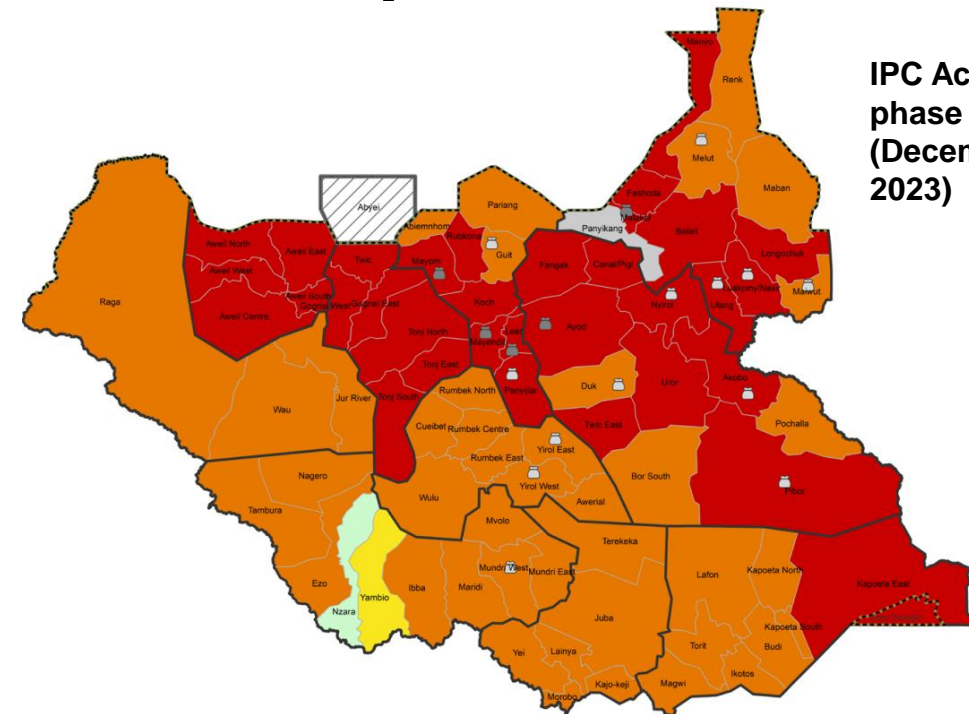

Background

- IPC P4 December – March 75% PiN
- Worst nutritional data in the country (GAM 24.7%)
- Nyal Multi-Sectoral Survival Minimum Expenditure Basket (MSSMEB) 127,000 SSP – up 61% since December 2021
- Continued flooding

Recent updates

- Anecdotal reports of hunger related deaths from authorities
- Limited assessments conducted in Panyijiar
- 9747 individuals were displaced from Panyijiar to Lakes State (IRNA)
- WFP airdropped food and nutrition supplies to Nyal in Panyijiar County on 13 and 14 January.
- On 17 January, registration and verification started in Nyal for over 31,000 people for GFD and 2,500 children for the blanket supplementary feeding programme

GPAA/Greater Akobo



GPAA context

- High underlying vulnerability (2021 to current)
- IPC P4 December – March 75% PiN (5% IPC Phase 5, down from 10% in Oct-Nov)
- Estimated cereal gap 2022 (Tonnes) 20,763
- Pibor GAM 10.6%

Greater Akobo recent updates

- Increase of clashes in Greater Akobo in recent weeks
- Intersection of Akobo, Nyirol, and Uror counties most affected, small clashes in Duk
- Unverified reports of 37,000 IPDs in Akobo West
- Populations of IDPs in Waat, and larger towns in Uror

GPAA recent updates

- Clashes in GPAA have reduced
- Large-scale displacement (figures remain unclear, as do current movement trends, including returns)
- Destruction of humanitarian assets/facilities
- About to enter into the lean season (March-August)
- Continued access barriers to humanitarians

- Food response for 17,000 people from Gumuruk and Lekongole.
- WASH NFIs were distributed to 17,004 people.
- Emergency shelter and NFIs were distributed to 18,000 people.

Twic/Abyei



Background

- GAM Twic 17.4% (Phase 4), Abyei 18.4% (Phase 4)
- IPC P4 December – March 65% PiN, Abyei not classified in South Sudan IPC
- Estimated cereal gap 2022 (Tonnes); - 20,000

Recent updates

- Resumption of clashes after relative calm between October and December 2022
- Increase in clashes inside Twic County
- Dry season cattle migrations likely to cause tensions over limited access to grazing/pasture
- Continued tensions with Sudanese Misseriya

 - discuss & agree on CONOPS for GPAA/Jonglei response strategy and
 - promote and experience sharing for effective implementation in 2023.

 - Impact of ongoing violence
 - Impact on WFP's approach of "interventions only in locations of acceptable risks"
 - Alternative approach / recommendations – from FSL Partners' Perspectives.
