The aim was to gain a holistic, multi-sectoral understanding of the communities in the areas of human development, economy and peace and governance. 2. HRP 2024 Update-FSLC		Next Steps / Action Points




- ICCG HRP PiN and target joint analysis that was conducted between 16-17 October have deliberated on the final HRP PiN and Target and financial requirement for 2024 and the intersectoral severity mapping and prioritization based on need and severity on geographical and thematic.
- The expected funding cut toDonors have expressed concerns about funding cuts of upto 50% for 2024. This is the major concern that we need to put into consideration to align the 2024 HRP response to it, our. The FSLC PiN and Target will have to be reduced significantly as opposed to the current year to accommodate the changing situation of donors shifting the humanitarian Funding to the development side and others countries soon as a new crisis are unfolding around the world. Donors are not shifting the humanitarian funding to the development funding; new strategies must be adopted to try complement the two funding streams.

Key consideration for 2024:

- ✓ Funding cut to 50% in 2024 for some donors.
- ✓ Flooding and dry Spells
- ✓ Inter and Intra communal violence
- ✓ Cattle raiding
- ✓ Access to humanitrain
