseload remain non-food items, food, and emergency shelter.

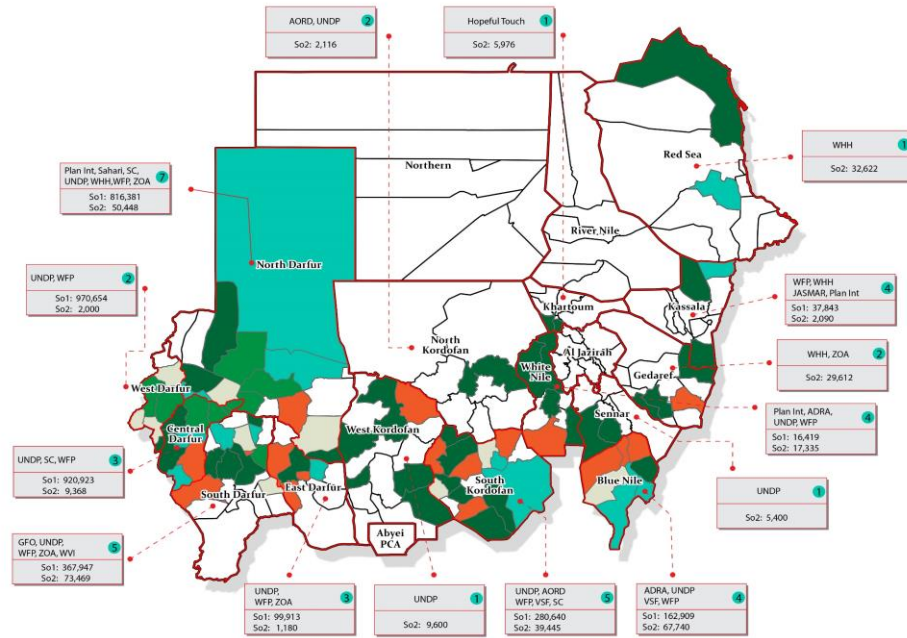
2. FSL Q1-2021 Updates/achievements

With 14 FSL partners reporting in Q1/2021 (2 UN, 8 INGOs, 4 NGOs) reaching 15 states (8 with Food and Livelihood, 7 with Livelihood assistance only) and overall 91 localities.

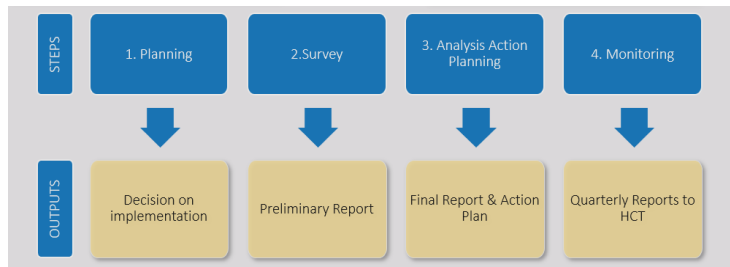


3. FSL CCPM 2020 Findings

- Is a country-led self-assessment exercise where country Clusters/Sectors assess their performance against six (+1) core cluster functions and on accountability to affected populations.
- The CCPM comprises 4 stages (1. Planning, 2. Survey, 3. Analysis and action planning, 4. Monitoring)
