Agriculture WG Main Focus

The main purpose of the global Food Security Cluster (gFSC) Agriculture WG (AWG) is to:

- promote knowledge sharing, and ensure a platform for members to discuss about agriculture response in humanitarian crisis
- advocate for agriculture needs in major crisis
- share global policies, technical standards guidelines, technical guidance relating the various aspects of the project cycle
- produce ad hoc documents, easy-to-use tools (e.g. catalogue) that might be required from the Food Security Clusters (coordinators and members) and their technical WGs at field level.

Core objectives of the Agriculture WG



Undertake knowledge management, dissemination and advocacy activities and promote best practice, learning and innovation in agricultural responses



Provide agricultural technical support to FSC members and Coordinators in the field and to all Food Security cluster stakeholders for the enhancement of their in-country core coordination functions


Why AWG has not been activated

In 19 operations the AWG is not activated




Localization




Support required: what areas

Other support, challenges, advantages

What other type of support would be needed?

- Technical guidance
- Establish a dedicated regular 5W dashboard, data collection and reporting
- Translation of documents to a local language, localization
- Sharing experience
- Promote awareness of the need to support livelihoods in emergencies, HDPN
- Capacity building, trainings of trainers

What is the main challenge for AWG?

- Resource / Staffing / Funding
- Commitment from partners, donors, CLAs, academia
- Prioritize agriculture in emergencies in the humanitarian response agenda
- Adapting global standards to local context
- Harmonization of response
- Lack of training and technical capacity
- Coordination, data collection

What is the main advantage of having an AWG for Cluster/Sector?

- Coordination, information management, complementarity among actors
- Harmonization of packages
- Advocacy for additional funding for agriculture in emergencies
- Development of technical guidelines and common standards
- Sharing best practices
