<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - County level food security needs severity hot spots - Kapoeta East, Ulang, Baliyet, White Nile, Kajo-Keji, and Pibor where clashes, conflict and large displacements occurred. - Findings and recommendations from the Akobo West / Waat RNA – Multi sectoral assessment conducted with displaced people and host communities. - Outcomes from the I/NGOs consultations on FSLC Priorities 2023 – partners priorities incorporated in FSL operational strategy 2023. - Guidelines for the Rapid Response Fund – RRF IOM – focus on acute emergencies, FSLC to advocate for locations with acute needs and refer partners to RRF for funding on case by case. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Partners requested to share any assessment reports, analysis to the cluster and even can suggest counties to be discussed. - REACH Assessment report be shared soon. - FSLC to share strategy after the FSL SAG meeting planned on Friday, 10/03/2023.
2. Country level food security needs severity hot spots	
<p>Tonj East and Rumbek North</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Context: clashes between 23-24 February between communities’ from Rumbek North and Tonj East (Warrap) resulted in the killing of 168 people. The incident took place in Mangar, Panyang and Payak cattle camps when youth from Rumbek North attempted to raid cattle. 	<p>Next Steps</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - FSLC will continue to follow up on the situation in Tonj East, Rumbek North, Kajo-Keji, GPAA

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - FSL response: Assistance began in February, reaching 30,200 people, only 55% of the P4+ population. <p>Kajo-Keji County, CES</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Context: IPC P3, 0% P4 (December-March), large numbers of herders from Bor began to arrive in Kajo-Keji in early January, triggering a cycle of violent clashes since January 15th - FSL response: SCOPE registration ongoing in Kajo Keji, and the WFP distribution also ongoing for 12,501 people, 15 days food ration given. NRC is doing MPC for the same IDPs as well. <p>Pibor County, GPAA</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Context: IPC P4 with 5% P5, (December-March), large-scale attacks in Gumuruk and Lekongole payams, resulting in 30,000+ people displacing to Pibor Town, raiding of cattle and destruction of humanitarian and civilian assets. - FSL response: Lokomatch and Verteth are not accessible by road and preparation is ongoing for air drop - On 20 February, WFP contracted truck was looted of 40 MT of food supplies at Anyidit Payam and another 40MT looted in Manyabol on 24 February. <p>Greater Akobo, Jonglei State</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Context: an increase in retaliatory attacks since mid-January, has driven widespread population movement in Uror, Nyriol and Akobo counties. - FSL response: In Uror, distributions ongoing in 2 locations, work ongoing on Pathai bridge, causing delays. - Akobo distributions are completed in Walgak and Wechjal and Buong and ongoing in Kaikuny. - In Nyriol, three locations are receiving air drops, 2 locations pending. 	<p>and Greater Akobo and will monitor any evolving developments across the country</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Partners are suggested to share any reports and updates on these hotspot locations and can also be discussed in the next FSLC meeting. - Partners can also suggest counties to be discussed in the FSLC meeting.
<p>3. AVSI's Multi-Sector HH survey in Juba County, 2022</p>	<p>Next Steps</p>
<p>AVSI presented the key recommendations and finding of the Multi-Sector HH survey they conducted towards the end of last year with 180 HHs in three payams (Rajaf, Mangala, Luri) of Juba County.
