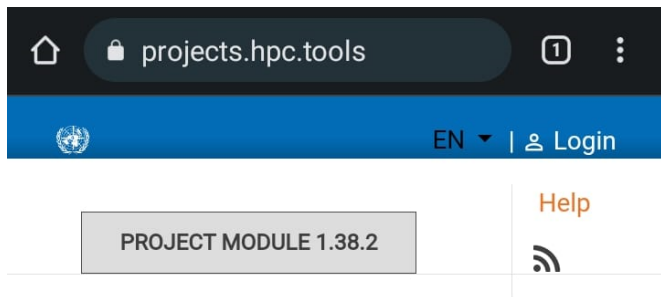

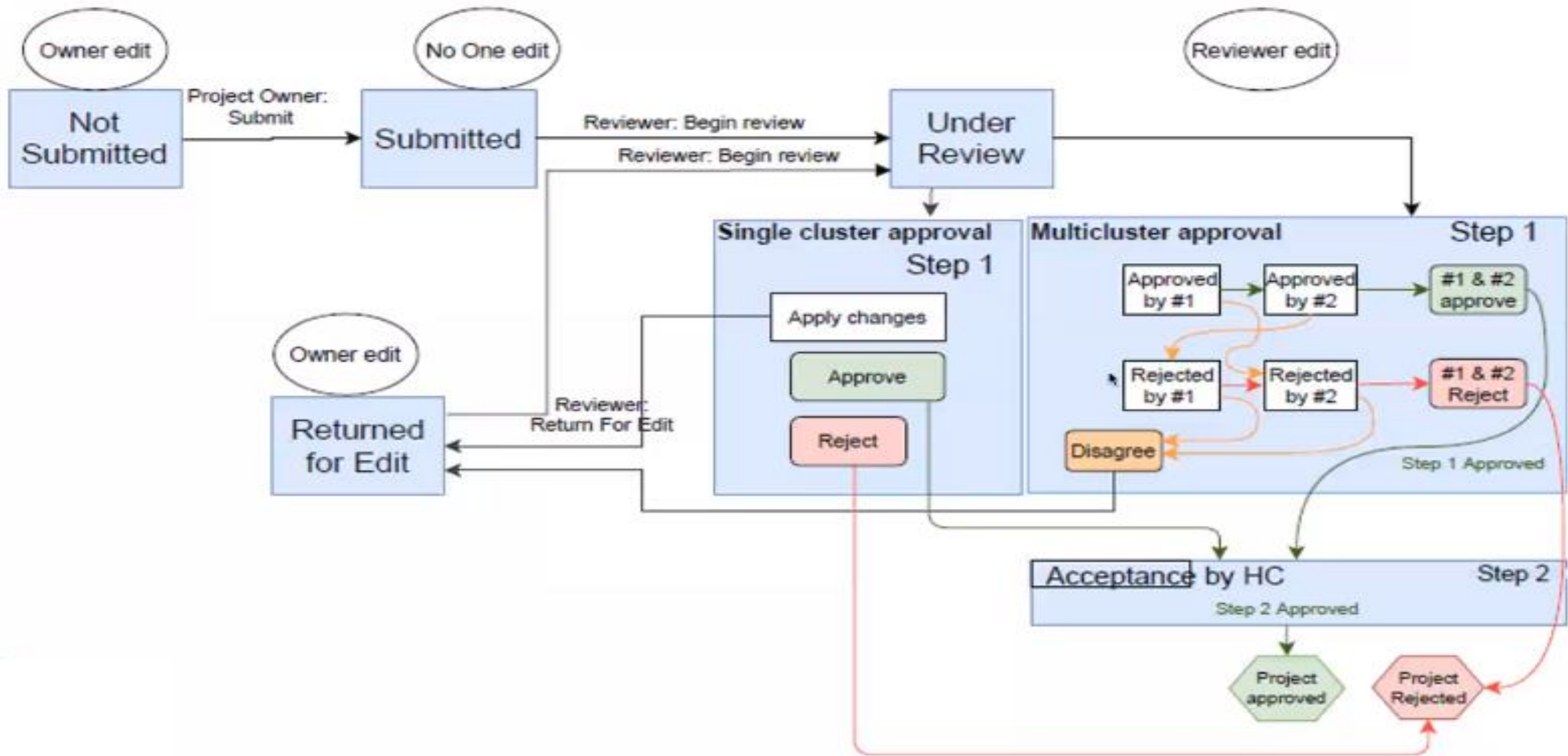

Integrating Protection Dimensions of Food Security in the HNO and HRP process

Guidance to **Food Security (FS) actors involved in the HNO/HRP**: (FSC teams, members & govt. actors working on food security in the development of the HNO/HRP documents

- to improve ***adherence to protection and gender good practices and policies in the HNO/HRP development process, with particular reference to;***
 - **Integrating Protection Dimensions of Food Security in the HNO and HRP process**
 - IASC policy on gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls (GEEWG),
 - IASC Protection policy and IASC Guidelines on Inclusion of Persons with Disabilities in Humanitarian Action

The Aim:

- Designing and carrying out coordinated food security activities that contribute to the ***safety, dignity, and integrity of at-risk individuals/ groups*** and do not increase the protection risks faced by the crisis-affected populations.
- 1. Analysis, Design and Implementation:** Collect SADD data, ensure risks & protection analysis, engage with & include organizations focusing on specific target groups, include protection, accountability & inclusion questions, projects to include protection risks assessment, mitigation plans and community engagement strategy.
 - 2. Document Development:** In the HNO/HRP narrative, present disaggregated data, a gender analysis in the HNO FS section (how men, women, boys and girls face risks of food insecurity and coping capacities), SADD, prevent, mitigate and respond to GBV, PSEA and AAP, Ensure consultation with communities and at-risk groups in the HNO/HRP.
 - 3. HNO/HRP Process Management:** Participation & leadership (include, ensure meaningful participation of local/national NGOs), Human resources (engage, collaborate expert/WG/ Focal point to improve mainstreaming), Projects review (score projects on criteria of protection mainstreaming), Coordination (engage with protection cluster, PSEA/PWD/AAP groups

Crosscutting Theme:

Guidance on Strengthening Disability Inclusion in HRPs

Aim: To make humanitarian programming more *responsive to the needs of people with disabilities* affected by crisis.

Rationale: Reaching the people who are most *in need of assistance is central to the humanitarian mandate* and is reflected in the humanitarian principles of humanity and impartiality.

- Inclusion of persons with disabilities in humanitarian action is also *central to meeting broader commitments, such as AAP*
- *Humanitarian actors need to have sufficient information* about the number of persons with disabilities in a given context or crisis, their situation, needs and the barriers and risks they face, as well as their capacities, views and priorities.

Concept of Disability: Disability is the result of an *interaction between a person with an impairment and barriers in their environment* that hinder his or her full and effective inclusion and participation in society.

Protection Mainstreaming: Meaningful access, safety and dignity in humanitarian action will not be achieved *without considering risks and barriers to access faced by persons with disabilities.*

- The HNO Process:**
- **STEP 1:** Agree on the scope and focus of the analysis
 - **STEP 2:** Review and analyse data and information and identify gaps
 - **STEP 3:** Review and obtain approval of analysis results and monitoring information

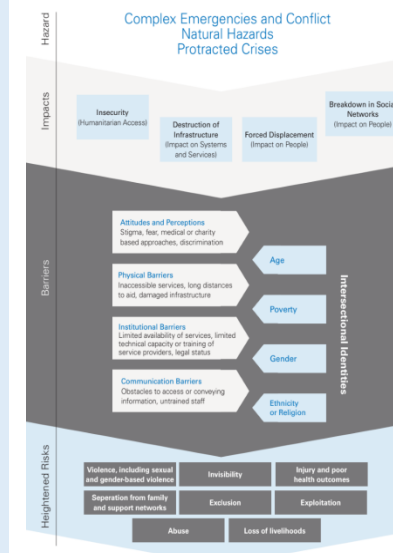
Disability Inclusion in the Humanitarian Needs Overview - an overview

Part I: Impact of the crisis: Context of the crisis, Humanitarian consequences and causal factors associated with needs, Severity of humanitarian needs, Number of persons in need. **Part II: Risk Analysis:** Describe the broad risk context that persons with disabilities face. **Part III: Monitoring of Situation and Needs:** Identify how humanitarian consequences and needs may evolve for persons with disabilities. **Part IV: Sectoral Analyses:** Describe how the crisis impacts differently on persons with disabilities and factors contributing to heightened risk, with regard to each sector.

- Designing Response:**
- **STEP 4:** Select priority humanitarian outcomes to address
 - **STEP 5:** Analyze response options and formulate strategic objectives
 - **STEP 6:** Review and approve the strategic objectives and monitoring requirements
 - **STEP 7:** Formulate the activities and estimate the cost of the response plan

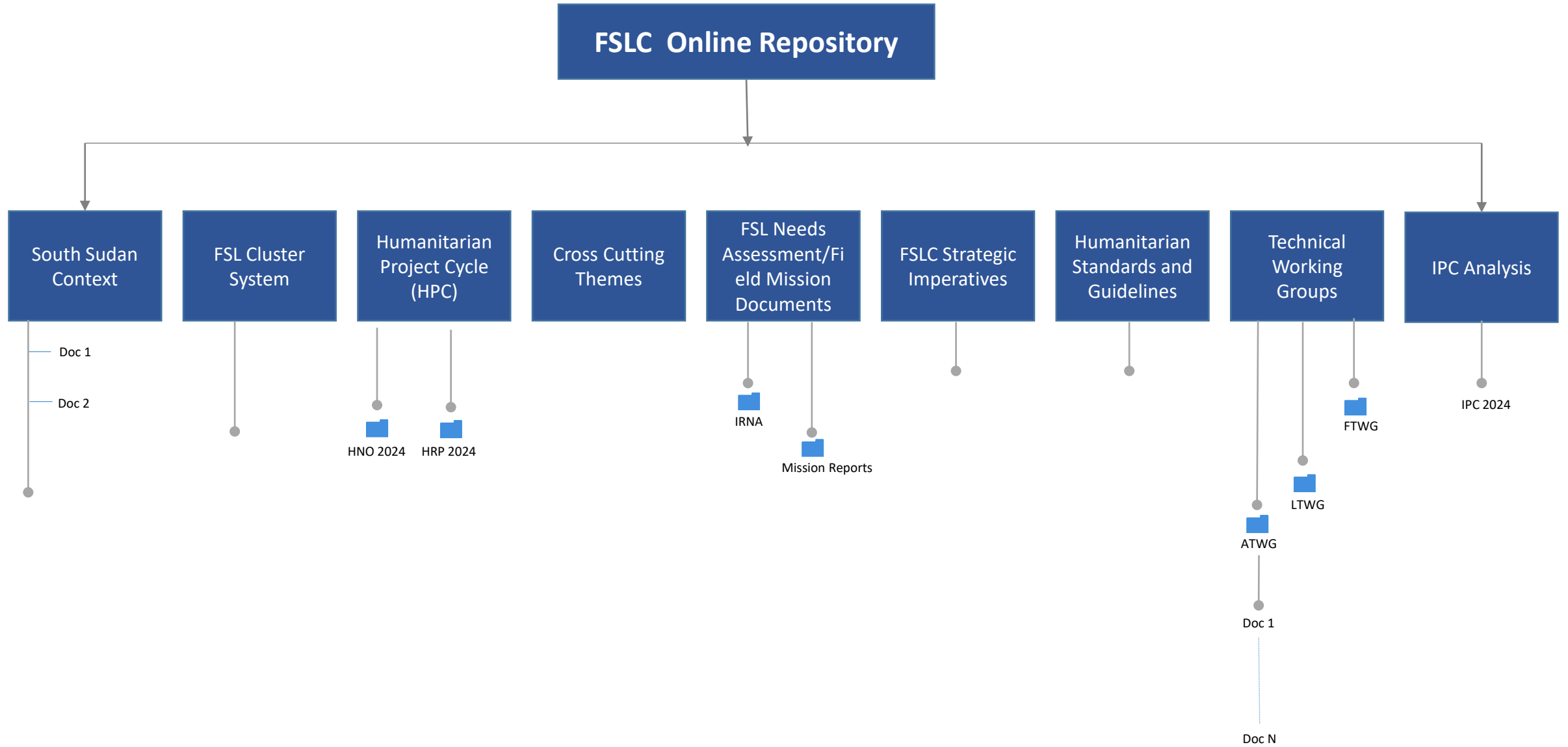
