






Percent of people reached with Food Assistance by modality



# 2 Global initiatives



#### Joint Intersectoral Analysis Framework (JIAF)

- Launch and roll out of JIAF 2.0
- **Prior to launch:** extensive ToT training
- Over 800 field staff trained in 22 countries
- Inter-Agency training complemented by global clusters' internal trainings
- JIAF 2.0 implementation in **25 countries** of 26
- Quality assurance: OCHA and cluster focal point support line


