1	<b>Introduction.</b> The meeting was organized by Usman Buhari, Hirshabelle FSC Coordinator, and Co-chaired by Mr. Abdikadar Abdulle (SCI), Hiran FSC. The meeting started at 2:00 p.m. at SCI's office. The meeting agenda was presented and endorsed. Participants were requested to actively participate in this forum to ensure better coordination. Followed by a quick introduction of the partners.

<p>3.</p>	<p><b>Food Security Activities in Hiran Region – DAN NGO</b></p> <p>To improve cross-learning and experience sharing among partners and enable them to replicate successful practices in future programming, the FSC Coordinator assigned one partner to present on its project at each meeting. This approach also fosters a sense of ownership and accountability among partners, as they are responsible for showcasing their progress and lessons learned to the rest of the group. Additionally, it encourages active participation and engagement from all partners, creating a collaborative and dynamic learning environment. During the meeting, DAN, in partnership with WFP, presented their projects in the Hiran region, which consisted of the Regular Relief Program funded by WFP and DERF funded by DERF through us for flood response in Beleweyne district. The presentation highlighted the successful implementation of the Regular Relief Program, which provided essential food assistance to vulnerable communities affected by the floods. The partners emphasized the importance of coordination and collaboration in ensuring efficient and effective response efforts in the region.</p> <p><b>The following are the achievements presented by DAN during the meeting in the Hiran region:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ For relief Project, CBT top-up of July cycle for 900 HHs rate (70\$) successfully accomplished in Buloburte and Mahas Districts</li> <li>❖ For DERF, UCT for 100HH (70\$) for the Monthly of July 2023 Undertaken in Beledweyne District.</li> <li>❖ MMT 1021 HHs received their mobile transfers of 70\$</li> </ul> <p>The whole meeting presentation including from DAN NGO can be found on the <a href="#">FSC Website</a>.</p>	<p>Ibrahim from WFP to follow up on the matter of scope card issues, understanding the urgency for beneficiaries to receive their entitlements in July. <p>4</p>	<p><b>Partner updates (Flood response, challenges, and gaps)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ <b>Islamic Relief Somalia:</b> Released the first transfer to 1340 for flood effected communities from five locations in Beletweyne District (Bacad, Biyo Qurun, Lebow, lafoole and shinile) the Households received 70 USD per each in July2023.The project is funded SIDA.</li> <li>❖ <b>Save the Children international:</b> The second multipurpose cash transfer was released to 600 households in flood-affected communities targeted in six locations under Beletweyne district, which are Ilkacade, Xeyndabka, Dongaduud, Wadjir, Dabeyl, and Bacadbuke. The beneficiaries received 100 USD per household in July 2023, project funded by SIDA.</li> <li>❖ <b>Save the Children international:</b> Plaining conditional cash transfer project aims to address water catchment rehabilitation in the Beletweyne district. By implementing a cash-for-work program, 256 beneficiaries will be engaged in activities that contribute to the improvement of water resources. In August, each beneficiary is expected to receive a payment of 84 dollars for their participation.</li> <li>❖ <b>Save the Children international:</b> Plaining to conduct good agriculture practice training to 990 household in Ilkacado , Elgal and Jawil under Beledweyen district the training will last for three days in each village under SCRCP project.</li> <li>❖ <b>Save the Children international:</b> The Third transfer was released to 2200 Households (Beledweyne 900, Mataban 700, and Mahas 600) under the BHA project funded by USAID, whereby each of the benefactors received 70 USD in July 2023, and the fourth</li> </ul>	<p>Partners to coordinate with the FCS before they start implementation to overcome resource overlap/duplication</p>

	<p>transfer was processed in August 2023.the Project duration is six months from May-October2023.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ <b>Save the Children international:</b> The Third transfer was released to 520 Households (Bulo Burte 150, Jowhar 200, and Mahas 170), bringing the total number of households to 520. whereby each beneficiary received 100 USD in the months of July 2023. where each beneficiary will receive 100 USD. The project name is HARBS, funded by USAID, and it aims to provide financial assistance to households in need. this was the last transfer as the beneficiaries were receiving the transfer from May up to now.</li> <li>❖ <b>Islamic Relief Somalia:</b> Registered 300 Households from four villages in Beletweyne Town which is (Hawotako, Howlwadag, Koshin and Bundowwyn) who will receive three months from August-October 2023.</li> <li>❖ <b>SYPD</b> Planning to Rehabilitate canals through CFW for the riverine communities of Macruuf and Dolo Madow, which are in the Beledweyne district. <b>SYPD</b> also plans to distribute seeds to these communities.</li> </ul> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Challenges, and gaps</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>❖ DAN presented that they have met challenge about 10 beneficiaries on the July voucher payment list who do not have Scope cards These beneficiaries were unable to receive their payments due to the lack of Scope cards. DAN is currently working on finding a solution to ensure that these individuals can access their funds in a timely manner as they already communicated information of those beneficiaries with WFP so that they can have their Scope cards before the next cycle Payment.</li> <li>❖ COOPI NGO, which is implementing WFP-funded relief projects, stated that there are beneficiaries who were registered in June 2023 and were supposed to receive their entitlement in July, but they are on the approved list shared by WFP, and their voucher cards read no voucher card, as the communicated with WFP.</li> </ul>
