

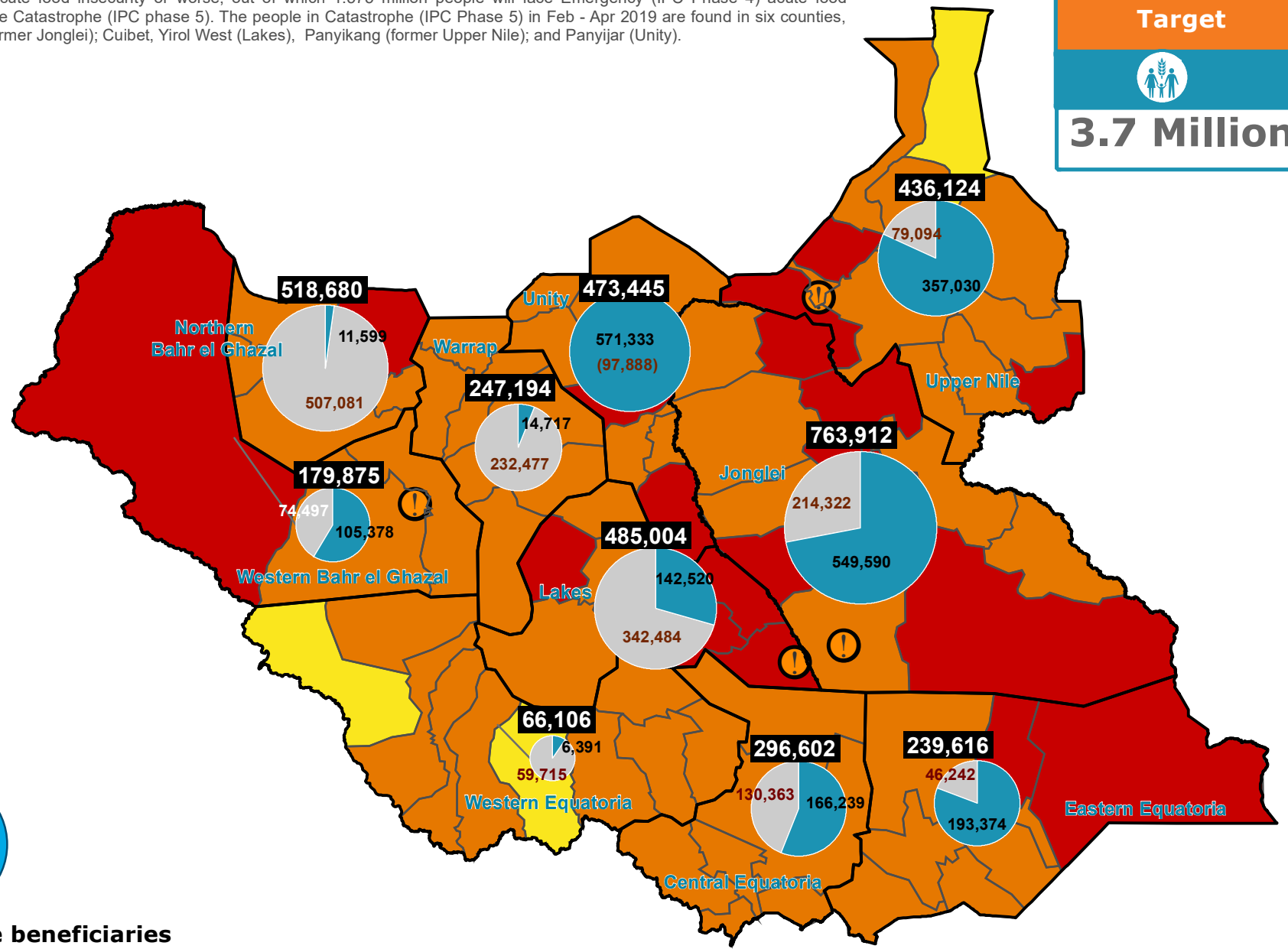
IPC Situational Overview : In the January 2019 IPC analysis based on Porjection 1: 6.45 million people (57% of the population) are estimated to face Crisis (IPC Phase 3) acute food insecurity or worse, out of which 1.575 million people will face Emergency (IPC Phase 4) acute food insecurity and 45,000 will face Catastrophe (IPC phase 5). The people in Catastrophe (IPC Phase 5) in Feb - Apr 2019 are found in six counties, namely: Canal/Pigi, Pibor (former Jonglei); Cuiwet, Yirol West (Lakes), Panyikang (former Upper Nile); and Panyijar (Unity).

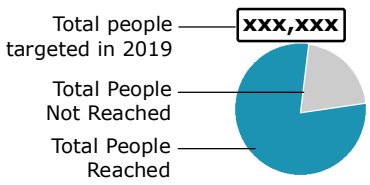
